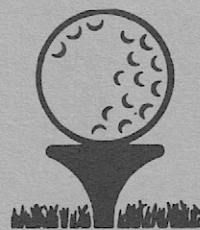

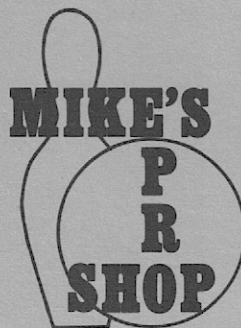

BEHIND THE COUNTER --

A Pro's Point of View

Interview with Jerry Matthews

Jerry Matthews, Golf Course Architect, resides in Lansing and operates his design firm here. With courses such as Timber Ridge, The Players Club, Eldorado, The 1st - 9 of Highland Hills, Four Winds, redesigns at Country Club of Lansing, Walnut Hills and future projects at Groesbeck and Waverly, Mr. Matthews has certainly made a name in golf around Lansing. Recently I spoke with Mr. Matthews and discussed golf around the Greater Lansing Area.

With your past projects in Lansing, could you tell us anything about them? Such as what you liked? Being pleased that Timber Ridge has proven successful and nominated by Golf Digest as one of the top public courses in the U.S. Also the redesign work at Walnut Hills and Country Club of Lansing has been good.

There's been a lot of thoughts on future golf course designs, being more playable. What are your feelings? The market has created what has happened today. Big, well financed, developers want a big name architect or golf professional, and they want that to draw people. This has created a rush of exotic designs and everybody is trying to out do the other. And its becoming difficult to handle, for the average golfer.

When you approach a new project, what are your thoughts with the use of the land? First thing I look for is the elevation differentials golfers like to be up in the air hitting the ball. Secondly I look for all the low spots, for drainage. I take advantage of what nature put there. I don't believe in moving a lot of cubic yards of earth.

What are some of your favorite golf holes that you've designed in the area? I'm partial to Par 3's. Of those number 16 at Timber Ridge is my favorite, a hole that has everything. It has the optical illusion of not being really where you think it is. Elevation change, woods, water, sand, but is fair for everyone. Walnut Hills number 4, I kind of always liked that

one, even though I'm not a fan of uphill Par 3's. Also number 12 at Eldorado, its a long Par 3, I'm not a big fan of Long Par 3's, but one on every course is fair. Also Number 4 at The Players Club, with its pompas grass, is a good hole. I like to design holes that everybody can swing one time, and have a chance to stick it in the hole.

Are there any holes you would like to go back and change, if given the chance? Golf courses are never finished. Number 7 at Timber Ridge, I would like to rework, and make a much larger landing area off the tee. I like the hole, but it just crosses that line of being fair.

In redesigns, do you follow the past design or do add your own character? That would depend on the facility. If we're directed by the client to do that, we don't have any problem, if they have 17 horrible greens, flat round pancakes, there's no sense in building another horrible green. We try to do the best job we can.

In the Lansing area, what do you think the market can handle in new courses? I think Lansing could stand another private country club. Also Lansing could have two (2) public 18 hole courses; one of them could be located between Lansing and Grand Ledge, the other somewhere on the eastside.

There's been talk of rebuilding Groesbeck and Waverly, can you tell us anything about them? We're doing a remodeling proposal for the City of Lansing. We are suggesting some new greens and tees for Groesbeck. Also parking, clubhouse, and bringing it into the 90's. Waverly we're studying an 18 hole plan.

In conclusion, what are your thoughts on Golf in Lansing? I think Lansing is a very good golf town, as I mentioned earlier I would like to see another private club and two 18 hole public courses, that the area could support. I think you have to have quality, the level of golfer emerging wants a better golf course, and I think we'll see some new courses.

GOLF COURSES CHART PATH TO THE FUTURE

The path to the future is becoming clearer for the City of Lansing golf courses as the Parks & Recreation Department works with the nationally known and award winning golf course design firm of Mathews & Associates to develop a Master Plan for renovating Groesbeck G.C. and feasibility of converting Waverly G.C. into an 18 hole facility.

The game of golf has changed over the years and as the popularity of the game continues to increase it is the intent of the City of Lansing to provide residents of and visitors to the area with a variety of golfing experiences. The renovations at Groesbeck and redesign of Waverly would provide "state of the art" golf courses that would be showplace facilities for the Capital Area. The future implementation of these plans has not been decided but when the time comes to decide where to go with the City of Lansing golf courses we will already have the map! These facilities coupled with the popular Red Cedar course and the popular (but sometimes wet) Sycamore course would provide the Lansing area with top quality golf opportunities and experiences.

As the planning and design continue for these future improvements we invite you to stop in to the Golf Operations Office in the basement of the Groesbeck G.C. clubhouse to take a look at the plans as they become available to our staff and give us your comments

and reactions to the proposed changes.

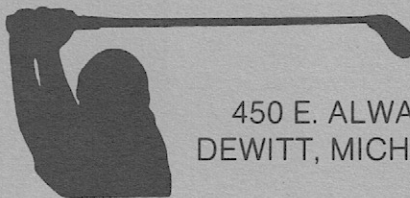

**PORTLAND BEST-BALL:
Why do I play there?**

In the last 28 years I have never missed a Portland Best-Ball. Oh, I have threatened to never play their again mostly because of the fact that I have played poorly, but I have always gone back. Last year was different. The greens were in poor shape and I, like a husband who has caught his wife with another man, was a very upset person. Once again I like other players, made a solemn vow to never tread the fairways of Portland Country Club again. However, now as spring approaches, I have mailed in my entry. Why?

I have given this some real thought and I guess the reason I have always gone back is that I really like the course. I really like the tournament and most of all I get to see many of my old friends (many of whom I haven't seen all winter). When you add that to the meal you get and the birdies you can make, it becomes an event rather than a tournament. Don't discount the birdies, the low scores make up for alot of ills. Thinking of all this made me realize that I play there because of all the nostalgia. Right then I made a promise to myself to never make such a poor statement again.

During the past 28 years that I have played in this tournament, I've been fortunate to win on two occasions and have finished in the top ten several times. I have seen my son win and I have played with my son, father, and uncle. I have played in a short sleeve shirt and I have had to wear a parka between shots. I have made a hole-in-one to start the tournament and I have made a 7 to end another. I have been beaten by a team who made six straight birdies on the last six holes, and I have won by making a bogey on the last hole. I have played in snow flurries, rain, thunderstorms, tornado warnings, and have scraped frost off my shoes before each shot. I have driven all night from Virginia to play and I have hitchhiked from Lansing when our car broke down. Why would I have done all that if I didn't like to play at Portland?

All this has made me realize that I would really miss not playing at Portland. Besides, Portland offers some things that other tournaments don't:

1) If you win at Portland, you are the only team that can win all the tournaments for that year. Howard Evans told me that after my first win and I have never forgotten it.

2) Portland pays well! Regardless

3) You get a great meal. The only other tournament that gives you this type of meal is Chisholm Hills. The meal has changed from grilled steaks to roast beef to ham and now to swiss steak. I can still remember the steaks being grilled next to the 18th green. They were "great". Some things have remained the same--the fresh "homemade" bread and pies.

4) When you win at Portland, you join the "whose-who" of golf in the Mid-Michigan area. It seems like only the best players win at Portland. You need only to look at the past champions to realize this--Arlin Dell, Otto Schubel, George Wakulsky, Wayne Kramer, Lynn Jansen and Randy Erskine. These are but a few names of those who have won at Portland. If you win at Portland, you know that you have arrived as far as local golf is concerned.

Well, I have told you why I'll play their as long as I can. You should consider some of what I have said before you say--"I'll never play at Portland again".

THE GRIP & THE RULES

The five-year grace period for grips ruled non-conforming on January 1, 1984, expired on December 31, 1989. Penalty for using these grips after January 1, 1990, and other non-conforming grips — Disqualification.

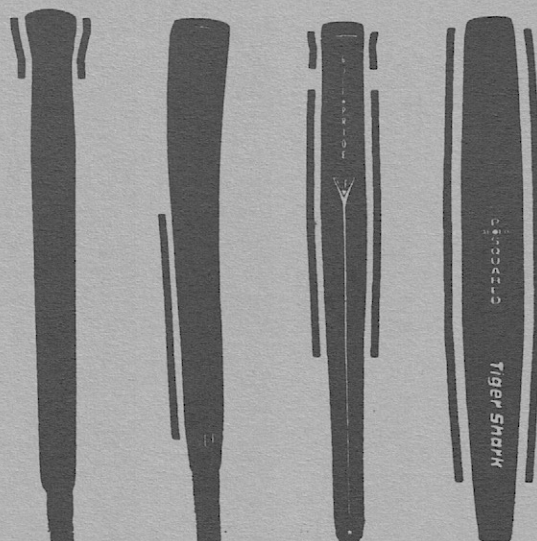
Square — All four sides are flat throughout its length.

Pistol — Its flat side is continuous throughout its length.

Ping — Slight indentation at the top of the flat side is permissible.

Circular — Only circular grips are permitted for woods and irons, including chippers.

*Modified versions of the Paddle grip and Tiger Shark that conform to the Rules of Golf are available.

Features of certain grips violate the Rules of Golf, and cause those grips to be considered non-conforming. The essence of those features that should be considered in determining whether or not a grip conforms to the Rules:

1. In general, a grip must be straight and plain in form, and shall not be molded for any part of the hand.
2. Grips may not have any bulge or waist.
3. Putter grips may have flat sides, but these must be continuous along the full length of the grip, so that the cross section of the grip is generally similar throughout its length.

For the full text, see Rule 4-1c of the Rules of Golf, and Appendix II 4-1c.

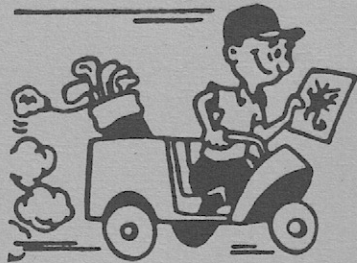

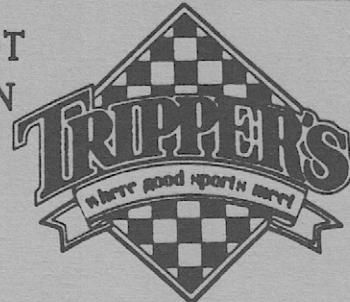

GOLF BOOKS FOR EVERYONE

Following receipt of the March 1990, GOLF NEWS, and the reading of both the book review section and Bill Kost's comments, I called Bill. I really wanted to know if Robert Gamez was that good. In the course of our conversation of the Scottish courses we had played and had yet to play, the topic of golf books emerged. More specifically, "The Classics Of Golf" book club came up, a club to which we both belong.

Most of you have no doubt seen the "Classics" advertised in the various golf publications, but perhaps it didn't catch your attention. When I received DOWN THE FAIRWAY, by Robert T. Jones, Jr. in early 1984 as a first selection, I was hopelessly hooked on the series. I have just begun the fifth year and it seems as though each book outdoes the preceding one as to quality! For those of you who like reading of golf, as a supplement to playing, I would strongly recommend you look into this series. Plus these books are affordable.

In THE DOGGED VICTIMS OF INEXORABLE FATE, Dan Jenkins tells about George Low, the inventor of the famous putter, and his mode of living. Low defines being successful as someone who owns no overcoat; he never settles down where it gets cold. In THIRTY YEARS OF CHAMPIONSHIP GOLF, Gene Sarazen tells of his caddy, Skip Daniels with whom he won the 1932 British Open. Following the Open, Sarazen gave Daniels his favorite polo coat and then was notified of the caddy's death several months later. And finally, Bernard Darwin in THE GOLF COURSES OF THE BRITISH ISLES, makes you feel as though you were walking the hallowed grounds with him. It is also a wonderful guide for anyone planning a pilgrimmage there.

Hence the attractiveness of "The Classics Of Golf". Publisher Robert Macdonald and editor Herbert Warren Wind have spared nothing in their search for the true classics. Included in the series are the

inevitable instruction manuals, history, humor, architecture, biography, etc. Its all here. One of the things I have personally enjoyed is the accessibility of Robert Macdonald. On several occasions I have wanted extra copies of a book and a phone call to him was all that was required. He also has provided invaluable assistance when I have traveled to England and Scotland for golf. He plans on publishing 36 books, six per year, with the possibility of select additional classics once that is completed, depending upon subscribers demand, to which he is very sensitive.

ALL-CITY GOLF TEAM CRITERIA

The 1990 All-City Golf Team will be selected on a point system that has been devised by the GLAGA Selection Committee. The top six (6) leading players by total points will comprise this years All-City Golf Team. Listed below are the tournaments and points that will be awarded based on finish.

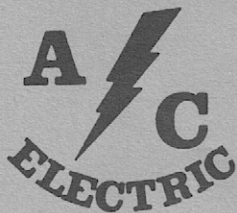

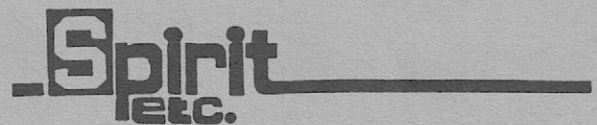

BOOK, MAGAZINE, AND VIDEO REVIEW

This month we are reviewing Golf Illustrated, Ben Hogan's 5 Modern Fundamentals of Golf, and Ben Crenshaw's Putting Video.

Golf Illustrated is the most glossy of all the golf magazines. It is published by the Family Media Inc.. While it is fairly similar to the other publications on the market, it seems to take the time to really research the information that it wants to put in the magazine. This magazine is a little different in that it only comes out ten times a year, but then again it seems to be totally about golf rather than having two issues that deal mainly with selling property in Florida. The only thing we found fault with in the magazine is the number of pages given to the fashions that they seem to think will be worn on the fairways this year. Every year we see the same things in each magazine and the only things that you really do see being worn are the shoes. Everything considered, we would rate this magazine as a good buy and worth the \$1.95.

Ben Hogan's 5 Modern Fundamentals of Golf was first printed in Sports Illustrated many years ago. It is without a doubt one of the best instruction books ever written. One tour player (Larry Nelson) taught himself to play by reading this book. It is very easy to read and well enough illustrated to help you understand what has been written. This book is as current now as it was when it was written in the 1950's. The

price of this book varies from \$12.95, depending if it is on sale or not. It is well worth the price and we rate it an excellent buy. **The copy we reviewed was published in the 1960's and the cost was \$1.00.

Ben Crenshaw's Putting Video is almost a total waste of money at \$29.95. The best part of the video is the footage of such players as Bobby Jones, Ben Hogan, Sam Snead, etc.. The main problem with this video is that Ben Crenshaw teaches an arm and shoulder stroke, but all the film footage is of players with a wristy stroke. We all know that Crenshaw is a good putter and we have seen him make alot of putts. We don't need to pay \$29.95 for the treat of watching it again. A poor buy!
