What is a democratic Committee member?

A democratic Committee member is elected to represent their district, as well as specific residential desires within the corresponding neighborhoods. They should bring knowledge of and connections with the district that others outside the district may not have.

How long is a Committee member's term?

Four years. Elections occur during the democratic primary in odd numbered years. In the event that more than two people are looking to become a Committee member in a particular district, those individuals must complete a petition and be a registered Democrat in order to be eligible to be on the primary ballot.

What if I lose the election for Committee member in my district? Can I still be involved? Yes! We welcome any and all individuals who would like to be involved, even if there are two Committee members already elected to your district. In the near future, we hope to form different Sub-Committees for different aspects of our organization and although those will be led by Committee members, they are open to all residents of the borough. You will be considered a non-voting member of the Organization.

What does the time commitment look like?

Each Committee member's time commitment varies depending on their level of involvement; however, all Committee members are required to go to our monthly meetings and are highly encouraged to attend all events hosted by the Democrats. A Committee member must be responsive and attentive to outreach by other Committee members or the Chair and Vice-Chair.

What are my responsibilities as a Committee member?

A Committee member's responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Advocating for the residents of their district and bring forth their issues to the committee-at-large, so the party can determine how to address those concerns
- Assisting the party in selecting highly qualified candidates who are dedicated to continued advocacy for borough resident needs and who maintain the democratic principles overall
- Identifying party supporters within their jurisdiction and "get out the vote" during election time
- Helping register eligible voters, regardless of party affiliation
- Being involved in improving the community
