Local Man Builds Clubs, Dreams

For four Saturday mornings this May the vision of a "camp" for young people who otherwise would not get a chance to be exposed to golf, will again come to pass for Jeff Hunter of Hunter's Custom Clubs.

Jeff smiles modestly when he tells the story of how it all got started. It was at Christmas time four years ago. While sitting in church thinking about an appropriate way to be charitable, he was struck with the idea of building clubs for 9 children from his church. Being an experienced club builder, this was do-able. Then he explains that "The Lord spoke to me" and encouraged him to then help these kids with some instruction. Running a free golf clinic seemed to be what needed to be done.

By the time the weather broke that spring, the group had grown to 20. That bunch met for one Saturday morning. The response inspired Jeff. The following year there were 50 kids showing up every Saturday in May. Last year the number had grown to 65.

The curriculum has grown each year also. It now includes instruction in proper stance, set-up, alignment, putting, chipping, etiquette, sportsmanship and, of course, the rules of golf.

This year the Youth Golf Camp will again be back at the Lansing Golf Center every Saturday morning in May. These generous folks have donated their facility for all the camps. Jeff thinks the number of kids will only be limited by the number of volunteers that come out to help. It takes a whole lot of people willing to give their time to kids and a whole lot of hustle by a highly motivated camp director like Jeff to come up with the help necessary to pull off a program such as this.

Mr. Hunter is quick to point out he has not done this by himself. He says none of this would have happened without the help from wonderful

folks like <u>Sherrill Pittman</u>, <u>Pete Cunningham</u>, <u>Barry Robinson</u>, <u>Ed Watson</u>, <u>Josh Clark</u> and <u>Ron Ferry</u>. He would also like to publicly thank the following sponsors:

Summer Golf Scholarships

Enclosed is the application for the Greater Lansing Amateur Golf Association (GLAGA) Youth Golf Scholarship for 2002. **GLAGA** and the **Lansing Youth Recreation Fund** (LYFR) have donated the money for these scholarships.

The scholarship provides a "Gold Junior Golf Pass" for the City of Lansing courses that allows you to play for a reduced rate of \$.50 per 9 holes at Waverly, Red Cedar and Sycamore Golf Courses and \$2.00 per 9 holes (\$4.00/18 holes) at the Groesbeck course.

The pass is valid for the following hours:

Monday through Friday before 2PM

(except holidays like July 4th)

Saturday, Sunday and Holidays after 4PM

The scholarships will be issued for the month of June. You must use your Gold Pass in June in order to have it renewed for the month of July. Similarly, you must use the renewed Gold Pass in July to have it renewed for the remainder of the summer season (to Labor Day). (The passes will be renewed monthly to ensure that unused scholarships can be awarded to other interested players and that maximum benefit is obtained for the money that has been donated for the program.)

Scholarships will be awarded based on the following:

Residence - City of Lansing residents will be given preference
Middle or High School student
Need - City of Lansing Parks and Recreation criteria will be used
Interest in Golf
Willingness to learn and practice good golf etiquette

If you are interested in playing golf this summer and a scholarship would help you play more often, please fill out the attached application. You are asked to include a short essay (one page max) telling why you would like to have a scholarship. See the Application for Essay details. Mail it to this address:

Greetings!

Welcome to the second edition of GLAGA Golf News for the year. We hope that you enjoyed the 2001 tournament summaries in the first edition and have had a chance to review the Golf Calendar for 2002. We look forward to welcoming your participation in all of our events.

In this issue you'll find a variety of information on junior golf for the year including junior golf summaries from 2001, GLAGA Junior Golf Scholarship Program for 2002, the scholarship application and an introduction to Hunter's Custom Youth Golf Camp. Sadly, after more than fifteen years, Ed Brown has retired from running the GLAGA Junior Tour. The Junior Tour was formally separated from the operation of GLAGA four years ago even though it retained the GLAGA name. As the junior tour will not be continued, we have redirected our energies and the board elected to extend support for junior golfers through the GLAGA Junior Scholarship Program. In the past four years, GLAGA and the Lansing Youth and Recreation Fund in cooperation with Don Ballard, the director of golf operations for the city of Lansing, have provided more than \$10,000 for junior golf passes to our municipal golf courses. Further, plans are nearing completion and construction is soon to begin on a First Tee Learning Center at the site of the current Sycamore Golf Course. The scholarship program will be extended to include first tee range passes to qualified youth. GLAGA board member, Steven McLeod, is the golf course architect for the project.

In tournament news, the GLAGA SPRING STROKE PLAY tournament kicks off our 2002 season at the Emerald Golf Course in St. Johns, May 4 and 5. In addition to regular 1st, 2nd and 3rd place flight prizes, low senior and senior runner-up will be awarded medals and

gift certificates. The \$90 entry covers green fees and the prize fund for the 36-hole event. Carts are extra. The ENTRY DEADLINE is APRIL 27. Entries are limited to the first 75 paid entries received. Annual GLAGA membership dues (\$30) may be paid with your entry. For more Tournament information contact Dave Kaufman at 381-8527.

The ALL-CITY MEDAL PLAY, August 9, 10 and 11, pairs the Royal Scot Golf Links Tournament Course with the Timber Ridge Golf Club for what we believe will be a very challenging and exciting city championship. The field this year is limited to the first 252 paid entries. The ENTRY DEADLINE is August 2. If you have not had a chance to play the new Royal Scot Golf Links Tournament course, the weekend of June 1 and 2 will be the perfect opportunity as Royal Scot will host a two-day medal play event over the layout to be used in the All-City Medal. Contact the pro-shop at Royal Scot (321-6220) for all the details.

The ALL-CITY MATCH PLAY, June 14, 15 and 16 at Groesbeck, opens with an eighteen hole stroke play qualifier. The low 32 scores will advance into the Friday afternoon first round matches. All entrants are guaranteed at least two rounds with non-qualifiers playing a consolation medal play Saturday morning. The ENTRY DEADLINE is June 7. Other GLAGA tournaments for 2002 will be previewed in upcoming editions of the GLAGA Golf News.
