I. Contest Label Form and Publicity Release Form: All entries must be accompanied by a fully completed "Publicity Release Form." One overall contest label form should be completed for each school sending bulk entries.

II. Contest Theme: Veterans and Veterans Day. Each Essay Contest student, using his or her own words and creativity, will tell a personal story about how veterans have made an impact in their life, neighborhood, or town. They should clearly address the prompt.

III. Contest Deadline: All essay entries must be received by September 30, 2024. Winners will be notified by October 30, 2024. Entries not meeting deadlines will be disqualified.

IV. Contest Grade Categories and Topics The contests will be evaluated in the following grade-related categories, each with the word limit, prize offered and specific prompts for their category:

<u>Grade</u>	<u>Word Limits</u>	<u>Topic: (Title of Essay)</u>	<u>Prize Offered</u>
4 th -6 th	300 - 500	<i>Why do we celebrate Veterans Day?</i>	\$50
7 th -8 th	400 - 700	<i>A US veteran who inspires me.</i>	\$75
9 th -12 th	500 - 1,000	<i>How veterans demonstrate "Duty, Honor, Country" throughout their lives.</i>	\$100

V. Essay Specifications: Essay entries can be electronically written (Word or Docs) or handwritten neatly on white 8½" X 11" lined paper and must be in English. Please have students write on one side of the paper only. Handwriting on entries should be dark enough to be reproduced so that the judges will have a good copy to read. Please use ink, not pencil. All essays must be the work of only one (1) student, consisting of the student's own words, thoughts, and creativity. Electronic submissions are accepted. Teachers may choose to scan all their entries per school to submit as one PDF. Note: Upon submission, all essays become the property of the Historical Society.

VI. Eligibility: The contest is open to students in Grades 4-12, enrolled in public or private schools or home-schooled, living in Clay County, Florida.

VII. Judging: The decision of the adjudication panel is final. Each essay will be judged by rubric: Understanding of the prompt (50%), Content of writing (25%) Creativity of writing (25%).

VIII. Awards: Two student finalists from each of the three grade categories will be awarded a certificate of merit. The winning student from each grade category will be presented with a special plaque and a check during the town's annual live Veterans Day event.

Students winning in each first-place grade level will be asked to read their essays as part of the town's Veterans Day ceremony at the Magnolia Cemetery's Veterans Memorial, 1040 Kingsley Avenue, Orange Park, 11/11/2024, arriving by 10:45 AM for the ceremony which starts at 11 AM.

The submissions will not be returned.
