Jim was instrumental in originating GLAGA and in getting it through those trial and error two years. GLAGA is now known not only around Lansing but about the State as well. Well Done Jim!

This will be one of the most exciting and pivotal years in the history of the GLAGA. For example, this is the last year of the three year rotation for the All City Medal Play Championship. The players will be asked to evaluate the two course concept and the results will effect the future of this event. This clinic may attract television so don't miss the program. Thirdly, we see the addition of two events--the Match Play Championship and the Bud Reniger Memorial -- to the GLAGA schedule. These events will be limited in their size, so don't think you can wait until the last minute to enter them.

Finally, we will perhaps explore a different event—the Mixed Team Scramble Tournament—to be played in the month of August at a course to be

TO BEGIN IN JUNE

All those interested in having their children participate in our Junior Golf Program should watch for the sign-up article in the first part of June. This year's program will differ from last years in that we will be using only M.S.U.'s Forest Akers East Course. The program will be open to the first 270 youngsters between the ages of 7 and 17 years of age who sign up. Registration Blanks will be at the following courses: Groesbeck, Red Cedar, Sycamore, Indian Hills, Royal Scot, Forest Akers, Highland Hills, 4-Winds, Chisholm Hills, and Oak Lane.

The cost this year is \$ 3.00 for the five week course. This fee will include: Bag Tags, Information sheets, Lessons, and a Clinic which will once again feature Jim Gallagher Jr. from the P.G.A. tour.



Once one of the best Best Ball tourneys in the area, the Clinton County Country Club Best Ball went into hiatus for the last few years. Like the Portland Best Ball the CCCC Best Ball used to draw competitors from all over the State thus providing a chance for Lansing area golfers to compete with some of the State's best players, Pete Green for example.

This year will see the CCCC Best Ball re-instated. The efforts of Barry Dean et.al. have brought about a 2 day flighted event scheduled for June 13 and 14. The field is limited to 60 teams and the entry cost is \$60 per team, \$40 of which goes to the prize fund. CCCC is only 9 holes but is usually in good shape with fast rolly greens. 

That together with their getting to play their high school home course, and the fact that they are good players put them at the top of the leader board when Sunday drew to dusk at the Portland Best Ball. They along with Ron Clark and Steve Martin shot 132 on the par 71 course. But Jeff holed a 15 footer on the second playoff hole for the victory. Clark and Martin had a 63 Sunday to get into the playoff. Defending champs Morrie Hoevel and Brian Donahue turned in a good defense finishing 1 stroke out of the playoff as did Jack Pitts and Burton Smith, and H. Nelson and A Whited, the last team having played

in the tournament for years. Portland pays top dollar -- \$ 800.00 for first and thus draws a good field each year. However while there are complaints about the greens every year, this year they seemed to be especially bad. Almost everyone I talked to moaned about the greens, the main criticism being that they were bumpy and full of holes. While most players make allowances for spring greens many found Portland's wanting not for slowness but for unpredictability. Come on Portland make your tournament something to be proud of for more than paying top dollar. Plug and top dress those greens in the spring--get them smoothed out for next year.

Forgive us for the dust!

Many projects are in the process of being completed at Groesbeck and we would like you to be aware of what's going on.

The most obvious project is a joint venture with the Board of Water and Light. The Board is providing the equipment and manpower to do a project that benefits the entire community by providing more efficient handling of surface water runoff, and benefits the golf course by reducing flooding, increasing irrigation potential, and creating pleasing areas to look at and play near. The "ponds" in front of #16 tee and to the left of #14 green have been dredged out to a great degree. We have also created a pond to the right (east) side of #11 fairway. Materials and fill from these projects have been used to build up previously low, wet areas adjacent to these newly renovated water hazards. What this will do eventually is alleviate the flooding problems in #11 and #15 fairways and make all these areas far more aesthetically pleasing for you, the golfer. Also involved with the project is a water line running from the pump station south of #10 fairway to these ponds so as to be able to regulate the water level so they will never become swamp areas. The flow of water can be reversed so as to pump water out of the ponds for irrigation; the advantage of this is to keep the water levels down during wet times and also use water for irrigation that is warmer than deep well water which causes less stress on the grass plant.

This brings us to our other current project; the modernization of our irrigation system. Automatic irrigation will now be possible at Groesbeck and all watering heads have been replaced and many new ones added. Automatic watering means that we can irrigate during the nighttime hours the course is closed and eliminate the inconvenience to players of watering during normal operating hours. This also will save us valuable labor hours that were previously used for watering. The new system gives us the ability to provide and maintain a consistent, healthy grass plant that will benefit everybody.

The last but not least item to be mentioned is the ongoing fence replacement project. If you've played here in the last 2 years you will notice that the entire Wood St. side and the Bancroft Park side of the course have been completed and the remainder of the perimeter we hope to complete in the next few years.

The ideas for these projects are not new; we are fortunate in that at this time it was felt every effort should be made to show you, the golfers of the Lansing area, that the City is willing to support the newly formed Enterprise Fund system to make a success out of the City of Lansing Golf Operation. We will continue to strive to provide a quality golf experience for you!
