The food bank also submitted a grant request and received enough dollars to purchase new commercial-grade freezers and refrigerators! They were so big “the guys” had to take out the double door to get them in with a sixteenth of an inch to spare ~ thanks guys!!!!

The rocket club started off with a bang! You might ask the Ministry? Absolutely! We had 25 kids and adults come together and build the rockets. Some that participated were first timers in our church. On launch day Moms, Dads, Grams, Mema's, Gramps, Paps, Papaw's, Aunts and Uncles all came to watch.

The kids loved being able to be the launch controllers and the rocket recovery team performed flawlessly. We did have a “Houston we have a problem” moment though. One of the larger rocket's parachute opened at altitude and caught some wind. We believe it is now somewhere in Stormstown!

Our church fund raising arm (VMI or Valley Mission Initiative) continues to do their fund raising and through your support of these fund raisers combined with support from our Women United for Christ group to provide donations that will send 9 of our kiddos to camp. This is AWESOME!!!!!!

Another major event coming up on October 10 is our Family Fall Festival. We'll have a campfire with hot dogs and s'mores, games and storytelling. Over the next several months, the rocket club will choreograph a fireworks show to close out the evening. Everyone is welcome, so invite your friends!

Also, your pastor, the Finance committee and Administrative Board listens to your needs. We have approved the contract to add more parking spaces, and we don't need a capital funding campaign to pay for it!!!!

Hopefully in five years we will need more parking but that's up to you all to invite folks to join us.

I leave you with this thought from Luke: *No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the Kingdom of God.*

With that I look forward to plowing ahead in this next six months of 2026!!!!

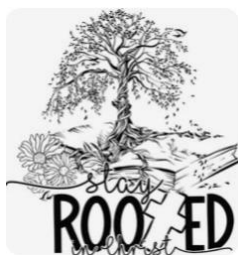

Laboring in Love with Purpose

This Labor Day my encouragement is to pause to reflect, commemorate, and celebrate the significance of our labor within the framework of our faith in Jesus Christ. Labor Day serves as more than just a mere break from our regular routines; if we are willing, we can use this day as an opportunity to dive deeper into the spiritual relationship with God, to reflect on the work he is doing through us, in us and for us, and recognize the inherent value and purpose it holds in our lives. Let us dedicate Labor Day to reflection and appreciation, acknowledging the blessings and challenges that accompany our labor while seeking inspiration from the example set by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Let us take this "holiday" to reflect on the significance of our labor in the light of God's word.

In Luke 10:2 Jesus said, *"The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."* These words remind us that there is much work to be done in the Kingdom of God. Our labor extends beyond our workplaces and into the fields of souls, where God desires to bring about a bountiful harvest.

In considering our labor, we often associate it with our jobs or careers. While our vocational work is important and worthy of honor, let us remember that our true calling is to be "Kingdom workers" for Christ. Paul reminds in Colossians 3:23-24 *"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving."*

In this passage Paul writes reminds us that our labor, whether in the workplace, at home, or in the community, is an opportunity to serve the Lord. It is not merely about pleasing our employers or achieving personal success. Instead, we are called to work heartily, with dedication, knowing that we are ultimately serving our Lord Jesus Christ. Our work becomes an act of worship, an opportunity to display the love of Christ, and a gateway for sharing the good news of salvation with those around us.

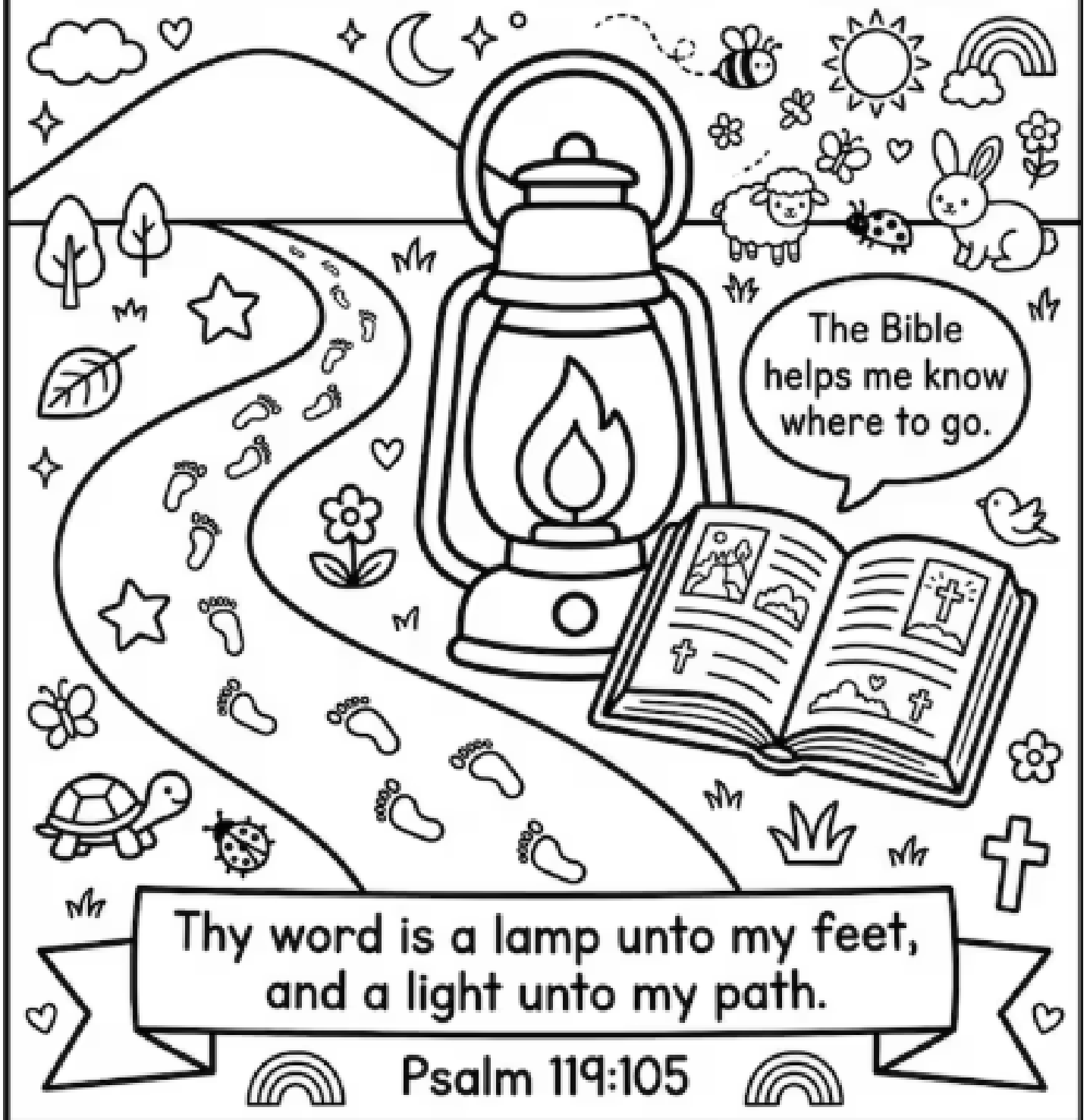
So let us remember our work has eternal significance. Every task, no matter how mundane it may seem, can be transformed into an act of service to God.
