All City Tournaments

Eric Cowles came from behind to take the All City Match Play title in a hard fought battle with Bill Schmidt. The tournament was played over three days, starting with a shotgun qualifier on Friday, June 15 and concluding with the two man finals on Sunday afternoon, June 17.

Eric Cowles claimed the double crown this year with a one shot victory over former All City Champion Nathan Clark. The tournament which was played at Groesbeck and Timber Ridge this year turned out to be a tournament of champions with 2001 All City Match Play Champion Cowles, 1999 All City Medal Play Champ Nathan Clark, and Russ Cunningham who won last year's Stableford Tournament and this year's Summer Medal Play playing in the final group on Sunday. When Nathan's approach shot on 18 richoceted off the green side trees into the water hazard fronting the green, Eric seized the opportunity to turn a one shot deficit on the 18th tee into a single stroke victory.

All Member Tournaments

Brad Myott won the **Spring Medal Play** at the Emerald the first weekend of May in a one hole sudden death playoff against Dick Diana.

Russ Cunningham lapped the field with a six shot victory in the **Summer Medal Play** at Royal Scot in July. Thirteen year old Sam Burman and last year's Senior Medal Play Champion Steve Martin shared second place.

The Stableford was conducted at Hawk Hollow on September 29 and 30. Gray Tuttle caught and passed first round leader Jerry Blake and Spring Medal Play runner up Dick Diana on the last few holes to take the first place prize. This year the Stableford will move to Forest Akers East in July.

Senior Member Tournaments

GLAGA members 50 and older had two events to compete in this year. Jim Westwood won the first **Senior Medal Play** tournament held at Willowwood in Portland in July. Jim finished a stroke behind Ron Clevenger at the second **Seniors Medal Play** held at Oaklane.

Junior Golf Scholarship Program - 2001 Recap

Last summer over 60 Lansing teenage golfers were awarded scholarships by GLAGA enabling them to golf to their hearts desire. They played over 900 rounds on Lansing's Municipal courses.

This was the 3rd year that GLAGA had sponsored this program for Lansing area teens. Chris Nicholoff's Lansing Recreation Fund again provided \$3,000 to go with GLAGA's contribution. In total there was over \$6,000 provided in scholarships. Don Ballard, Lansing's City Golf Director, has provided the administrative support as well as being a constant day-to-day advocate within City Hall. Thanks Don.

The program does more than just provide reduced greens fees for the young duffers (50¢ at Sycamore, Red Cedar and Waverly, \$1.25 at Grosbeck). A special thanks goes to Coach Fossum, retired MSU Varsity Golf Coach, who donated two group lesson sessions at Akers Golf Range (though one got rained out). The rules of golf and course etiquette were emphasized as well as the proper golf swing. The participants in this program have taken a big step towards making golf a part of their lives.

- "So thanks again for the opportunity of playing golf ...more times that usual." It gave me the confidence to try out for Eastern's Golf Team (I made the team!).
- "The pass gave me the opportunity to play..... and spend more time golfing with my father."
- "I am thankful for this program because I understand the game more and I love to play it."
- "When I started playing golf, my scores were around 70, now they're around 40."
- "Now that I get to go golfing more, I have gotten much better. My game has gone from the high 70s to the low 60's... Thank you very much."
- * "Thank you for giving me the opportunity to play golf without the trouble of money."
- "I got my first birdie at Red Cedar on the fourth hole."
- "I had the best summer of my life. Why? Because I got to go Golfing almost every day"
- "It taught me a lot about golf; e.g.; one day I could be driving well but chipping poorly and on another chipping well, but driving poorly. No matter how bad I am doing though, I learned I have to stay focused on every shot.
- "Sometimes when I go out with my Mom and Dad I can give them a little pressure now."
- Your donations helped me pursue my passion for golf."
- "Thanks for giving children like us the opportunity to enjoy the game of golf."

What more can be said – they appreciated the opportunity, took advantage of it and will have fond memories that will stay with and influence them for the rest of their lives.

GLAGA will once again be partnering with Chris Nichol off to sponsor another 60 or so scholarships this coming summer. The scholarships go to boys and girls who love golf but who otherwise might only be able to play occasionally, if at all. **Your GLAGA dues make this possible**. These young people are grateful to all the members for the continued support of this effort.
