Important information from Bob Darvill, Chairman Lake Quality

Summer has finally arrived and it's time for boating, swimming, fishing and just plain relaxing.

We are very lucky in that we have relatively few invasive plants and animals in our five lakes. The plants that we know of are Curly-leaf Pondweed, Eurasian Milfoil and Purple Loosestrife and they are pretty much under control. To date, we do not know of any non-native fish (Round Goby and Ruffe) and shellfish (Zebra mussel) in our lakes. Hopefully we can keep it that way. But to do so we need everyone's help.

Once these invasive plants and animals get into our lakes, we can only try to control their spread, we cannot eliminate them. Trying to control any new invasive will increase our lake management fees. Luckily, we do not have Zebra mussels, yet. They will create major problems if they get into our waters. There is no effective way to control their growth and spread. So the best cure for these unwanted plants, fish and mussels, is PREVENTION!!!

The following tips are the best way to keep them out of our lakes.

1. If visitors or renters are bringing their watercraft, **INSIST** that they wash them, empty the bait and live wells and bilges and let them dry for 5 days before putting into our lakes.
2. Remove all plants from the water crafts and trailers.
3. Residents, remember to do the same if you take your boats to other lakes and rivers.
4. See flyer in this issue (Clean boats - Clean Waters) for more details. Make copies for yourselves, guests and/or renters.

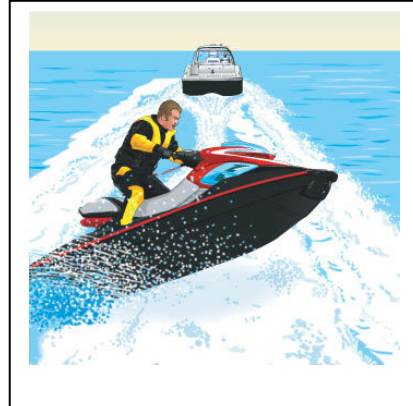

UNLAWFUL AND DANGEROUS OPERATIONS OF A VESSEL

Here are some important reminders while using your personal watercraft...please review these reminders with your family and friends.

Michigan law designates the following dangerous operating practices as illegal.



Reckless Operation of a vessel or reckless manipulation of water skis, a surfboard, or similar device is defined as operation which disregards the safety or rights of others or endangers the person or property of others. Some examples of reckless operation are:

- Weaving your vessel through congested waterway traffic or swerving at the last possible moment in order to avoid collision
- Jumping the wake of another vessel unnecessarily close to the other vessel or when visibility around the other vessel is restricted
- Chasing, harassing, or disturbing wildlife with your vessel
- Causing damage from the wake of your vessel

UNLAWFUL AND DANGEROUS OPERATIONS OF A VESSEL...continue

Failure To Regulate Speed is operating a vessel at speeds that may cause danger to life or property of any other person or at speeds that will not permit you to bring your vessel to a safe stop. It is illegal to operate a vessel:

- In excess of 55 mph unless you are at least one mile offshore on the Great Lakes or Lake St. Clair
- At greater than “slow, no wake speed” when a person is in the bow of a vessel without proper seating

Faster than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions (weather, vessel traffic, etc.)

Improper Distance is not maintaining a proper distance while operating a vessel or towing a person. To maintain a proper distance when you are operating at greater than “slow, no wake speed” (except in channels that are not posted), the vessel or persons being towed must not be within 100 feet of:

- A shoreline (if operating in water less than three feet deep)
- Any moored or anchored vessel
- A dock or raft

It's the Law

PWC operators must obey additional legal requirements that apply specifically to the operation of personal watercraft on Michigan waters.

Requirements Specific to PWCs

Each person riding on or being towed behind a PWC must **wear** a U.S. Coast Guard–approved wearable Type I, II, or III PFD. Inflatable PFDs may not be used.

UNLAWFUL AND DANGEROUS OPERATIONS OF A VESSEL...continue

You may not allow a child under 7 years of age to ride on or be towed behind a PWC unless with a parent or guardian or designee of the parent or guardian.

The lanyard of a PWC's ignition safety switch must be attached to the person, clothing, or PFD of the operator.

It is illegal to operate a PWC during the period that begins at sunset and ends at 8:00 a.m. "Sunset" means that time determined by the national weather service.

PWCs must be operated in a reasonable and prudent manner at all times. It is illegal to:

- Jump the wake of another vessel unnecessarily close to the other vessel.
- Weave your PWC through congested traffic.
- Swerve at the last possible moment to avoid collision.

A PWC must be operated at "slow, no wake speed" if crossing within 150 feet behind another vessel unless the other vessel is also a PWC.

You may not operate a PWC within 200 feet of a Great Lakes shoreline unless traveling at "slow, no wake speed" perpendicular to the shoreline.

You may not operate a PWC in waters less than two feet deep unless you are operating at "slow, no wake speed" or are docking or launching your PWC.

It is illegal to harass wildlife or disturb aquatic vegetation with your PWC.

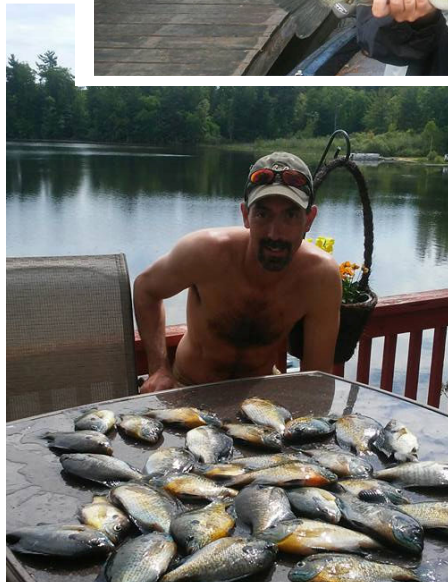

DEQ permitting restrictions, national holidays, and/or weather conditions may influence the timing of treatments throughout the 2016 season. PLM treats each lake according to a schedule or season plan, established with the cooperation of your lake association, lake board or residents on the lake. The treatment schedule is approximate. Please watch your shoreline for the posting of the 8.5x11 inch, yellow or green signs. The signs will indicate the date of the treatment, the products used, and any restrictions on the use of treated water for swimming, watering lawns, etc. The property owners in this area are planning to have the waters chemically treated to control lake weeds and/or algae. This notice is being circulated in accordance with Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) procedures. Below is a list of herbicides that may be applied to the lake and the associated use restrictions. On the day of treatment, signs will be posted along the shoreline within 100 feet of treatment areas that indicate what products were used and specific water use restrictions that apply:

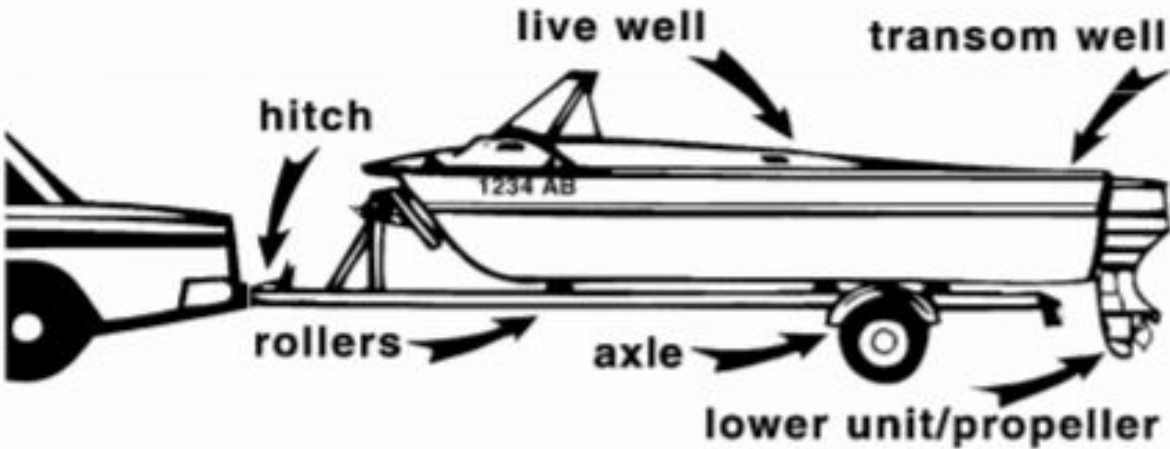

It's the Law

Who May Operate a Personal Watercraft (PWC)

Those less than 14 years of age may **not** legally operate a PWC.

Those 14 and 15 years of age may operate a PWC legally **only if** they have obtained a boating safety certificate **and ...**

- He or she is accompanied on board by his or her parent or legal guardian or by a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal guardian **or ...**
- He or she is operating or riding the PWC at a distance of not more than 100 feet from his or her parent **or** legal guardian or from a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal guardian.

Those at least 16 years of age and born after December 31, 1978, may operate a PWC legally **only if** they have obtained a boating safety certificate.

Those born on or before December 31, 1978, may operate a PWC legally without restrictions.
