

Wet Pets N Critters Pet Rat Care Guide

Rats are intelligent, social, and affectionate pets that thrive on interaction and proper care. With a good diet and environment, pet rats typically live 2–3 years.

Housing

- Cage Size:
 - o Minimum: 24x12x18 inches for a pair of rats. Bigger is always better!
 - o Multi-level cages with **solid floors** are ideal for exercise and enrichment.
- Bedding:
 - o Use paper-based bedding or aspen shavings (available at Wet Pets N Critters).
 - o Avoid cedar or pine shavings, as these can cause respiratory issues.
- Cage Setup:
 - o Include multiple hides, hammocks, and tunnels.
 - o Add climbing toys and chew toys for enrichment.

Social Needs

Rats are highly social and should never be kept alone. Plan to adopt at least two rats for companionship.

Diet

- Staple Diet:
 - o Feed a high-quality rat pellet or lab block (available at Wet Pets N Critters).
- Fresh Foods (in moderation):
 - Offer small portions of fresh vegetables (broccoli, carrots, spinach) and fruits (apple, banana, berries).
- Treats (occasionally):
 - o Small animal-safe treats like yogurt drops or whole grains.
- Provide **fresh water daily** in a water bottle or heavy dish.

Avoid:

- Sugary, salty, or processed human foods.
- Citrus fruits for male rats.

Chewing

Rats' teeth grow continuously! Provide **chew toys**, untreated wood blocks, or cardboard tubes to prevent overgrowth.

Exercise & Enrichment

Rats are active and curious! They need:

- Daily out-of-cage playtime in a safe, supervised area.
- Tunnels, ramps, and wheels (solid surface only—no wire wheels).
- Foraging toys and puzzle feeders for mental stimulation.

Cleaning & Maintenance

- Spot-clean daily to remove waste and uneaten food.
- Change bedding at least **once a week**.
- Clean cage, hides, and accessories with a small animal-safe cleaner (available at Wet Pets N Critters).
- Clean food and water dishes daily.

Handling & Taming

- Handle rats gently and regularly to build trust.
- Let them sniff and explore your hands before picking them up.
- Always support their body and never grab by the tail.

Health Tips

Signs of a healthy rat:

- Bright, clear eyes
- Smooth, clean fur
- Active, curious behavior
- Normal eating and droppings

Signs of illness:

- Sneezing, wheezing, or labored breathing
- Hair loss or scabs
- Weight loss or lethargy

Contact a small animal-savvy veterinarian if you notice any health concerns.
