Policies & Procedures

Institutional Status & Legal Exemption



Unity Christian University is a **private**, **faith-based theological institution** that exists to train and equip men and women for Christian ministry.

Unity Christian University is **not under the control, governance, or oversight** of the **United States Department of Education** or the **Florida Department of Education**. The University operates solely under the authority provided by:

• Florida Statute 1005.06(1)(f) – which grants an exemption from licensure and jurisdiction by the Commission for Independent Education for institutions that are religious in nature and that offer only programs of a religious or theological nature.

Because of this statutory exemption:

- Unity Christian University is not required to seek approval or accreditation from state or federal educational agencies.
- Degrees and diplomas issued by Unity Christian University are ecclesiastical in nature, intended for religious, theological, and ministry purposes.
- Enrollment at Unity Christian University is a **privilege of association with a private**Christian institution, not a right guaranteed by state or federal educational laws.

By applying to Unity Christian University, all students and applicants acknowledge and accept that:

- The University is independently governed by its Board of Directors.
- Academic programs, policies, and requirements are established internally and are not subject to external regulation by the State of Florida or the U.S. Department of Education.
- Any recognition of credits, transferability, or use of degrees outside of ministerial or theological contexts is at the sole discretion of other institutions, employers, or agencies.

1. Doctrinal Alignment

All students must agree with and uphold the University's Statement of Faith.

 Persistent disagreement with or opposition to the University's doctrinal positions is grounds for dismissal.

2. Tuition & Fees

- Tuition and fees must be paid according to the University's published schedule.
- Failure to pay tuition/fees may result in suspension or termination of enrollment.
- Tuition and fees are **non-refundable** in cases of dismissal for conduct, academic dishonesty, or loss of pastoral endorsement.

3. Attendance & Participation

- Regular attendance in courses (on-campus or online) is expected.
- Excessive absences, lack of participation, or failure to meet course requirements may result in dismissal.

4. Technology & Communication

- Students must maintain reliable access to email and the University's learning platforms.
- Failure to regularly check and respond to official University communications may affect enrollment status.

5. Confidentiality & Respect

- Students must respect the confidentiality of classroom discussions, ministryrelated information, and the privacy of faculty and peers.
- Harassment, disrespect, or disruptive behavior will not be tolerated.

6. Drug, Alcohol, and Moral Standards Policy

- The use of illegal drugs, abuse of alcohol, or immoral behavior (as defined by Scripture and the University's code of conduct) is strictly prohibited.
- Violations may result in immediate termination of enrollment.

7. Academic Progress

- Students must maintain satisfactory academic progress as defined by University standards.
- Failure to maintain required GPA or completion rates may result in probation or dismissal.

8. Appeals (Optional)

- While the Board's decision is final, you may consider including a limited internal appeal process for non-disciplinary matters (e.g., tuition hardship, transfer of credits).
- This gives fairness but still preserves University authority.

9. Transfer of Credits

- Transfer of credits from other institutions is subject to University approval.
- Only credits from institutions deemed acceptable by the University Board will be considered.
- The University reserves the right to deny transfer of any or all credits.

10. Degree Conferral

- Degrees and certificates will only be awarded to students who have:
 - Successfully completed all program requirements.
 - o Maintained pastoral endorsement throughout their enrollment.
 - Remained in good standing financially and academically.
- The University reserves the right to **withhold degrees** in cases of unresolved conduct, financial, or integrity issues.

11. Student Records

- The University maintains student records in accordance with its privacy and data protection policies.
- Records are the property of the University and will not be released until all financial and disciplinary obligations are met.

12. Grievance Policy (Limited)

- Students may submit concerns in writing to the administration.
- Grievances must be respectful, constructive, and directly related to University operations.
- The University is not obligated to act on grievances deemed frivolous or inconsistent with the mission of Unity Christian University.

13. Code of Dress & Conduct

- Students are expected to present themselves in a manner that reflects Christian values, modesty, and professionalism.
- Dress codes may be enforced for chapel, courses, and university events.

14. Use of University Name and Logo

- Students may not use the name, seal, or logo of Unity Christian University without written approval.
- Unauthorized use of University branding is subject to disciplinary action.

15. Social Media & Public Representation

- Students must conduct themselves responsibly on social media.
- Posts that slander the University, its leadership, or its mission may result in disciplinary action or dismissal.

16. Ministry & Fieldwork Requirements

- Certain programs require ministry involvement, internships, or fieldwork.
- Failure to complete these requirements will affect a student's standing and graduation eligibility.

17. Health & Safety

- Students must comply with health and safety rules for any in-person classes or events.
- Conduct that endangers the safety of others (verbal threats, violence, etc.) is grounds for immediate dismissal.

18. Confession of Faith Requirement

- Students must sign a personal statement of faith at the time of enrollment.
- A lifestyle inconsistent with the statement of faith may result in dismissal.

19. Changes to Policies

• The University reserves the right to modify, add, or rescind policies and procedures at any time, without prior notice.

• Students will be held accountable to the most current version of policies in effect during their enrollment.
