WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT...

SCHOOL COMPLAINTS ABOUT DISABILITY DISCRIMINATION

Follow a **school's complaints procedure** first if you believe they have been **discriminatory** against a **disability** .

If this does not solve the problem, you may be able to complain to the Special Educational Needs & Disability (SEND) tribunal.

You must complain within 6 months of the discrimination

You can **include events** that happened **over 6 months** ago, as long as they **directly relate** to events in the **last 6 months**.

Parents can complain on behalf of a child using Form SEND4A

Once your **complaint** is **registered**, you & the school will be asked if the **complaint** can be **decided without** a **hearing**.

If you do not agree, the tribunal will send you a letter telling you if they'll hold a hearing, & when & where it'll take place.
