

FROM THE PRESIDENT:

Now that I have thanked most of you for your help in making our Association a great success, I would like to express some thoughts about the 1987 Golf Season.

This year, thanks to the efforts of people like Bob Aumaugher, Barry Dean and others, as well as such groups as the BOC Supervisors Counsel, our area will see the rebirth of two old tournaments and the putting into place of a new tournament that will aide not only the "Special Olympics, but our Junior Golf Program as-well.

The efforts of Barry Dean will see the once popular Clinton County Best-Ball come to life once again in early June. Bob Aumaugher is the driving force behind the rebirth of the All-City Match-Play Tournament which will take place in the later half of June.

June will also see the start of the First Annual BOC Supervisors Council Scramble. This tournament is scheduled for June 6, 1987. They are well aware that this date conflicts with the City of Lansing's Spring Best-Ball (see "Tournament Schedule"), but they have assured us that every effort will be made to accomodate any team wishing to play in both events. This tournament will be

an 18 hole 4-man scramble with no handicap limit. We encourage all our members who can to play in this event, as half of the proceeds will come to our Junior Golf Program.

This summer may also see the possible birth of the "Bud Reniger" Memorial Medal Play Tournament.

This tournament will be unique in the fact that it will not be flighted and that the field will limited in size. The limitation on the size of the field is being done by the fact that a person who wants to play must meet a specific set of requirements which might include the following: - Top 25 in the 1987 All-City Medal Play Championship

- Qualify for the final 16 in the 1987 Match Play Championship.
- Have won one or more tournaments in the last 5 years.
- Have placed in the top 5 in All-City, Oak Lane or anyother tournament of stature in the last five years.
- Qualified for the State Amateur in the last 3 years.
- Qualified for the Michigan Open in the last 3 years.
- Qualified for any U.S.G.A. tournament in the last 5

years.

These are only examples and may not be the only way into this field but they are none-the-less a good example of just what will be the requirments to get into this event.

The exact requirements and the dates and place of this tournament will be announced by the first of May.

So as you can see, there will be alot of things happening on the tournament schedule for 1987. I only hope that this is just a preview of things to come in the Lansing Area.

YOUR CLUBS ARE STOLEN

As some of you know my clubs were stolen. Unlike many however I got some of my clubs back.
The difficulty I experienced in getting them back left me with some ideas as to what to do before your clubs are stolen.

- 1. Be sure you can identify your clubs. Yes, I know it sounds easy but how many of you have written down the serial numbers stamped on your clubs? Also stampings and decals can be altered or removed. And less than 10% of all clubs have any unique identification. What to do? Any golf club repair shop can perform measures that will provide a unique identification for your clubs. Equally important, the receipt given for the work done can serve as a record.
- 2. Keep records (receipts). When my stolen clubs were found at a local establishment, the officers and detectives wanted to know whether I had any identification for the clubs. Because I had just bought them I still had the receipt. The detective said

that having that receipt was more important even than the fact that the clubs were left-handed.

3. Make sure your clubs are insured. These days when compared to replacement costs, insurance is cheap.

are unique enough to be easily
identified, but are they? No,
no club, not even your Taylor
Made Tour Preferred Burner Plus
with the 9.5 degree loft and Titanium shaft that you play with



OAKLANE SCRAMBLES INTO NEW YEAR

Though the official (normal) Oaklane scrambles ended November 16, fifteen golfers (so-called to be polite) extended the scramble season into January '87--in Michigan that is. Undaunted by 30 to 40 degree temps. and snow 1 to 3 inches on greens, a core group consisting of Dick Wakulsky, John Wakulsky, Mike Boynton, Red McIntyre, Todd Colthorp, John Weurding, and Bob Aumaugher, plus an armtwisted lot consisting of Felix Ridsdale, Gary Becker, Tom Mase, Mark Strolle, Bob Barber, Paul Kostemo, Paul Shuler, and even Steve Wakulsky, in some combination or other, played golf on the following dates -- Nov. 23, 28, 30, Dec. 20, 21, 26, 27, Jan. 1 and 6. Only record cold kept them from the links in the first two weeks of December.

What follows are the highlites of this "Winter Tour". The on site occurrance of these events was only slightly affected by the pints of butterscotch schnapps brought along as hand warmers. November 23--Weurding and Aumaugher shoot 30-29--59 at Oaklane to set the '86 fall scramble record. Their play further chilled opponents, Dick Wakulsky, John Wakulsky, Red and Mike. Winter rule # II-6.53 was invoked since there was snow on every other green. Thus putts on snow greens were walked off and putted on non-snow greens. The scramble title came down to the 18th green, where 3 holes worth of putts were undertaken. On the 18th green Weurding made two 15 footers to birdie the 17th and 18th holes to set the record. Dick Wakulsky played in mittens and rubber hunting boots. November 28--Ridsdale and Aumaugher take first in a 25 hole affair at Oaklane. Other core members apparently ate too much turkey.

November 30--Colthorp and Aumaugher shoot 64-good enough to edge Red and Mike, Dick and John, Felix and Gary. Winter rule # II-6.54 is invoked for the 28th and 30th, namely that since snow and some ice covered all the greens there was to be no cleaning of snow or ice from greens except within 5 feet of the hole--inside the leather, of course, was good.

December 21--D. Wakulsky and Aumaugher invoke winter rule II-6.55 which is that we play the greens as we find them. We find all greens snow and ice covered. But Red and Mike and Todd and John Weurding find it harder to play it down than Dick and Bob. Ah, where are those players who complain about spike marks in the summer? The round is delayed by cross country skiiers on the 9th at Oaklane.

December 26--Todd invites the silly six to Lansing Country Club. We find that when all greens in the area are covered with snow and ice those at LCC definitely putt better. Frequent use of the hand warmers prevents accurate recall regarding whether Red and Mike or Dick and John Wak. won. Highlite of the

round is the second shot that was hooked at 14 onto the pond and into a hockey game.

December 27-Back at LCC, Weurding and Colthorp go four under the last five holes (John eagles 15 on his own ball) to come from behind and beat Dick and John and Red and Mike.

January 1--Tough choice between hockey at Lake of the Hills and golf at Pine Lake. So we went to Oaklane. Tom Mase and Mark Strolle nick Red and Bob for three bucks in a nine holer.

January 6--Earnest Thayer in his <u>Casey</u> At The Bat said that, "Somewhere in this favored land the sun is shining bright". Today that is at Twin Oaks north of St. Johns. Felix and Bob and Bob Barber, Paul Shuler, and Paul Kostemo play 15 holes. Dick Wakulsky is a no show. There is a rumor he went to Tucson to play Boothill Country Club.

ALL CITY MATCH PLAY PROPOSAL

This note is to alert youthe members-as to our newest attempt to reconstitute the All City Match Play. Current plansopen to modification-call for the following:

- 1. A two weekend event, not flighted.
- Projected dates -- the weekends of June 20,21 and June 26,27, and 28.
- 3. No qualifying--the tournament will be open to the first 64 to enter.
- 4. Given good weather, the matches will be played in this sequence: Saturday June 20,32 matches-Sunday June 21,16 matches-Friday afternoon June 26,8 matches-Saturday June 27, 4 matches morning, 2 matches afternoon-Sunday June 28, 1 match.

- 5. Participants will pay their own greens fees for each match. In addition there will be a \$ 10.00 entry fee. So losing one's first match will cost ten dollars plus greens fee.
- 6. Tentatively entry fee money will be used to purchase a medal for the champion, to pay the tournament greens fees for the champion and runner-up (six rounds, approximately \$70.00 each), and to return a purse (in gift certificates) of \$460.00 divided as follows:

200. to the champion.

- 100. to the runner-up.
 - 40. to a semi-finalist.
 - 40. to a semi-finalist.
 - 20. to each quarter-finalist loser.
- 40. for championship medal. Again this pay out is tentative being based on 64 entries and no unforseen costs.
- 7. The golf course venue has not been decided.

BALLOT

On Thursday March 19, three GLAGA board members (Phil Klintworth, Tim Russell, and Burton Smith) attended a meeting at the Lochmoor Club in Grosse Pointe sponsored by the Golf Association of Michigan (GAM). The purpose of this meeting was to invite public golf organizations to join the GAM. Regarding the question of GAM-GLAGA affiliation there are three alternatives for consideration. Please read the following alternatives and the inserted GAM pamphlet and then complete the ballot at the end of this article.

ALTERNATIVE #1: Have the entire GLAGA organization join the GAM.

The minimum cost of each member club to join the GAM is \$450.00 each year--\$100 for each club and \$350 for the membership. Dividing this \$350 by \$7 gives a minimum number of 50

members necessary to join. If the entire Membership of GLAGA joined then the cost of a GLAGA membership would increase \$7 per year. Note: some of our members are already members of GAM through their private clubs, e.g., CC of Lansing, and such a cost would be a duplication.

ALTERNATIVE #2: Have only the members interested in the GAM join, with the additional cost divided among them. For example if only 50 members wanted to join the GAM \$9 would be added to their GLAGA membership fee. Note that the minimum cost of \$7 for each GLAGA member interested in the GAM does not decrease with more members joining—the \$450 total is a minimum not a maximum.

ALTERNATIVE #3: Not to join the GAM at this time.


