

Wet Pets N Critters Crested Gecko Care Guide

Crested geckos are fun, easy-to-care-for reptiles that are ideal for both beginners and experienced keepers. They come in many colors and patterns and typically live **10–15 years** with proper care.

Housing

- Enclosure Size:
 - o A **12x12x18-inch vertical tank** is ideal for one adult. Larger enclosures allow more space for climbing and exploring.
- Enclosure Type:
 - o Use a glass terrarium with a secure screen lid for ventilation.
- Substrate:
 - Use coconut fiber, reptile bark, or paper-based bedding (available at Wet Pets N Critters) to help maintain humidity.
- Decor:
 - o Provide branches, cork bark, vines, and artificial plants for climbing and hiding.
 - o Include at least **two hides**: one on the warm side and one on the cool side.

Temperature & Humidity

- Temperature:
 - Daytime: 72–78°FNighttime: 65–72°F
 - Crested geckos thrive at room temperature—no heat lamp is usually needed unless your home is cooler.
- Humidity:
 - 0 60-80%
 - o Mist the enclosure lightly once or twice a day and monitor with a **humidity gauge**.

Lighting

• Crested geckos do not require UVB, but a low-level UVB (5.0) can be beneficial and is optional.

• Maintain a 12-hour light/dark cycle using natural light or a low-wattage bulb.

Diet

Crested geckos are **omnivores** and thrive on a **commercial crested gecko diet** (available at Wet Pets N Critters).

- Feed **crested gecko food** 4–5 times per week.
- Offer live insects like small crickets or dubia roaches (2–3 times per week). Dust insects with calcium and vitamin D3 powder (also available at Wet Pets N Critters).
- Provide a shallow water dish with fresh water daily.

Cleaning & Maintenance

- Spot-clean waste daily.
- Replace substrate every 4–6 weeks.
- Clean the enclosure with a **reptile-safe cleaner** (available at Wet Pets N Critters) monthly.
- Clean food and water dishes daily.

Handling

Crested geckos are generally calm and easy to handle, but they can **jump!** Handle gently and over a soft surface. Support their body and avoid grabbing their tail—it may drop off (this is normal, but it won't grow back).

Health Tips

A healthy crested gecko should:

- Be active and alert, especially at night
- Have clear eyes and smooth skin
- Shed regularly and completely

If you notice weight loss, incomplete shedding, or refusal to eat, contact a reptile-savvy veterinarian.
