Kingsnake Care Guide

(Common Pet Species: California Kingsnake, Mexican Black Kingsnake, Florida Kingsnake)

Kingsnakes are hardy, beautiful snakes known for their striking patterns and calm temperaments. They make excellent beginner reptiles and can live 15–20 years with proper care.

Housing

- Enclosure Size:
 - o A **20-gallon long tank** is suitable for a juvenile; a **40-gallon** or larger is best for an adult.
- Enclosure Type:
 - Use a **secure**, **escape-proof tank** with a **tight-fitting screen lid**—kingsnakes are known escape artists!
- Substrate:
 - Use aspen bedding, coconut fiber, or reptile-safe substrate (available at Wet Pets N Critters).
 Provide 2–3 inches of substrate for burrowing.
- Hides:
 - o Provide at least **two hides**—one on the warm side, one on the cool side.
- Decor:
 - o Add branches, rocks, and artificial plants for climbing and enrichment.

Temperature & Heating

- **Basking Spot:** 85–90°F
- **Cool Side:** 75–80°F
- Nighttime Temperature: 70–75°F
- Heating: Use an under-tank heat mat with thermostat or a ceramic heat emitter (available at Wet Pets N Critters).
- Use a **digital thermometer** to monitor temperatures.

Lighting

Kingsnakes do not require UVB lighting, but a 12-hour light/dark cycle helps regulate their natural rhythms.

Humidity

- Maintain humidity at 40–60%.
- Mist lightly if needed, but avoid overly damp conditions.
- Provide a **humidity hide** with damp moss to assist with shedding.

Diet

Kingsnakes are carnivores. Feed appropriately sized frozen/thawed rodents (available at Wet Pets N Critters).

Hatchlings: Every 5–7 days
Juveniles: Every 7–10 days
Adults: Every 10–14 days

Prey should be no wider than the widest part of the snake's body.

Water

Provide a **shallow water dish** large enough for soaking. Change water daily and keep it clean.

Cleaning & Maintenance

- Spot-clean waste as needed.
- Replace substrate every 4–6 weeks.
- Clean the enclosure monthly with a **reptile-safe cleaner** (available at Wet Pets N Critters).
- Wash water and food dishes daily.

Handling

Kingsnakes are generally calm and tolerate handling well.

- Handle gently and regularly to keep them tame.
- Always support their body fully and avoid handling after feeding (wait at least 48 hours).

Health Tips

A healthy kingsnake should:

- Be alert and active
- Have bright, clear eyes
- Shed in one complete piece
- Eat regularly

Contact a reptile-savvy veterinarian if you notice:

- Loss of appetite (outside of shedding)
- Incomplete sheds
- Breathing issues or discharge

Supplies Checklist (Available at Wet Pets N Critters)

- 20–40 gallon tank
- Secure screen lid
- Under-tank heat mat with thermostat or ceramic heat emitter
- Digital thermometer
- Aspen, coconut fiber, or reptile-safe substrate
- Hides (2 or more)

- Water dish Climbing decor (branches, rocks, artificial plants) Frozen/thawed rodents Humidity hide (optional) Reptile-safe cleaner
