Incorporation of artistic elements that reflect stories, Country, and cultural identity, often in collaboration with local artists.

REVEGETATION AND ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING

Development of site-sensitive planting plans aligned with ecological restoration goals and Indigenous knowledge systems.

CULTURAL VALUES ASSESSMENTS

Site-based and desktop assessments to guide planning, conservation, or development decisions through a cultural lens.

CULTURAL LANDSCAPE ASSESSMENT

Identification and interpretation of significant landscapes to generate longterm management recommendations.

Support in understanding and applying traditional fire management practices.

Co-design of strategies and action plans reflecting Victorian Aboriginal values and priorities.

Programs include reading country, native plant identification and cultural uses, land management, cultural landscapes interpretation, ranger pathway development, workplace mentoring, and public speaking.
