The last two months have seen major changes in Amateur Golf in the Lansing area. The first of course, is the emergence of our association as a major force in local amateur golf. The second is the improved coverage by the press and media in general and the State Journal imparticular.

It is my feeling that the people who participate in golf tournaments, constitute a group equally as large or larger than those who play most other sports for recreation. Therefore, I feel that the coverage should reflect this participation. This resurgence in coverage is more than welcome and therefore our association has offered our assistance to all the media.



- MALANEY AND SCHORER WIN CITY BEST-BALL! -

Scott Malaney and Tom Schorer withstood the late charges of four teams to win the City of Lansing's annual "Spring Best-Ball" by 1 shot thanks to a birdie on the 18th hole by Tom Schorer. Their victory was a team effort as Scott also chipped in with birdies as well as clutch pars on 8 and 9 to keep them in the hunt. Their total of 133 was one stroke better than the teams of Dave Cushion-Carl Bond, Dave Brooks-Nick Nicol, and Tim Russell-Jim Donahue who were at 134.

With 2 holes left to play, Dave Brooks and Nick Nicol were one shot back with Tim Russell and Jim Donahue two shots off the pace. Tim Russell chipped in on 17 from 45 feet while Dave Brooks missed a 10 footer from just left of the pin.

On the par 5 18th hole, Nicol, Russell and Donahue all hit the green with Brooks just off to the left of the pin. When Brooks' chip shot came up just short, it was down to Nicol, Russell and Donahue. Nick Nicol putted and just missed from 20 feet. Tim Russell putted next and appeared to have made his putt but it was slightly firm and lipped out from 12 feet. Donahue was last to putt, his putt also appeared to be headed in, but it bounced and missed to the left.

With those challenges out of the way, it was now a waiting game for Tom and Scott. Two teams still had a chance to tie. Joe Allen and Bob Franklin had to birdie one of the last two holes that they were to play, but having played the back nine first, they faced the tough 8th and 9th holes. Just as the last two teams, it was not to be as they parred both of the holes. It was now down to the team of Marcel Holloway and Jim Armstrong.

A misunderstanding concerning Marcel's and Jim's score led to some anxious moments for Schorer and Malaney. It was thought that Holloway and Armstrong had pulled to within one shot after making birdie on 13. Then when Marcel (who was coming off a strong showing in the Amateur qualifying), chipped in for birdie on 14, it was thought that they had pulled even. But it was not the case and they finished in a tie for 7th.

- FOR YOUR INFORMATION -

You have no doubt heard of the Stimpmeter, but for those of you who haven't, a "Stimpmeter" is a device that the U.S.G.A. uses to measure the putting speed of the greens for it's championships.

So - just what is a "Stimpmeter"? A "Stimpmeter" as a aluminum rod that is 36 inches long and is groved to hold a golf ball on course. This rod is notched 30 inches from the tapered end, which remains on the putting surface during the testing.

How do you use it? First, you must find a flat spot on the green that is at least 10 feet square. Place a golf ball in the "notch" and slowly lift the rod off the ground until the ball escapes the "notch" and rolls down the rod and onto the green. You must repeat this procedure 3 times. You then average the 3 ball's distances and repeat the same process after going down to the area where the balls had come to rest and heading back toward the spot you just came from. You then take the two averages and add them together and divid by 2 to give you the "Stimpmeter" distance.

So when you hear your favorite announc on T.V. talking about the speed of the greens and how they "Stimpmetered" them out to what ever speed, you'll know just how they arrived at that speed.

For example, if they say that the speed of the greens is 10.3, what they mean is that the ball rolled an average of 10 feet, 3 inches. 8 feet, 6 inches is considered a normal speed for average play. 10 feet, 6 inches is considered fast for P.G.A. and U.S.G.A. tournament play. The fastest green speed in recent years was 12.3 at the 1982 Mid-Amateur Championship.

Each member of the Greater Lansing Amateur Golf Association receives a copy of the 1985 Rules of Golf. Why? Although there are several good reasons, the following might be considered the two (2) most important ones:

(1) SINCE THE RULES OF GOLF ARE FOR EVERY-ONE, EVERYONE SHOULD KNOW THEM!

There are a surprising number of people that play golf that are not familiar with the rules of golf. In golf, it is not only the players responsibility to know the rules, but to enforce them in a fair and equitable manner. By sending each member the latest copy of the rules of golf, our association is placing the most accurate and relevant information about the rules of the game in your fingers. We would also suggest that you carry your rule book in your golf bag at all times. (Preferably in a snap lock plastic bag to account for inclimate weather.)

(2) THE RULES OF AMATEURISM ARE SPECIF-ICALLY DEFINED!

It is the intent of our Association to promote tournaments that abide by the rules of amateurism. These rules begin on page 101 of the rule book. It is just as important for the junior members of our association to know what the rules

are, and that participation in a tournament where prize money is offered could result in the loss of a collegiate scholarship....FOR ANY SPORT!

While we were there, we were fortunate enough to have one of the area's top amateur players stop in for work on his irons. He had been using the same set for the last few years and now was having some problems with the flight of his shots.

After hitting a few balls with J.C. watching, it was determined that the flex point in the shafts currently in the irons was too high. J.C. suggested that this player have just one shaft changed and try the club for a few days and if he was satisfied then they would change the entireset.

After this player left, J.C. explained that most golfers don't require this type of individual attention. However, when a player of any caliber requests it, he is oblige them. J.C. went on to explain that "while I am not and don't profess to be a golf professional, I do have a working knowledge and understanding of shafts and their effect on flight patterns. I feel that we (he and his staff) can help anyone with equipment related problems."


