Clarke Park will remain closed until this ancillary work is completed. It is hoped that this work can be completed during the month of August. With the park remaining closed, there will be no open house tours of the Clarke House this month.

Upcoming Events

Although we are deep into the hot, humid, dog days of August we can take solace that we are

now less than two months away from October and beautiful fall weather. This October, the Society will participate in the Town of Orange Park's Fall Festival, which will be held Saturday, October 16 and Sunday, October 17 at Town Hall Park. This festival draws thousands of visitors each year with its mix of food, entertainment, activities and crafts. It is a big event in the life of our town. The Society will be hosting a booth at the festival and volunteers will be needed to share information about the history of Orange Park and our Society. Veterans Day Ceremony 2021

The Historical Society of Orange Park would like to extend an invitation for you to join us for this year's Veterans Day Ceremony to be held at the Orange Park Veterans Memorial on November 11, 2021, at 11am. The Veterans Memorial is located just inside the gates of Magnolia Cemetery which is directly across from Clarke Park/Clarke House on Kingsley Avenue.

This year's ceremony is significant for several reasons. First, it will be exactly 10 years since the Groundbreaking Ceremony was held on November 11, 2011. Secondly, it will be the first full live ceremony to be held since 2019 as last year's live event was replaced by a streaming video due to the Covid-19 Pandemic. Most importantly, however, this ceremony is significant because it honors the Veteran. November 11th is a National Holiday and the day set aside each year to honor and thank the veterans of all the Armed Forces for their service.

This year's ceremony promises to be well attended so although there will be some limited seating available, it is recommended that you bring a folding chair. We will do our best to accommodate anyone with mobility issues. Parking for the ceremony will be at the First Baptist Church of Orange Park at 1140 Kingsley Avenue. The ceremony will begin promptly at 11 AM. At the conclusion of the ceremony all participants and guests are invited to join us at the historic Clarke House for light refreshments.

Veterans Memorial Engraved Pavers

As most of you know, one of the features of the Veterans Memorial at Magnolia Cemetery is the ability to honor a veteran with an engraved paver. Each year, orders are collected, and the new pavers are installed prior to Veterans Day. The process of paver procurement, engraving and installation can take several weeks. If you have been considering honoring a veteran with an engraved paver, please do so no later than September 1 to be included in this year's installation. Calling all Young Writers! Honor our Veterans!

The Historical Society of Orange Park, in recognition of Veterans Day, will, once again, sponsor an essay contest for students in Clay County. The purpose of the contest is to give young people the opportunity to explain the importance of celebrating veterans and Veterans Day. Students, using their own words and creativity, are invited to tell a personal story about how veterans have made an impact in their life, neighborhood, or town.

This year, instead of having three different topics for the contest, one winner will be chosen in each of the 3 grade levels (Elementary, Middle and High School) that addresses the topic: <u>Why</u> <u>Do We Honor Veterans?</u> Students should research Veterans Day and speak with veterans and family members about what our military veterans have done that deserves recognition.

Required paperwork for the contest will be made available on the website of the Historical Society of Orange Park, <u>ophistory.org</u> Odds of winning will be determined by the number of entries received. Essays will be measured for: Expression of the theme (50%) Content of writing (25%) and Creativity of writing (25%). Judges will be members of the Historical Society of Orange Park. The contest is divided into the following categories:

Faye also loved to share stories about local history. She contributed many articles to our newsletter often highlighting people that made significant contributions to our community but had been forgotten in the passage of time. She also prepared a history of the Orange Park Woman's Club. Faye was always generous with her time in volunteering for Society events and was always willing to share the fruits of her research with others. She reminded us that we all have a role to play and something to contribute to our community.


