

Keim Prevails In 5-Hole Playoff To Claim GLAGA Spring Stroke Play

May 4, 2003

Tony Keim bettered Jonathan Pauli in a 5-hole playoff to claim the GLAGA Spring Stroke Play contested at The Emerald at Maple Creek on May 3 and 4, 2003. Keim, Pauli and 2000 All City Stroke Play champion Bob Matthiesen finished with 4 over par totals of 148.

Pauli nearly ended the playoff on the first extra hole when his 12 footer barely missed. Keim had to convert a 10-foot putt for par to extend the playoff and then missed a birdie of his own from about 8 feet on the second. With Pauli long and left of the green in two on the par five third, Keim pitched his third through the green and chipped poorly to about 12 feet which he holed after Pauli had finished with par. Both bogied the long par three fourth, setting up the final playoff hole.

Pauli had the honor and drove out-of-bounds left. Keim safely found the fairway and wedged to about 30 feet, and Pauli's wedge stop within four feet of the hole. Keim's first putt was bold and ran by about 6 feet and he missed his return putt. Pauli needed his four footer to extend the playoff, but it slid by on the low side.

2003 G.L.A.G.A All-City Match Play Tournament

Sixty-eight Lansing area golfers participated in the qualifying round for the 2003 All-City Match Play tourney. The players were welcomed to Groesbeck Golf Course by the first warm and sunny three-day weekend of the season. Thirty-two golfers qualified for match play competition, which began on Friday afternoon, while twenty-eight non-qualifiers returned Saturday morning for a consolation round. All rounds for the tournament were completed in less than four and a half hours, meeting the tournament committee's pace of play goal.

Gary Domagalski was the qualifying medalist, recovering from a shaky start to post a one over par, 72. Thirty-one players shot 78 or better to qualify for the match play competition. Five players posted a score of 79 and participated in a playoff for

Keim started the day 6 shots out of Pauli's first dayleading two under par 70. "Accurate driving and solid iron play made the difference," noted Keim, a golf stand-out at Olivet College in the late 1990s.

He recorded birdies on the 11th and tough 14th holes and forged into contention with a 10-foot eagle putt on the par five seventeenth. His only bogies came on the first, 7th and 18th holes.

Pauli steadied himself after a disastrous quadruple bogie on the fourth, playing two over par for the remainder of the day on the challenging, wind-blown course. He too, ended his round with a bogie on the short, down wind par four eighteenth.

Matthiesen posted a final round 75 for his 148 total and left the course before Pauli finished in the last group. The playoff started without him when efforts to reach him were unsuccessful

Local high school standouts claimed the next three spots. Josh Orler (Mason) finished fourth at 149 and Haslett's Sean Rutherford and Grant Tungate (East Lansing) tied at 150 along with Jacob Leyrer.

OTHER FLIGHTS

Craig Chambers posted 153 (81, 72) to claim the First Flight championship. Morgan Mason


finished second with rounds of 81 and 74. Paul Nieratko and Steve Martin claimed the next positions at 157 and 158, respectively.

Jeff Harry headed the Second Flight with a final round of 77 and his 163 total bettered runner-ups Dan Leung and MSU professor Rob Britton by four. Jim Rapp and Rob Pumford fourth and fifth with respective two-day totals of 168 and 169.

Sixty-six players competed in GLAGA's initial 2003 event. The first three finishers of each flight were recognized with photographic plaques as mementoes, while the top five finishers received gift certificates. The champions for each flight also received certificates from The Garland Resort which is serving as an event sponsor for each GLAGA tournament this year.

Tournament Director Terry Kildea commended the Golf Professional Staff, Course Superintendent and Grounds Crew of The Emerald for their preparation and service during the competition. "The course was in outstanding condition, with tight fairways and smooth, quick greens,"

commented Kildea. "This course always challenges the competitors and offers hole locations that can rival any of the best courses in the area."

By The Rules

There is golf and there is tournament golf—often the two bear little resemblance. Out with friends you hit "mulligans", drop a ball somewhere near the point where you lost your last one, play from the other side of the water hazard, and scrape any putts inside of three feet. That won't fly when you enter your first GLAGA All-City tourney, nor will it help to be blissfully ignorant of the rules.

A working knowledge of the rules will help you save strokes, put you one up on the field, and increase your enjoyment of this wonderful game. With each newsletter, I will attempt to cover one or two rulings, with my emphasis on tournament play. If you have a rules of golf question, please feel free to e-mail me at: 'tlkildea@aol.com. I probably won't know the correct answer, but I know where to get it. Questions of a general interest to GLAGA members will be featured in future articles.

The Provisional Ball—Rule 27-2: I would like to address this rule because it is the one that I see violated (although unintentionally) most often during GLAGA tournaments.

A provisional ball may be played when the player believes that his original ball may be out of bounds or lost outside of a water hazard. It is a time saving device, but you must be careful, or you run the risk of racking up penalty strokes. Note specifically that you CANNOT play a provisional ball if you believe that your ball may be lost in a water hazard—if you do—you will incur a penalty of stroke and distance, because that ball will become your ball in play under the rules.

The rule requires that you announce to your opponent in match play, or a fellow competitor or your marker in stroke play that you will play a provisional ball and the reason for doing so. It is NOT sufficient under the rule that your action may be obvious to all involved, you must say it. Further, use the word "provisional ball". Do not say, "I'm going to reload" or "That may be out of here, I'm going to hit another." On the tee, it is easy to comply. However, if your match or group is spread across both sides of a hole, you need to get the message out before you proceed. Failure to do so puts that ball in play, your original ball must be abandoned, and you are penalized a stroke plus distance—even if you find your original ball and it is in bounds.

A provisional ball must be played before the player "goes forward after playing the original ball". This is purposefully vague in the rule book. You could walk up to your bag maybe twenty yards to change clubs then return to the original spot, announce, and play a provisional ball. However, you cannot walk 50 yards toward your original ball then decide to return to the original spot to play a provisional. The reason: you have gone forward.

You may continue to play the provisional ball until you reach the point where the original ball is believed to be, but do not play a shot with the provisional past that point. If you do, it becomes the ball in play accompanied by stroke and distance penalties. As an example: the player hooks her tee shot towards the out of bounds stakes just after the big maple tree. She announces that she will play a provisional ball because her original ball may be out of bounds. She tops her next shot and advances the ball less than 50 yards. She is entitled to again play a shot with the provisional ball. Her shot lands in the heart of the fairway well past the big maple tree. She must now check theoriginal ball. If it is in bounds, she abandons the provisional and plays her second shot with the original ball. If it is out of bounds, she will proceed to her provisional ball to play her fifth shot. Strokes played and most penalties incurred in the play of a provisional ball do not count in the player's score if that ball is subsequently abandoned.

Except in one very unique and rare instance (which we will ignore), whenever you find your original ball and it is in bounds, you must abandon the provisional ball. Picture it this way: the instant you find your original (and it is in bounds) your provisional ball VAPORIZES. Avoid the penalty strokes involved here for playing a wrong ball.

Golf is a game of sportsmanship. If during any competition, your opponent or fellow competitor is set to play a provisional ball without announcing, save him or her the penalty with a gentle reminder. This is not "advice" under the rules and it is perfectly acceptable to do so.

Until the next issue, keep it in the fairway, stop and smell the flowers along the way, and play by the rules.

Blake rolled in a 65 foot putt on #17 for birdie to take the lead and held off Mastin with a solid par on the always tough eighteenth. In the other semi-final, Jonathan Pauli (brother of last year's match play runner-up, Brian Pauli) defeated the veteran Domagalski (2 up).

The championship match was a seesaw battle that ended on the seventeenth hole when Pauli made par after birdieing the par five sixteenth. Both players showed the fatigue that is part of this three day marathon. Blake commented on the mental exhaustion that he felt after five tough matches.

Our champion for 2003, Jon Pauli is a sophomore on the Oakland University golf team and a graduate of St. Johns High-School. He was the runner-up in the spring medal play at the Emerald. This summer Jon plans to compete in the Michigan Amateur Championship, the GAM championship, and the GLAGA All-City Medal Championship.
