

Dear Fellow Lions,

In 1959, a group of dedicated Lions, led by Leonard Jarrett, came together with a shared vision—to ensure that every West Virginian, regardless of their financial situation, had access to the vision care they needed. That vision became the West Virginia Lions Sight Conservation Foundation (WVLSCF).

Over the years, we have made incredible strides, partnering with the West Virginia Eye Bank and WVU Eye Institute to bring life-changing support to those struggling with vision loss. Through our efforts, we have been able to bring eye care directly to communities across the state. Our mobile screening units have traveled far and wide, allowing us to reach individuals who may not have access to routine eye care. Today, our capabilities have expanded even further. We now have screening equipment that allows us to assess vision in infants as young as three months old.

Recently, we have also invested in new tonometers, visual acuity screeners, and spot machines to enhance early detection and intervention, ensuring that more West Virginians receive the care they need before small problems become big ones. One of our proudest accomplishments has been assisting a child from New Martinsville with vision therapy. This crucial intervention has helped the child navigate daily life with greater ease and independence, proving just how transformative early vision care can be. By addressing these challenges at a young age, we are opening doors to a brighter future for those affected by vision impairments.

In addition to providing individualized therapy, **your** Foundation has been instrumental in supplying low-vision devices to individuals who struggle with sight-related challenges. These devices, ranging from simple magnifiers to specialized electronic aids, give people the tools they need to maintain their independence and improve their overall quality of life. A small piece of technology can make an enormous difference in someone's ability to read, work, or complete everyday tasks that many of us take for granted.

We are also proud to have played a role in the expansion of the WVU Eye Institute. Our Foundation has contributed essential resources to help equip the new facility, ensuring that advanced eye care remains accessible to those who need it most. By supporting institutions that share our mission, we are creating a lasting impact for generations to come.

The WV Lions Sight Conservation Foundation has a long and proud history of service. Many dedicated Lions have played a role in making it what it is today, and because of their efforts, the Foundation remains financially strong and capable of continuing its work. But what about the future?

We survived COVID and today have an excellent group of Trustees guiding the foundation, but the truth is, we cannot do this alone. The future of WVLSCF depends on more than just a handful of officers and trustees—it depends on individual Lions like you who are willing to step up and serve. If we are to continue this important work, we need Sight Coordinators, Liaison committee members, long-range planners, and portable equipment coordinators. These roles are crucial to the success of our mission, and we simply cannot move forward without Lions willing to take them on.

If you have ever wanted to make a real impact, this is your moment. I invite you to join us at 2:00 PM on Friday at the State Convention for our next meeting, followed by a training session for these important positions. All Lions are welcome! Whether you are just curious or ready to jump in, I would love to see you there! Together, we can ensure that WVLSCF continues its mission for generations to come.

District Breakfasts

Each district will have a breakfast meeting on Sunday morning at which time district elections will be held. The cost of each breakfast will be \$18.30 inclusive and will consist of scrambled eggs, bacon, breakfast potatoes, biscuits, and coffee, orange juice, hot tea, or water. Each district will have the same meal. If you plan to eat breakfast, you will need to make arrangements for tickets through your district cabinet/secretary or district governor. The cost of breakfast is not part of the multiple district convention registration fee.

Silent Auction

Delegate Cards

Each district secretary will soon be receiving delegate and alternate delegate cards from Multiple District Secretary-Treasurer Cindy Glass for each club in the district. All voting at any multiple district convention or district convention must be by certified delegates. It is the responsibility of each Lion who is a delegate representing their club to have their delegate card validated by the district secretary or district governor prior to voting. If you are a club delegate, please remember to bring your delegate card with you AND make sure that you have it validated prior to the time of voting.

Attire for the Weekend

Attire for the weekend is casual or business casual. We want attendees to be relaxed and informal. Lions' shirts and vests are encouraged if that is what makes you feel comfortable.
