The Food Pantry continues to provide grocery items for individuals and families. The distribution in June served 35 families, which equates to approximately 80 individuals who will have supplemental food items for them and their families. The pantry recently received a \$1,000 grant from the Garver Fund via the Bellefonte Elks Club. These funds along with your donations of food or funds keep the food flowing. Firewood for Good (F4G) Outreach Mission

Just like the successful GBRVUMC food pantry, F4G provides a vital resource for our community at no cost to people in need. The program obtains, cuts, splits, seasons (dries) and offers pickup and delivery of firewood for use in woodstoves, wood boilers and fireplaces for heating, cooking, and hot water. This provides comfort, safety, and financial support (lower fuel costs) to recipients. The primary service period is late October through March. Gathering, preparing, and delivering firewood occurs year-round. Central Pennsylvania has cold winters, and we want to help our neighbors!

F4G began in the late summer of 2024 with a group of hearty volunteers. GBRVUMC sent the word out about F4G to local public information sources like the Centre County Gazette. Local news soon picked up the story.

By November F4G had built racks, won two grants for equipment, and found and began processing quality firewood. By March of 2025, in 4 short months with little fanfare, F4G provided 30 loads of firewood to our neighbors.

F4G hopes to expand its support for the community in 2025-2026 by increasing awareness and communication to those in need. *To be ready, F4G is in search of firewood donations, one-time and ongoing.* Here are some details:

- We have a safe area for drop-off at the church to a designated "log yard" area. Delivery can be dumped or dropped.
- We can also arrange pickup, depending on the distance and quality and quantity of wood. Photos

- are helpful, and we may come review it before arranging pickup.
- Length of donations from 12" minimum lengths, preferably approximately 16" (or 32" or 48") up to full trees of any length, de-limbed and with no tops.
- ❖ Diameter anything that we can split into firewood with our volunteer workers and a 27-ton wood splitter, the smallest about 6-8" and largest about 24".
- We accept dead and green wood (not decayed/rotten wood), and <u>hard wood only</u> (no pine of any kind). We do not drop standing trees or pull dropped trees.
- We kindly accept already cut or split hardwood donations!
- ❖ The firewood length we provide to families is 16" and we can also use lengths that are around 12" and up to around 18" to ensure they fit most woodburning equipment
- We cut to length, split, and stack for drying on our property prior to delivery. We measure the moisture content of the wood we deliver to be sure it is ready.
- Delivery address: 112 Trinity Court Bellefonte (off 550 / Buffalo Run Road, near the State College Airport)






