

# Wet Pets N Critters Chinchilla Care Guide

Chinchillas are fun, active pets known for their soft, dense fur and playful personalities. With proper care, they can live 10–15 years.

### **Housing**

- Cage:
  - Use a **large multi-level cage** with plenty of space for climbing and jumping. A solid floor is best for their feet.
- Bedding:
  - o Use **aspen shavings** or **paper-based bedding** (sold at Wet Pets N Critters). Avoid cedar or pine, as these are harmful to chinchillas.
- Hides and Shelves:
  - o Provide a wooden hide box or tunnel for resting.
  - o Add wooden ledges or ramps for climbing and jumping.

# **Temperature & Environment**

- Chinchillas are sensitive to heat. Keep the room between 60–70°F.
- Avoid drafts and direct sunlight.

#### Diet

- **Pellets:** Feed a high-quality **chinchilla pellet** (available at Wet Pets N Critters).
- Hay: Provide unlimited timothy hay for proper digestion and dental health.
- Treats: Offer small amounts of safe treats like dried rose hips or hay cubes. Avoid sugary or fatty snacks.

#### **Dust Baths**

Chinchillas do not bathe in water. They need **dust baths** to keep their fur clean and healthy.

- Use **chinchilla dust** (available at Wet Pets N Critters) in a shallow dish.
- Offer a dust bath **3–4 times per week** for 10–15 minutes.
- Remove the dust after bath time to prevent soiling.

#### **Enrichment**

- Chinchillas are active and need things to chew on. Provide **safe wooden chews** or **pumice stones** (sold at Wet Pets N Critters) to keep their teeth healthy.
- Offer exercise wheels designed for chinchillas (solid surface, no wire mesh).
- Supervised playtime outside the cage is encouraged but always in a safe, enclosed space.

# Cleaning

- Spot clean daily.
- Clean the cage thoroughly once a week with **small animal-safe cleaners** (available at Wet Pets N Critters).
- Replace bedding regularly.

## **Health & Handling**

- Chinchillas are naturally shy but can become friendly with regular, gentle handling. Always support their body and avoid grabbing by the fur.
- Signs of a healthy chinchilla include bright eyes, a clean nose, normal droppings, and a healthy coat.

If you notice signs of illness (diarrhea, lethargy, weight loss), contact a veterinarian who treats small animals.
