

Many residents are new to the lake and may not be aware that inland lakes, such as ours, are governed by Michigan's Boating Laws and must be followed. Please take a few minutes to read up on these boating laws and make sure to pass the information to your family and friends as, if not followed, someone may get injured. ## UNLAWFUL AND DANGEROUS OPERATIONS OF A VESSEL

Here are some important reminders while using your personal watercraft...please review these reminders with your family and friends.

Michigan law designates the following dangerous operating practices as illegal.



**Reckless Operation** of a vessel or reckless manipulation of water skis, a surfboard, or similar device is defined as operation which disregards the safety or rights of others or endangers the person or property of others. Some examples of reckless operation are:

- Weaving your vessel through congested waterway traffic or swerving at the last possible moment in order to avoid collision
- Jumping the wake of another vessel unnecessarily close to the other vessel or when visibility around the other vessel is restricted
- Chasing, harassing, or disturbing wildlife with your vessel
- Causing damage from the wake of your vessel

**Failure To Regulate Speed** is operating a vessel at speeds that may cause danger to life or property of any other person or at speeds that will not permit you to bring your vessel to a safe stop. It is illegal to operate a vessel:

- In excess of 55 mph unless you are at least one mile offshore on the Great Lakes or Lake St. Clair
- At greater than "slow, no wake speed" when a person is in the bow of a vessel without proper seating

Faster than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions (weather, vessel traffic, etc.)

**Improper Distance** is not maintaining a proper distance while operating a vessel or towing a person. To maintain a proper distance when you are operating at greater than "slow, no wake speed" (except in channels that are not posted), the vessel or persons being towed must not be within 100 feet of:

- A shoreline (if operating in water less than three feet deep)
- Any moored or anchored vessel
- A dock or raft

#### It's the Law

PWC operators must obey additional legal requirements that apply specifically to the operation of personal watercraft on Michigan waters.

### **Requirements Specific to PWCs**

Each person riding on or being towed behind a PWC must **wear** a U.S. Coast Guard—approved wearable Type I, II, or III PFD. Inflatable PFDs may not be used.

## UNLAWFUL AND DANGEROUS OPERATIONS OF A VESSEL...continue

You may not allow a child under 7 years of age to ride on or be towed behind a PWC unless with a parent or guardian or designee of the parent or guardian.

The lanyard of a PWC's ignition safety switch must be attached to the person, clothing, or PFD of the operator.

It is illegal to operate a PWC during the period that begins at sunset and ends at 8:00 a.m. "Sunset" means that time determined by the national weather service.

PWCs must be operated in a reasonable and prudent manner at all times. It is illegal to:

- Jump the wake of another vessel unnecessarily close to the other vessel.
- Weave your PWC through congested traffic
- Swerve at the last possible moment to avoid collision.

A PWC must be operated at "slow, no wake speed" if crossing within 150 feet behind another vessel unless the other vessel is also a PWC.

You may not operate a PWC within 200 feet of a Great Lakes shoreline unless traveling at "slow, no wake speed" perpendicular to the shoreline.

You may not operate a PWC in waters less than two feet deep unless you are operating at "slow, no wake speed" or are docking or launching your PWC.

It is illegal to harass wildlife or disturb aquatic vegetation with your PWC.



## **New Boating Law** Effective 2019


New requirements to stop the introduction and spread of Aquatic Invasive Species!





A person shall NOT ...

Launch or transport watercraft or trailers unless they are free of aquatic organisms, including plants.




Release unused balt into the water.

Violation of the law is a state civil infraction. Violators may be subject to fines.

#### Follow these steps:

- 1. CLEAN boats, trailers and equipment.
- 2. DRAIN live wells, bilges and all water.
- 3. DRY boats and equipment.


Aquatic invasive species such as zebra mussels and Eurasian rmilfoil are often introduced and spread through recreationa boating and angling activities and can have long lasting negative impacts such as reduced native species diversity, water choked with weeds and reduced opportunities for fishing sating and swimming. Fortunately, boaters can help preve the spread of invasive species with just a few simple steps



DRAIN live wells, bilges and all water from boats before leaving the access site. Disinfect live wells and bilges with a bleach solution (1/2 cup bleach to 5 gallons of water) when possible. Fish diseases and microscopic life stages of aquatic invasive species can be hiding in seemingly clean water, so draining is an important step.

DISPOSE of unused bait in the trash. Do not release bait into the water. Release of balt and minnows can lead to the unintended introduction of aquatic invasive species.

DO NOT TRANSFER FISH to water bodies other than where they were caught. This helps prevent the spread of both aquatic invasive species and fish diseases.

## Note from Bob Darvill, Chairman, Lake Quality Committee...

As boating safety, boating etiquette and boating courtesy are such important topics, here are a few more boating rules and regulations to keep in mind...please inform your family of this important information too.

Our boating season has arrived. It's too bad Mother Nature is not cooperating. I am sending this message for all residents, new and old, and young and old, as a reminder of some boating rules and courtesies.

- 1. All boats travel counter clockwise around the lakes
- 2. All motorboats and PWC (jet skis) are required to stay a minimum 100 feet from docks, rafts and shorelines. As a common courtesy to our neighbors, boats that make large wakes should try to stay as far from the docks and shorelines as possible. This is to prevent erosion to shorelines and damage to docks, seawalls and shore stations.
- 3. Slow down long before entering a no wake zone, so your wakes do not follow
- 4. Please turn on your running lights after sunset.
- 5. It is illegal to chase waterfowl with your water crafts.
- 6. We are very lucky, this spring, to have, at least, 1 pair of breeding loons. Please! please! Do not disturb them by going too fast by their nests or pulling up close to their nests. If they are not disturbed, hopefully, they will make our lakes their permanent summer homes and raise many families.

# MEMBERSHIP DUES INCREASING TO \$40 beginning fiscal year 2019-2020...

As mentioned in the March 2019 Issue of the Waterline, the lake reps voted at their February 11, 2019 lake association board meeting, to raise the annual dues from \$35 to \$40 effective with our new fiscal year which begins September 1, 2019.

The thought behind raising the dues is...When the WCLA Association was formed many, many, years ago it was mainly to keep our lakes "Private" meaning the state or local government could not install a public access. At that time \$35 per property was cheap insurance to prevent this. Then the WCLA included handling lake quality issues, overseeing weed treatments and such.

As you all are aware, the WCLA does so much more, like the Annual Golf Outing, Progressive Kayaking, Monthly Get Together's, fish planting and so on, all for the same \$35 per year as when the Association started. While our budget is in good shape, WCLA would like it to stay that way so it can offer more activities in the future. The extra \$5 per year will generate approximately \$1,000 and will be used to fund those activities.

The 2019-2020 Membership Form is being updated and will be available on our website by Sept 1, 2019.

### **LILY PAD CONTROL**

WCLA board members have received numerous calls concerning lily pad control. The following is a general review of what PLM, our lake management company is allowed by DNR to do, to help control lily pads. It must be noted that these plants are native species, thus PLM is limited in what action they can take.

- 1. Only a 40' x 40' area can be sprayed on any given water front lot. The spray is a contact defoliant. It is designed to kill the surface leaves. We had our first spraying this past Monday. There will be more later this summer as the plants sprout new leaves.
- 2. There is a different rule for lake lots set back a considerable distance from open water. A 20' wide path can be maintained by using a systemic spray which kills the plant's roots, so that there is lake access by boat.
- 3. Please remember that good plant life is needed for having a good quality lakes. The plants reduce shoreline erosion, make good cover for fish and thus help create good fishing. Many plants support food and cover for many forms of wildlife. We have a very good lake system. Lets keep it that way.

## 2019 WCLA Boat Launch Use Dates at Camp Concordia (always check website for updated changes)

### **WCLA Boat Launch Use Dates**

The boat launch at Camp Concordia is NOT open to the general public. Camp Concordia (CC) is a non-profit children's summer camp. Church groups, school groups and family reunions who are registered guests at Camp Concordia will schedule times to put in and remove their boats - but access is limited for the safety of our children.

The Woodbeck Chain-of-Lakes Association (WCLA) has a special agreement with Camp Concordia to assist members in getting their boats in and out of the lakes. <u>CC does NOT get paid for WCLA members use of its private land</u>. It is offered as a neighborly gesture to WCLA paid members who follow the procedures as requested. Donations to continue this relationship are appreciated and are tax-deductible.

\*What do we mean by "following the procedures as requested"? Members of WCLA have cut the lock, broken the lock with a hammer, yelled at CC staff, shown up without telling us, left property gates open, left ramp lock unlocked "for a friend," bent the posts at the launch, hit the dock and not fixed it. These are examples of NOT following procedures.

In respect for the property of Camp Concordia, to ensure the safety of the children on site during the times of organized events, and to continue our good relationship; the Camp Concordia Board of Directors asks that the members of the WCLA kindly follow these guidelines for the use of the boat launch in 2019.

**Allowable Times**: The boat launch will be available on the dates listed on the calendar for WCLA members who follow the procedures below.

## **Boat Launch Use Procedure**

(Notify Camp Concordia 24 hours in advance)

- 1. Be sure you have the current **combination** for the lock. You have received this as a member. If you do not have it contact your Lake Association Board of Directors representative.
- 2. Be sure to have your **membership card** on the driver's side dash.
- 3. Contact Camp Concordia *in advance (at least the day before)* when you plan to use CC's boat launch. Phone 616-754-3785, or email, <u>office@campconcordia.org</u>, (<u>mailto:office@campconcordia.org</u>) with following information:
  - 1. Your name
  - 2. Your phone number
  - 3. **Day and time** you plan to launch or pick up or the company delivering or picking up your craft (example: May 20th at 6:00 pm)
  - 4. Color, make, and model of the vehicle(s) camp staff will see on camp and/or the name of the company delivering your craft (example: Blue Jeep Wrangler). If you need to bring additional vehicles, they MUST also be identified.
  - 5. Leave a message if no one answers.

Example: "Hi! My name is John Smith. My phone number is 616.123.4567. I will launch my boat May 21, at about 6:00 pm. I will be driving a White, Chevy Suburban."

4. **Check the Boat Launch Calendar** for dates and times when the Boat Launch will be available for use by members of the Lake Association and enter Camp only during the available times.
