Gunthorpe and Blake Claim 2004 G.L.A.G.A. All-City Match Play Titles

The 2004 All-City Match Play tournament was contested at Groesbeck Golf Course on June 12th through the 14th. Sixty-eight players teed it up in this increasing popular event on Saturday morning in an eighteen hole stroke play qualifying round.

In the open division, 56 players competed for 32 spots. A score of 78 was needed (along with a playoff victory) to advance to the match play rounds.

Jerry Gunthorpe was the medalist with an exceptional 67 and a sign of things to come.



The Buddy Buster Two-man Team event was the first of its kind for GLAGA. Twenty-seven teams competed on July 10 at Royal Scot Golf Course.

The format was a combination of three 9-hole events. The first 9 holes were played under a traditional Best Ball format where players play their own ball and count the lower score on each hole. The second 9 holes were contested under a slightly modified alternate shot format, where each player hit tee shots and then

GLAGA Tour Championship in 2004 Timber Ridge Golf Course will be the site of GLAGA's season-ending event, The Tour Championship. The Champions (Open and Senior Divisions) will be crowned after the GLAGA Tour Championship to be held September, 11 and 12. This event is a regular members' event, but will feature a "tournament inside a tournament." The entry form is available in this newsletter and on the website at www.glaga.org.

Russ Cunningham holds a slim 200-point lead over Jonathan Pauli in the Open Division. Jerry Blake has amassed an almost insurmountable lead in the Senior Division, with wins in every event of the year. Larry Wuetrich and Stu White are battling for second, with totals of 900 and 850, respectively.

A point that often arises not only in tournament golf but in everyday play is the relief taken when the player has interference caused by *certain conditions* for the stance to be taken or the path of the intended swing. This relief requires that the player establish the *nearest point of relief* and then drop within one club length of that point, no closer to the hole. Before proceeding, let's cover the ground rules: 1) this relief only applies when there will be no penalty stroke(s) involved in the particular situation, 2) this relief is not granted for the line of play or the flight of the ball (that applies only to *temporary immovable obstructions*, such as the tents or grandstands at a tournament), 3) rule 20 will tell you where you cannot drop a ball and what a dropped ball cannot do.

According to the rules of golf definition, the *nearest point of relief* is the single point on the golf course where, if the ball was positioned, there would be no interference from certain conditions for the intended swing or the player's stance from that condition. **The *certain conditions* are: casual water, immovable obstructions, ground under repair, and abnormal ground conditions.** All of these are defined conditions, please see the rules of golf for the definitions.

It is important to note that the relief sometimes MAY NOT give you a swing or a stance from other conditions (high weeds, a tree, etc.). Don't pick up your ball until you are certain that you will want to play from the place the rules take you to. Sometimes, putting off the cart path is preferable to a limited swing in a patch of tall nettles or worse yet, dropping into an unplayable lie. It is also important to

remember that in a given situation, there is ONLY ONE *nearest point of relief* on the golf course. Also, that *nearest point of relief* will be a different point for a lefty than it would be for a right-handed player.

Now let's take that drop. The rules state that the player should select the club that would most likely be used if the *certain condition* did not exist. Take your stance at the nearest place where there is no interference and set up for the shot. Place a tee at the point where you clubhead touches the ground. Now check other places away from the *certain condition* to make sure that there is not another point where you clubhead touches the ground that is nearer to where your ball lies. Once you and your fellow competitor or opponent are comfortable that you have selected the *nearest point* you may proceed. You now may select any club from your bag and measure one club length in any direction that is not closer to the hole from the point where you had placed the tee. Drop the ball within this area. Make sure before you play, that you have taken complete relief (your heel can't touch the cart path, no casual water visible after the stance, foot not touching the ground under white line, etc). If needed, drop again, or you will be penalized for playing from a wrong place.

I realize that the above may be confusing. Sometimes these points are not easy to put into words without a demonstration. If you have questions, e-mail them to me at tkildea@aol.com. I hope to see you at the All-City stroke play tournament. Keep smiling and don't forget to stop and smell the flowers along the way.

choose which ball would be played as alternate shot until the ball was holed. The closing 9 holes were contested under combined total scores of the team, and this format had the largest impact, by combining 9 hole medal scores. The combination of formats resulted in a 72-hole team score.

After the first nine holes the team of Bob Matthiesen and Tom Allen posted a 4 under par 33 to lead Russ Cunningham and Smith Patterson by one stroke. In alternate shot Dave Seehase and Randy Mastin climbed back into contention with a 3 under par 32 and posted a 69 after 18 holes. Cunningham/Patterson and Matthiesen/Allen were tied for the lead at 67.

The last 9 holes proved the true meaning for the event—Buddy Buster or Not. The team of Nick Hurst and Charlie Green posted an even par 72 for the combined medal and was at 144 for the day. Dave Lee and Paul Hughes also carded even par for the closing nine and posted a 146 for the day. Cunningham/Patterson and Seehase/Mastin let it get away by both firing 78's and tournament totals of 145 and 146, respectively. Matthiesen/Allen kept it together and shot 1 over 73 on the final 9 holes and won the event by four strokes with a 4 under total of 140.

In the Senior Division Jerry Blake maintained his strangle hold the Tour Championship Series points lead by winning the event with partner Larry Wuetrich. Blake/Wuetrich's total of 150

was good for a one-stroke margin over the team of Stu White and Steve Martin. The difference came in the first 9 hole best ball where Blake/Wuetrich fired a 1 under 36 and White/Martin carding an even par 37.

All and all the weather and the golf were great. We extend our thanks to Dave Greely and the staff at Royal Scot for hosting the event.


