

All three recipients of this year's Greater Lansing Amateur Golf Association's Mary Jo Tomac Scholarship are thankful not only for the opportunity to excel at one of sport's greatest games, but also for the life lessons learned along the way.

Lansing Christian graduate Jay Noyola – now a freshman at Calvin College – admittedly needed a primer in how to

maintain his patience while perfecting the game once described as "a young man's vice and an old man's penance."

"I have learned to forget about the last shot, or hole, and be patient with my game," Noyola said. "My game is never

> perfect but is has become my passion. It's also a game that I can play with my dad (and Uncle Karl) and connect through a sport we all love."

> The senior class valedictorian (4.0 GPA) at Lansing Christian, Noyola – the son of Frank and Kandice Noyola – was an all-league golfer his first three years and qualified for the state finals as a senior. He was twice named all-state in soccer and was a three-year starter on the varsity basketball team

Janie Fineis found her "freedom" on the golf course: the freedom to work hard, set high goals and achieve excellence. As in three consecutive MHSAA Division 4 state championships as a

member of the golf team at Lansing Catholic.

"We had a lot of talent on our team," said Janie, a freshman walk-on at Notre Dame and the daughter of Jeff and Mary Fineis. "The reason we were successful is because we were all willing to work hard and learn from each other."

Fineis lettered in basketball and softball, and earned all-conference, all-region and all-state golf accolades in both her junior and senior seasons under coach Mary Schafer. She was a member of the National Honor Society and received the Capital Area Activities Conference Academic and Detroit Free Press Scholar Athlete awards.

Lauren Van Streain started playing competitively as a freshman at Williamston High School. By the time her senior season rolled around, she had worked her way up to captain, earned most valuable player honors and helped the girls golf program become a fully funded varsity sport.


"Not only did the school board members get to know me as a student, but they also knew me as a golfer," Van Streain said. "I learned that big decisions such as this take time, input and discussion."

In addition to golf, Van Streain also competed in basketball and track and field. She was student council vice president all four years, chaired the Homecoming and Prom committee, participated in National Honor Society and Peer Assistant Leadership – and maintained a 4.0 grade point average.

Van Streain - the daughter of Fred and Kathy Van Streain - is now a freshman at Berry College in Mount Berry, Ga., and is studying animal science in order to gain admission to veterinary school. Earlier this month she competed in the Coosa Invitational at Rome, Ga., in which the host Vikings finished sixth in an 11-team field.

TWICE AS NICE – CASTELLANI JOINS THE RANKS OF TWO-TIME CHAMPIONS

Two-time defending All-City champion Carson Castellani has been a model of tournament consistency over these past two events: six rounds of tournament play all under par.

His nine-stroke victory over Matt Benson in the 2013 tournament wasn't as easy as the final score may have indicated, but birdies on two of the last three holes at Eagle Eye made the reigning king breathe a little easier.

Especially after some up-and-down scrambling earlier in the final round.

"Winning the second time was definitely a harder test for me mentally," said Castellani, who needed only 11 putts on the back nine of the final round. "When I opened up a pretty big lead going into the back nine at Eagle Eye, I found it difficult to fight my thoughts from wandering to the fact that I should win.

"Playing the final round at Eagle Eye this past year was a better test and probably an advantage for me. I putted well throughout the tournament, especially from long range, which is always a part of my game that gives me trouble."

Castellani, who also won the 2013 Spring Medal by six shots over Dale Choma and was runner-up at the Match Play Championship to Trevor Rosekrans, finished his three-day All-City run at 204 – nine shots better than runner-up Matt Benson. Chris Beltzer was third at 215, followed by Blake English at 216 while Reid Dean and Nick Hurst tied at 218.

Castellani led Benson by three shots heading into the final round at Eagle Eye. His best round of the tournament was a second-day 64 at Forest Akers East.

"I'm a competitive person," Castellani, a senior at Michigan State and a member of the Spartan men's golf team, told the *Lansing State Journal*. "I like winning by as much as possible."

Eric Cowles, who won All-City titles in 2001 and '02, is the last player to win in consecutive years. Bobby Fossum, Gary Domalgaski, Bob Mase and Jack Pitts won the tournament three times while Bud Reniger holds the record with five titles.

Jerry Blake (225) won his second straight Senior Championship by one stroke over Randy Mastin. Roger Kuhl (227), Pat Crilley (228) and Larry Wuetrich (229) completed the top five.

All-City flight winners were: First, Zach Dowling (228); Second, Frank Comito (234); Third, Reid Boucher (238); Fourth, Karl Bohnhoff (245); Fifth, Kevin Schafer (255); Senior First, Doug Schobert (247); Senior Second, Scott Horrocks (255); and Women, Casey Harkema (259).
