

# **Wet Pets N Critters**

## **Ball Python Care Guide**

Ball pythons (*Python regius*) are one of the most popular pet snakes. They are known for their calm nature, manageable size, and unique patterns. With proper care, they can live **20–30 years** in captivity.

### Housing

- Enclosure:
  - Hatchlings: 10–20 gallon tankAdults: 40-gallon tank or larger
  - o A secure screen lid is essential
- Substrate:
  - o Aspen bedding, cypress mulch, or coconut fiber (available at Wet Pets N Critters)
- Hides:
  - o Provide at least two **reptile hides** (one on the warm side, one on the cool side)
  - o Hides are important for helping your snake feel safe
- Climbing & Enrichment:
  - o Add low branches, artificial plants, or reptile-safe decor for enrichment

# **Temperature & Humidity**

Warm Side: 88–92°FCool Side: 75–80°F

• **Nighttime:** Do not let temps drop below 72°F

• **Humidity:** 50–60% (increase to 65–70% during shedding)

Use a **heat mat with thermostat** or a **ceramic heat emitter** (available at Wet Pets N Critters) to maintain proper temperatures. Avoid heat rocks, as they can cause burns.

## Lighting

Ball pythons do not require UVB lighting, but a regular **12-hour light/dark cycle** is important. A low-wattage bulb or ambient light is enough.

#### Diet

- Feed appropriately sized frozen/thawed mice or rats (available at Wet Pets N Critters)
- Hatchlings: Feed once a week
- Adults: Feed every 10–14 days

Prey should be about the same width as the snake's widest point.

# Water & Hydration

Provide a **reptile water dish** large enough for the snake to soak in. Change the water daily and clean the dish regularly.

## Cleaning & Maintenance

- Spot-clean waste as needed
- Replace substrate every 4–6 weeks
- Clean the enclosure and accessories with **reptile-safe cleaners** (available at Wet Pets N Critters)

#### **Health Tips**

A healthy ball python should:

- Eat regularly
- Shed in one complete piece
- Have clear eyes (except during shedding)
- Breathe quietly

If your snake stops eating, has trouble shedding, or shows signs of respiratory illness (like wheezing), seek advice.

# Handling

Ball pythons are generally calm and can be handled regularly. Always support the snake's body, handle gently, and avoid handling during shedding or right after feeding.

# **Supplies Checklist (Available at Wet Pets N Critters)**

- Enclosure (10–40 gallon tank)
- Screen lid
- Heat mat with thermostat or ceramic heat emitter
- Thermometer and hygrometer
- Two reptile hides
- Reptile water dish
- Reptile-safe substrate (aspen, cypress, coconut fiber)
- Reptile-safe cleaner
- Feeding tongs

• Frozen/thawed mice or rats
