UPDATE - LAKE LEVELS

Like all of you, we are aware of the lower lake levels over the last few years. We have investigated this extensively to determine if there are areas we can address. At this time, there does not seem to be anything we can do except continue to monitor our lakes, Stacey Street bridge project and dams/weirs.

This issue is not isolated to our lakes, it is widespread. In fact, many lakes in our region are down more than our lakes are. This is the feedback we received regarding lake levels from the Kent County Drain Commission:

Lake levels are really just a simple mass balance - water in minus water out equals the lake level. This year's levels are the result of long-term drought, below average rainfall in 2025, and above average evaporation. Kent County has been in a low to moderate drought for two years or so. You can view a statewide drought map here: Michigan J.U.S. Drought Monitor. This year's lake levels are often a reflection of last year's rainfall condition and since we had below average rainfall in 2024, the groundwater levels are down throughout West Michigan.

In June and July, we also had above average amounts of evaporation as well. Based on MSU's weather stations, we had 10 days in June and 11 days in July that exceeded 0.2 inches of evaporation. That means every 4-5 days the lake goes down an inch, just by evaporation alone (not accounting for exfiltrating groundwater). In June and July, we've had 10.5 inches of evaporation but only 4.8 inches of rain.

Those three natural factors (long term drought, below average rainfall, and above average evaporation) explain why so many lakes and ponds in the area are quite low. As much as we'd like, we can't control these natural fluctuations. If water in the lake is less than water going out, then the level will drop.

That is a summary of the information we have received. As mentioned previously, we will continue to monitor the status of our lake levels and hopefully we get some good rainfall during our fall months.




2025 FISH PLANT UPDATE
