KNOW WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF AN OPIOID OVERDOSE/POISONING

WHAT IS AN OPIOID OVERDOSE/POISONING?

An opioid overdose or poisoning is a medical emergency and can cause an individual to become unconscious and stop breathing.

KNOW THE SIGNS!

If an individual is experiencing an overdose or poisoning, they will exhibit the following signs:

- not feeling well
- confused, disoriented, or unresponsive
- slowed or shallow breathing

- snoring or gurgling sounds
- little to no pulse
- blue/gray fingertips or lips

TAKE ACTION!

- ✓ Call 9-1-1 immediately DO NOT WAIT!
- Administer Narcan by gently inserting the nozzle into the nostril and pressing the plunger firmly
- ✓ After 2 minutes, if still unresponsive, give the individual a repeat dose of the Narcan
- Roll the individual on their side, place their knee in front of them, and rest their head on their hands
- ✓ If the individual is not breathing, practice rescue breathing or CPR
- Stay until help arrives

CARRY NARCAN

Narcan is widely available in Wisconsin. It can be purchased without a prescription at hundreds of pharmacies.

It's safe to administer Narcan even if an individual is not experiencing an overdose or poisoning - it won't hurt them!

Narcan is not a substitute for emergency care; it is critical to seek professional medical help even after Narcan is administered. Repeated

doses are often necessary to keep individual breathing.



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
