





Nextrex Recycling Challenge Program

Did you know that most plastic store bags and packaging film is not recyclable through curbside recycling programs or at conventional recycling stations? The plastic is very thin and easily gets caught in the machines that sort other recyclables such as paper, cans and bottles. Trex is the largest recycler of PE film in the United States and has a program where organizations can collect plastic bags and packaging films and receive a bench in return.

The requirements are:

- Register online at Nextrex.com by clicking on "Recycling Challenge Program".
- Choose a 12 month time frame to do your collection
- Collect a minimum of 1000 lbs. of plastic
- Weigh, record and attach photos to their website
- Deliver the plastic at your local retail partner (Kohl's, Kroger, Giant Eagle, Food Lion, Martins, Weis or Giant)

- 2. Call a local college and offer a free year's internship as the marketing director for your Club. Business, marketing and many other majors are always looking for internships to help them gain contacts and get experience.

3. Partner with another Lions Club! Look on e-clubhouse sites or social media to get marketing ideas. Usually clubs who aren't local will be happy to share ideas. Don't reinvent the wheel and always ask permission first.
