

Fossum Scholarship rewards seven high school student-athletes

Seven high school seniors from the Lansing area comprised the 2015 class of Bruce Fossum Collegiate Scholarship honorees, and to a person each has expressed sincere thanks and gratefulness for being chosen to receive an award named after the legendary Michigan State men's golf coach who, by the way, published a book about the game in 1989 entitled, "Golf made easier ... not easy."

The last chapter of Bruce's book contained a glossary of thoughts on the game he labeled "Fossumology 101". A quick sample included these nuggets:

- *Each time you play, try to enjoy the swing you have that day, the people you are playing with, and the beauty of the golf course.*
- *The more you hit, the better you git!*
- *Lag the long putts and the very difficult short ones; you might get lucky.*
- *Try this to music: You ain't got a thing unless you got that swing.*
- *Good luck happens when preparation meets opportunity.*

Each of the seven recipients prepared throughout their high school careers to be in a position to receive the scholarship, which is open to any senior in high school in good standing with at least a 3.0 grade point average. The applicants should have either participated in high school golf, been a part of a junior golf program or be the child of an active Greater Lansing Amateur Golf Association member.

Here is a snapshot of four of the seven high school seniors from the Class of 2015 who were awarded \$500 scholarships each during last summer's All City Championship at Forest Akers Golf Course:

McKenna Cunningham (DeWitt HS/Grand Valley State University): The daughter of former GLAGA president Russ Cunningham, McKenna played two years of varsity golf at DeWitt. The Panthers qualified for the state finals her junior year and as a senior she played in every varsity match and was the team's top player. She finished fifth individually at the league meet, which the Panthers won by one stroke.

McKenna completed her four years at DeWitt High School with a 3.958 grade point average. She is studying to be a nurse at Grand Valley.

"My most memorable moment first semester would be the first week when I was meeting everyone and the feeling of accomplishment when I got my grades back from the semester,"

she said in a recent email. "I used the scholarship money towards my books and I was for sure glad I did that as they helped me out a lot last semester. The second semester is also going very well, my grades are high and each day I get one step closer to becoming a nurse. Again thank you very much!"

Madison Nodus-Rydahl (Mason HS/Michigan State University): A leader on and off the course according to her nominators, Madison made the most of her childhood by learning the game of golf from her grandfather, a PGA professional who previously co-managed Eldorado Golf Course. Madison played four years of varsity golf at Mason and was elected team captain as a senior.

Madison volunteered for three years at the Eldorado Youth Camp and also spent time at Mason Middle School to help encourage students there to participate in golf when they reached high school.

Madison completed her four years at Mason with a 3.967 grade point average.

"My first semester of college went very well, I am happy to report that I made the Dean's List," she said in a recent email. "I am currently working toward my bachelor's degree in Packaging.

"Even though I am not a member of the women's golf team at MSU, but I find the life lessons learned from playing golf in high school have been of great value to me during my freshman year of college. The leadership and determination skills I learned from the sport have helped me in navigating some challenging college classes. I try to get out on the golf course whenever I can, whether it be subbing in a local golf league or just a fun round with my family. The sport of golf will always be a valuable resource for me throughout my life.

"I was honored to be selected to receive the Bruce Fossum Scholarship award. It has helped greatly in purchasing my course materials and books. The Bruce Fossum Scholarship is a great award to honor high school students on their accomplishments on the golf course and in the classroom."

Michelle Ried (Holt HS/Aquinas College): A three-year varsity letter winner in golf, Michelle played on a state qualifier during her sophomore and junior years at Holt High School. She also played two years of varsity basketball and four years of soccer. Her golf coach at Holt, Doug Harkema, recommended Michelle for the scholarship because "she is a leader and does a wonderful job setting an example of hard work and dedication. She represents herself and Holt Public Schools in a way that makes all of us proud."

Michelle graduated from Holt High School with a 3.827 grade point average and is pursuing an English with Writing Emphasis major at Aquinas. She hopes to minor in Spanish and Photography.

"I joined the Aquinas College Programming Board which involves helping to host campus events. I also like being close to downtown Grand Rapids. I attended Art Prize in the fall and met many new people.

"I am not a member of the golf team but I did join the women's lacrosse team which has been a great experience and is something else I would consider a highlight of my first and now second semester.

"I greatly appreciate having been chosen to receive the Bruce Fossum Scholarship. Participating in high school athletics is something I am glad I was able to do. Golf allowed me to meet new people and do something I enjoyed while also attending school. I hope that many others were able to get as much enjoyment out of the sport as I was. I think that this scholarship shows people and helps them realize that doing something they love while also working towards earning their diploma is worth it."

Owen Beyer (DeWitt HS/Northern Michigan University): A two-time All State selection and captain of the 2015 Division 2 state champion, Owen finished third overall at last year's state tournament. He completed his four-year varsity career by being named the Lansing State Journal player of the year. A three-year employee at Forest Akers as well having spent a year caddying at the Country Club of Lansing, Owen hopes to pursue a career in golf course management at Northern Michigan University.

"I knew Bruce Fossum for many years and was proud to call him my friend," said Larry Owen, who nominated Owen Beyer for the scholarship. "Owen Beyer is a disciplined student who does very well in the classroom. Most important, he cares greatly about others and his community."

Owen is currently a member of the men's golf team at Northern Michigan. Earlier this month he tied for 34th overall at the 25-team Great Lakes Midwest Regional III event at the Elks Run Golf Club in Batavia, Ohio. He tied for 19th (76-81) at the Battle of the Beach at the TPC of Myrtle Beach, S.C., on March 4-5, and tied for 50th at the GLIAC South Invitational Andover Golf and Country Club in Lexington, Ky., on March 25-26.

Ross Lazar (Okemos HS/Michigan State University): A four-time first team selection in the competitive CAAC Blue division and a four-time Division 1 all area selection, Ross had a very successful golf career at Okemos. He was an individual state qualifier in 2013 and a year later tied for fourth with a 73 at the Division 1 regional at Eldorado.

Ross earned all academic honors in golf from 2012 through 2015 and completed his high school classwork with a 3.75 grade point average.

His varsity coach, Dan Stolz, described Ross as "one of the classiest student-athletes I have ever had the pleasure of working with. He is sensitive, humble, well mannered, hard-working and takes pride in everything he does."

Ross was a varsity captain his senior year and also volunteered with the First Tee program, in addition to being a trumpet section leader in the school band.

"He is an extremely bright young man with a great sense of humor," Stolz said. "His ability to relate to many types of people will serve him well throughout his life."

Noah Wolfe (Okemos HS/University of Michigan): A two-year varsity letter winner in golf, Noah impressed head coach Dan Stolz with his leadership and team spirit by consistently encouraging the younger players on the team.

"Noah modeled how to practice and how to approach a round of golf with a routine and focus," Stolz said. "He never gave up on his team or himself, and he would continue to grind through even the toughest of days – a real competitor."

An accomplished musician, Noah earned a spot in the prestigious Symphonic Wind Ensemble at Okemos and was selected by his peers to be a section leader during marching season his junior and senior years. He was also invited to play in the in the Philharmonic Orchestra his junior and senior years.

Noah was named most improved player on the golf team his junior year. He's worked at both Walnut Hills and Forest Akers, took nine AP classes and earned his high school diploma with a 3.86 grade point average. On top of that, he scored 33 on the ACT.

"The first semester at UM was fairly challenging for me but overall very rewarding. I particularly enjoyed both my physics course (Mechanics and Sound) and my Engineering 100 course (design in the real world)," Noah said. "My favorite moment from this first semester was either going to the Michigan-Michigan State game in the Big House (I was a Spartan fan from birth) or winning my second round IM flag football game on a Hail Mary pass in the closing seconds.

"When I found out I was a recipient of the Bruce Fossum Scholarship last spring, I was extremely grateful. I could not think of a better way to close out four amazing years of high school golf at Okemos under Coach Dan Stolz. Although I knew I would not continue to play the game at a higher level in college, receiving the scholarship for the effort I put in – on and off the course – still meant a great deal to me."

Mastin works overtime to win three straight;

Matt Benson captures his first All City Championship

The early portion of last year's Greater Lansing Amateur Golf Association tournament schedule could have been summed up in two words: Randy Mastin. The soft-spoken senior stalwart was at the very top of his game in winning the Spring Medal at The Emerald, Jersey Giant All City Match Play at Groesbeck and the Rehmann Team Match Play at Hawk Hollow and Eagle Eye.

- For those who were there to witness it, Mastin's trifecta was no easy feat:
- He defeated Mike Raymond in a playoff at the Spring Medal;
 - He was 4-up on Scott Savage with four holes to play at Groesbeck, lost that lead but then won the playoff on the 19th hole – on a day that started unusually cold and rainy in the morning before giving way to a strong north wind in the afternoon;
 - He then paired with Larry Meirndorf to win the Team Match Play championship at Eagle Eye while battling a sore back that made some shots very difficult to execute.

Mastin, typically very humble in victory, let his work on the course do the talking.

"His victory in the All City Match Play was vintage Randy," said Meirndorf. "A lot of guys would have packed it in after losing a lead like that. But Randy put it all behind him and focused on winning the playoff."

While Mastin was busy atop the senior class, Nate Clark put the finishing touch on the Spring Medal Open title, edging runner-up Bob Matthesen by one shot. In the Open championship of the All City Match Play, Spencer Fisher defeated Jacob Johnson 5 and 3.

One of the most interesting victories of the 2015 GLAGA season occurred in mid-July in the first flight of the Rehmann Team Match Play. Tim Hovey and Mark Stein played 80 holes over two days and capped off their second straight title in this event by winning a five-hole playoff over Jerad Masse and John Magalski.

It was the third playoff victory of the day for Hovey and Stein, who started early Sunday at Hawk Hollow with a 1-hole playoff win over Travis Liedke and Jeremy Davis (in a continuation of a match that was postponed by Saturday evening weather), and then headed down the road to Eagle Eye for a 20-hole semifinal win over Marc Protske and Patrick Wong.

In August, Matt Benson won his first All City Championship in a one-hole playoff over Nick Hurst at wind-swept Eagle Eye while Jim Hegarty captured the All City Senior title by two strokes over runner-up Gray Tuttle.

A few changes in store this season: With two of Groesbeck's holes (Nos. 6 & 7) undergoing reconfiguration this summer, the GLAGA board voted to move the Jersey Giant All City Match Play event to College Fields on the weekend of June 11-12. All three rounds of the All City Championship, meanwhile, will be contested at Forest Akers over the weekend of Aug. 5-7.

The Rehmann Team Match Play remains in its familiar mid-July position (July 16-17), the Buddy Buster will be contested Aug. 28 (a week prior to Labor Day weekend) and the season finale, the Woodside 24, will close the GLAGA campaign on Oct. 2.

EAST LANSING -- Forty-four holes later, the ironmen team of Tim Hovey and Mark Stein had plenty to smile about in the early evening of Sunday, July 19, at Eagle Eye Golf Club.

Hovey and Stein had just won a five-hole playoff over Jerad Masse and John Magalski to capture the first flight title of the two-day Rehmann Team Match Play event. All total, Hovey and Stein played 80 holes over the weekend – which had started at 8 a.m. Saturday with an 18-hole best ball round at Hawk Hollow.

“Wow, now that was fun,” Hovey said, while breathing a sigh of relief. “They made us earn it, didn’t they?”

It was the third playoff victory of the day for Hovey and Stein, who started their day at Hawk with a 1-hole playoff win over Travis Liedke and Jeremy Davis (in a continuation of a match that was postponed by Saturday evening weather), and then followed up at Eagle Eye with a 20-hole semifinal win over Marc Protske and Patrick Wong.

Meanwhile, the senior tandem of Randy Mastin and Larry Meirndorf proved their mettle by defeating Garrett Dickinson and Tony Fuentes 1-up for the Championship division title.

Meirndorf’s up-and-down from the back of the green at 18 sealed the team’s second victory of the day. In the semifinals, Mastin and Meirndorf defeated Kevin Voke and Jim Rowe, 4 and 3.

Mastin – despite playing with a sore back in the finals – continued his impressive run through the 2015 GLAGA

season. Earlier this year he won the Senior championship at the Spring Medal (Emerald) as well as the Senior championship of the All City Match Play (Groesbeck).

“It wasn’t easy but we got it done,” Mastin said. “Larry made some big shots for along the way.”




