- **I.** <u>Contest Label Form and Publicity Release Form:</u> All entries must be accompanied by a fully completed "Publicity Release Form." One overall contest label form should be completed for each school submitting bulk entries.
- II. <u>Contest Theme</u>: The theme for the Essay Contest reflects the importance of celebrating veterans and Veterans Day. Each Essay Contest student, using their own words and creativity, will tell a personal story about how veterans have made an impact in their life, neighborhood, or town. Essays should clearly address the prompt. Interviewing family veterans is encouraged.
- **III. Contest Deadline:** All essay entries must be received by September 30, 2022. Winners will be notified by October 28, 2022. Entries not meeting deadlines will be disqualified.
- **IV.** <u>Contest Grade Categories and Topics</u>: The 2022 topic for all three grade level competitions. The contests will be evaluated in the following grade-related categories:

Grade Level	Word Limits:	Prize Offered	<u>Prompt</u>
4th -6th	300-500	\$50	Why are veterans special?
7th –8th	400-700	\$75	Write about an American who served in the United States military who inspires you.
9th -12th	500-1000	\$100	Why are the words "Duty, Honor, Country" important today?

- V. <u>Essay Specifications</u>: Essay entries can be electronically written (Word or Docs) or handwritten neatly on white 8½" X 11" lined paper and must be in English. Please have students write on <u>one side of the paper</u> only. Hand-writing on entries should be dark enough to be reproduced so that the judges will have a good copy to read. <u>Please use ink</u>, not pencil. All essays must be the work of only one (1) student, consisting of the student's own words, thoughts, and creativity. Electronic submissions are accepted. Teachers may choose to scan all their entries per school to submit as one PDF. Note: Upon submission, all essays become property of the Society.
- **VI. Eligibility:** The contest is open to students in Grades 4-12 who are enrolled in public and private schools and home-schooled students living in Clay County.
- **VII.** <u>Judging</u>: The decision of the adjudication panel is final. Each essay will be judged by rubric: Understanding of prompt (50%), Content of writing (25%) Creativity of writing (25%).
- **VIII.** <u>Awards</u>: Two student finalists from each of the three grade categories will be awarded a certificate of merit. The winning student from each grade category will be presented with a special plaque and a check during the town's annual live Veterans Day event.

Students winning in each first-place grade level will be asked to read their essays as part of the town's Veterans Day ceremony at the Magnolia Cemetery's Veterans Memorial, 1040 Kingsley Avenue, Orange Park, 11/11/2022, arriving by 10:45 AM for the ceremony which starts at 11 AM.
