

Wet Pets N Critters Corn Snake Care Guide

(Pantherophis guttatus)

Corn snakes are one of the most popular pet snakes, known for their calm nature, beautiful color patterns, and manageable size. With proper care, they can live 15–20 years in captivity.

Housing

- Enclosure Size:
 - A 20-gallon long tank is suitable for a young corn snake. Adults do best in a 40-gallon or larger tank.
- Enclosure Type:
 - o A secure, escape-proof tank with a tight-fitting screen lid is essential.
- Substrate:
 - Use aspen bedding, coconut fiber, or reptile-safe substrate (available at Wet Pets N Critters).
 Avoid cedar or pine bedding.
- Hides:
 - o Provide at least **two hides**—one on the warm side and one on the cool side.
- Decor:
 - o Add branches, artificial plants, and climbing decor for enrichment.

Temperature & Heating

- Basking Spot: 85–90°F
- **Cool Side:** 75–80°F
- **Nighttime Temperature:** Can drop to 70–75°F
- **Heating:** Use an **under-tank heat mat** (with thermostat) or a **ceramic heat emitter** (both available at Wet Pets N Critters). Avoid heat rocks.
- Use a **digital thermometer** to monitor temperatures.

Lighting

Corn snakes do not require UVB lighting, but a **12-hour light/dark cycle** using natural room light or a low-wattage bulb is recommended.

Humidity

• 40–60% humidity is ideal. Mist lightly if needed and provide a **humidity hide** (lined with damp moss) to help with shedding.

Diet

Corn snakes are carnivores. Feed appropriately sized frozen/thawed mice (available at Wet Pets N Critters).

Hatchlings: Every 5–7 days
Juveniles: Every 7–10 days
Adults: Every 10–14 days

Prey should be about the same width as the widest part of the snake's body.

Water

Provide a **shallow water dish** with fresh water at all times. Change water daily.

Cleaning & Maintenance

- Spot-clean waste as needed.
- Replace substrate every 4–6 weeks.
- Clean the enclosure with a **reptile-safe cleaner** (available at Wet Pets N Critters) monthly.
- Clean the water dish daily.

Handling

Corn snakes are generally calm and tolerate handling well. Handle gently and regularly to maintain a tame temperament. Always support their body fully. Avoid handling right after feeding.

Health Tips

A healthy corn snake should:

- Be alert and active
- Eat regularly
- Shed in one complete piece
- Have clear eyes and smooth skin

If you notice refusal to eat (outside of shedding), swelling, or breathing issues, consult a reptile-savvy veterinarian.

Supplies Checklist (Available at Wet Pets N Critters)

- 20–40 gallon tank
- Secure screen lid
- Under-tank heat mat with thermostat or ceramic heat emitter
- Digital thermometer
- Aspen bedding or coconut fiber
- Hides (2 or more)
- Water dish
- Climbing decor

- Frozen/thawed miceHumidity hide (optional)Reptile-safe cleaner
