4 New Medal Play Tourneys

LAGA has added three new individual flighted medal play tournaments for its members in 1995. With the renewal of Oaklane's medal play tournament in June, scratch golfers to high handicappers will now have an opportunity to compete in a medal play format at least five times this year.

The inaugural tournament is scheduled for May 6 and 7 at Centennial Acres. The tournament is open to GLAGA members only, so be sure to send in your 1995 membership application along with your entry form (both of which can be found inside this newsletter).

The tournament is open to the first 75 GLAGA members who enter. John Nagel, the pro at Centennial Acres, has worked closely with the GLAGA Board to prepare for the event. John has reserved a block of tee times for the tournament starting at 8 am. Groups of three will tee off in ten minute intervals.

The cost for this two day 36 hole event is \$50 plus a \$15 one time membership fee if you haven't already renewed your GLAGA membership for 1995. Carts are extra. A cart rents for \$20. Entrants who want to ride during the tournament will be paired up so

they can share the cost. The entry fee includes greens fees and a prize fund for up to three flights. Prize certificates are redeemable at the Centennial Acres pro shop. For the adventuresome, a separate daily skin pot will be available.

The tournament will be flighted according to handicaps. Entrants do not have to supply a handicap. If you don't have a handicap or don't supply either a USGA or League handicap that can be verified, you will be placed in the Championship Flight. Depending upon the range of handicaps among the entrants, there will be as many as three flights. Your flight will be established before you play.

Oaklane's summer medal play tournament is scheduled for June 24 and 25. This tournament is flighted by score after the first day of competition. Oaklane starts to take applications one month in advance of all its tournaments.

A GLAGA Summer Medal Play Tournament has been scheduled for July 22 and 23 at El Dorado Golf Course. Like the spring tournament, this one will be open to the first 75 GLAGA members who enter.

The All City Medal Play is set for August 4, 5 and 6. It will be played at Groesbeck and Highland Hills this year.

In September, the GLAGA Fall Medal Play Tournament will be held at

Brookshire GC. With an additional 9 holes designed by the renowned Matthew's family, Brookshire offers golfers both a target and a links venue to test their skills. The tournament will be held on September 23 and 24.

The 1995 medal play schedule covers the map with tournaments north, south, east, and west of Lansing as well as in the city limits.

Equipment News

ay good-bye to your metal golf spikes in the near future, or so reports Terry Moore, the editor of Michigan Golfer. The emergence of a new product called Softspikes has some of the more famous country clubs adopting a spikeless shoes policy for regular play. While claiming to hold the road even in the rain, soft spikes supposedly have become the green superintendents friend. They don't tear or cut up the greens. The dread ball mark between you and your three foot putt may become the exception rather than rule. Spikeless shoes are also more effective in combating the spread of poa annua.

Moore claims that at the PGA Merchandise Show in Orlando this year, nearly one third of the club pros responding to a question about adopting a spikeless shoes policy at their course said their courses were indeed considering such a policy. Here in

Michigan, if you plan to play in any tournament held at Boyne Highlands or Boyne Mountain, you'd better be spikeless, otherwise you won't be allowed to tee off.

Meirndorf's answer to Myrtle

f you are considering a winter trip South next year, you may want to investigate Jacksonville, Florida. A travel group called G.T.O. (Great Times Out) offers a very attractive package for the budget minded. We flew from Detroit to Jacksonville for \$334.

This price included round trip air fare, 4 days of golf, a rental vehicle, and three nights lodging at a Holiday Inn. The price does not include cart rental. Carts ranged from \$14 to \$17 per round. However, if you had an early tee time, you could play the same course in the afternoon for free and only have to pay for the cart.

We paid a little extra to rent a mini van. Having the extra room worked out well for golfers. You could spend as little or as much on food as you wanted.

Our itinerary was great. We flew down on a Monday morning and checked in to our rooms. We then went to the practice range and in the afternoon played 18 holes. On Tuesday and Wednesday, we played 18 holes and would have had time for 9 more but decided instead to get ready for the return flight home.

One course, Bay
Meadows, was average. The others,
Cimarrone, Golf Club at
Jacksonville, and Mill Cove were
very nice. The fairways in February
were thin but playable. The greens
were not quite up to par.

The people were very accommodating. We only had one little glitch with the car rental company, but everything else went like clockwork.

I have been to Myrtle
Beach several times but each time
we drove. This package costs only
a little bit more and the flying
made all the difference in the
world.

We happened to go the first week of February and they were having record low temperatures, but with the proper clothing we could still play comfortably. If we had gone to Myrtle Beach we wouldn't have been able to play at all. Normal temperatures for that time of year are 60 to 65. For the price I would highly recommend this trip to fellow golfers.

Joining a Country Club

very so often a member of our board fields a question on how to join one of the local "private" country clubs. I have compiled some basic facts on membership at the Country Club of Lansing and Walnut Hills Club. This information was true for 1994. Fees and dues may have changed for 1995.

At the Country Club of Lansing, regular membership fees are \$9,875 plus \$125 in stock. Dues for regular members are \$260 per month (\$3,120 a year). An intermediate membership (persons aged 21 to 35) would cost \$2,000 and monthly dues are \$175 (\$2,100). A social membership at the Lansing Country Club which does not include golf privileges is \$2,500 and monthly dues are \$100.

An intermediate social membership is \$500 with monthly fees of \$68.75 (\$789 a year).

To join, two current members must sponsor you. You must also meet with two current members of the board of governors. Letters of recommendation from sponsors and/or present members of the club are advised.

Walnut Hills has a similar array of memberships. A general member whose fee is \$8,000 plus a \$2,000 equity fee. General membership and corporate membership dues are \$260 a month, (\$3,120 a year). For persons under 35, an associate membership is available. Associate members must pay the \$2,000 equity fee when they join and the \$8,000 initiation fee by age 35. Associate membership dues are \$172 a month (\$2,064 a year). A social membership is available with a \$500 initiation fee (\$100 is equity) and monthly dues of \$70, (\$840 a year).

Walnut Hills also provides a corporate membership for up to five employees. The corporate membership fee is \$12,500, (\$4,000 is member equity). All corporate members at Walnut Hills must work for the same corporation.

Walnut Hills members are also required to spend \$825 a year on food and beverages.

Golf - Boom of the 90s?

n 1975, 13 million
Americans played one round
of golf or more during the year,
according to the National Golf
Foundation in Jupiter, Florida. By
1992, this number had grown to

24.8 million, a 91% increase. The number of rounds of golf played rose from 308,562 in 1975 to 505,400 in 1992, a 64% increase in rounds played.

The number of private golf facilities actually declined 5% from 4,770 in 1975 to 4,568 in 1992 according to the US Census Bureau's 1994 Statistical Abstract of the United States. On the other hand, then number of daily fee golf courses grew from 5,014 in 1975 to 6,552 in 1992, a 30% increase. Municipal golf facilities increased 32% from 1,586 to 2,090 in 1992.

Clearly the expansion in golf has come through the public access side of the golf coin. As new golfers enter the sport, they are obviously going to have to turn more and more to public facilities to play the game.

Daily fee and municipal golf clearly pay their own way and can even turn a fairly respectable profit. Lansing's four municipal golf courses are a proven profit generator.

The Lansing Park and Recreation Municipal Golf Fund Budget estimates 1995 revenues of \$1,283,134 from golf related sales, fees and miscellaneous areas. Out of nearly \$1.3 million in revenues golfers generate for the city, \$272,051 or 21% is taken out for city "administrative charges." These charges represent what the City takes from the golf fund to help pay for running city government.

There is a resolution on Fiscal Year 96 budget priorities before the City Council which contains the following language:

That the administrative charges to the Golf Enterprise Fund be capped at no more than 14% of golf revenues, and the difference

between the cap and the actual charge, per the Indirect Cost Plan, be dedicated exclusively to Capital Improvements.

The recommendation was not incorporated in the Mayor's budget for fiscal 96. Judging from reports out of the Mayor's Office that only five people have called to express opposition to the sale of Waverly Golf Course, it is also likely that the Mayor and the City Council have heard little from Lansing area golfers in support of increasing the amount of golf revenues that go back into the maintenance and improvement of the area golf courses.

The Lansing Park and Recreation Department seems to understand the movement away from golf at private clubs to golf on publicly accessible grounds. They have produced a draft 1995-1999 Master Plan for the entire department which includes the following recommendations for the local area golf courses.

The plan calls for expanding Waverly to 18 holes with construction of a new clubhouse facility.

At Groesbeck, the draft plan proposes the renovation of Groesbeck Club House to include indoor seating, winter use for cross country ski rental and warming for the sledding hills open on the course. It also recommends the acquisition of additional land in what is now Bancroft Park. With this new land, Groesbeck will be redesigned. The new layout which includes a number of new water hazards on the course looks promising. The acquisition of new land for Groesbeck will also allow for a driving range where golfers will be able to buy a bucket of balls to hit.

Golf News

The Master Plan acknowledges developers' interest in what is now Waverly and replacing the facility with another one of equal or enhanced value. But the plan also recognizes that this will only happen if the public supports the idea at the ballot box.

The Plan addresses the need for a feasibility study regarding the flooding and frequent closure of Sycamore Golf Course. It recommends that the course be elevated and properly drained or closed and used for other park related purposes.

Finally the plan proposes new irrigation systems at Waverly and Red Cedar Golf Courses as well as the development of a separate driving range and golf learning facility which can generate additional revenue for the golf fund.

Editorial Comment

The planners at the Park and Recreation Department seem to recognize what golfers in this community need. But unless the golfers help by getting behind the plan for upgrading what we have as well as growing golf in the community, we may end up with less at a time when more and more people are turning on to the game. If the city's elected decision makers don't hear from area golfers about what is needed in Lansing, they will conclude that nothing needs to be done in spite of the 1995-1999 Master Plan for golf. But then again, that's my opinion. If you want, let me know what you think and I'll share it with our readers.


