Spring Medal Play Tournament

Sunday, May 5, 2002

The Greater Lansing Amateur Golf Association (GLAGA) kicked off the 2002 golf season this past weekend with 60 players battling it out in the Spring Medal Play tournament. Mother Nature finally provided the mid-Michigan area with some good weather for golf and the staff at The Emerald at Maple Creek overcame a late spring to provide a venue that was in top shape.

18 year-old Erik Wilutis from Okemos took advantage of the great conditions and virtually lapped the field by an amazing 9 strokes with a score of 142 (2 under par). Erik, a red-shirt freshman on the Grand Valley State University golf team, credited his win to an accurate driver, steady iron play and a good touch around the greens. He completed the two rounds with only 4 bogies and one 3-putt!

Mike Tungate and Craig Chambers both finished at 151. Tungate won a 2-hole playoff for the 2nd place trophy. Jerry Blake shot 152.

Mike Mason won the First Flight competition with a 2-day total of 155, followed closely by Blake Hazen at 156 and 13 year-old Sam Burman at 157.

Daniel Balogh won the 2nd flight with a score 160. Steve Green II won a playoff with Dan Leung for 2nd place after finishing with two day totals of 161.

Respecting the Game Pace of Play

Anyone who has played any tournament golf knows that there are several issues that will be considered when the event is judged for quality. The condition and speed of the greens, the pin placements, the height of the rough and the ease of finding yardages most often make the discussion list. The one factor that almost always comes up that is not controlled by the golf course is pace of play. A proper P.O.P. is a result of self-discipline and conscience effort by the players to play at a speed that will make the round enjoyable for everyone.

In 2001 the general feedback was that the P.O.P. was better than in the past. At the Spring Medal Play at The Emerald "turn times" were monitored. Only three groups needed to be encouraged to play faster. Many of the groups turned well under their target times. And all groups finished their rounds in less than the 4 and 1/2 hour limit. All of you who have played and contributed to this organizational success are to be congratulated.

Slow play is a plague on golf that more often than not is a consequence of sharing the course with poor players who have no appreciation for how the game is to be played. The G.L.A.G.A. membership has always represented a more savvy and enlightened portion of the golfing population. A proper P.O.P. is something we should all expect and help bring about at our events.

Here are few reminders that are good for all of us to review from time to time:

- Set a target time for your group.
- Set a personal goal for your round: To be at your ball with the proper club when it's your turn to hit.
- Set a fast pace while walking to your ball, marking its flight by a background object such as a tree, bush or shadow.
- Determine distance and trajectory toward the green by noting yardage markers, wind direction and obstructions before you reach your ball.
- Have two or three clubs in mind before you reach your ball. Examine your lie and make a final decision.
- Carry two or three clubs with you when sharing a cart or playing "cart path only".
- Repair ball marks, clean your ball and study your line of putt --while others are preparing to putt.
 BE READY WHEN IT'S YOUR TURN!
- Know the rules for a ball that might be lost or outof-bounds. Hit a provisional ball immediately and limit your search for the first ball to no more than 5 minutes. (a USGA rule)
- Limit practice swings.
- Start walking toward the ball immediately after it's hit. Admire or lament the shot en route.
- Be aware of your pace of play and the pace of your group. Encourage others in your group to "pick up the pace" if they begin to become overly deliberate. Take pride in playing the game quickly.

Speaking of pace of play, if you feel you struggle to comply with GLAGA's policy on pace of play we have included a short piece in this issue to suggest ways in which to play faster while not rushing your game. Most of you will be familiar with these suggestions but it never hurts to reinforce your own understanding of ways to keep play in your own group moving.

Next up, GLAGA will be conducting the ALL-CITY MATCH PLAY CHAMPIONSHIP at Groesbeck Golf Course on June 14, 15 and 16. The \$80 entry fee guarantees two rounds of golf and contributes to the prize fund. An 18-hole stroke play qualifying round will shotgun at 7:30am Friday with the low 32 scores entering the championship match brackets Friday afternoon. To win the Match-Play one must survive the qualifying round and win five matches! Those not qualifying for match-play will play a Saturday morning medal play event with prizes. The **entry deadline** is **June 7** for receipt of entry forms.

June is also the **GLAGA Seniors Medal Play** hosted the 22nd and 23rd by Willow Wood Golf Course in Portland. The entry deadline for the Seniors is June 15th. For full tournament details please find the information further on in this newsletter.

As of this writing GLAGA Summer Golf Scholarship winners had not been determined. There were 97 total applicants for the awards which provide a Gold Junior Golf Pass for the City of Lansing courses. Don Ballard is still reading! Watch for a list of scholarship winners in an upcoming newsletter!



Steve is currently serving as GLAGA'S competition course set-up consultant. He is a 1991 graduate of the MSU Landscape Architecture Program.



Capitol Area Junior Golf League to Debut

Former MSU assistant golf coach Russ Cunningham and former ALL-CITY MEDAL PLAY champion Bob Matthiesen have announced the formation of a new Capitol Area Junior Golf League. This is a league for younger players in the Lansing area and will pit five-person teams (to be formed by local courses) against one another in a round robin format. Two age divisions have been established, 9 – 11 years old and 12 – 14 years old. "Teams will play a High School match format giving players experience in team competitions, where before, there was not that type of opportunity for the younger players in the Lansing area" Matthiesen said. "this will hopefully lead to strengthening the quality of all area high school teams". League play begins June 22 and runs through August 3. Stableford Tournament

GLAGA will conduct it's Stableford competition July 20-21 at Forest Akers East golf course. This event has been moved from the fall to replace the summer medal play for the 2002 season. The format for Stableford competition rewards aggressive play in what is commonly called a "points for par" system. A player wins or loses points on each hole based on their score for the hole as follows:

Pars = 1 point Bogie = 0 points

Birdies = 3 points Double-bogie = minus 1 point

Eagles = 6 points "Others" (Triple-bogie or worse) = minus 3 points

The format, used on the PGA Tour at the International in Broadmoor Colorado, produces extremely competitive and exciting finishes. Last years GLAGA fall Stableford saw a dog-fight right to the last hole with Gray Tuttle edging Jerry Blake and Rich Diana by a single point. The cost of the tournament is \$85. Entries close on JULY 13. For more information contact tournament director Larry Meirndorf at 676-3076. This is a FUN format. Give it a try!




