### Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault in LGBTQ Relationships

Domestic violence & sexual assault is not limited to heterosexual relationships and can affect individuals of all sexual orientations and genders. Sadly, despite the prevalence, LGBTQ people are less likely to identify domestic or sexual violence in their relationships, & less likely to report it to the police or seek support from services

- 44 percent of lesbians and 61 percent of bisexual women experience rape, physical violence, or stalking by an intimate partner.
- 26 percent of gay men and 37 percent of bisexual men experience rape, physical violence, or stalking by an intimate partner.

There are several aspects of intimate partner violence & barriers they may face which can be unique to the LGBTQ community.

- Dangers of their partner "outing" them when seeking help & the risk of rejection & isolation from family, friends, and society.
- Survivors not knowing if the services in their area are LGBTQ friendly.
- Fear of homophobia from service providers.
- Low levels of confidence in the sensitivity & effectiveness of law enforcement and the court system for LGBTQ victims.

June is Pride Month & it's the perfect time to think about and discuss these issues and raise awareness. Although huge strides have been made for equality over recent years, we all still have a long way to go.

### All survivors deserve safety and equal access to resources.

Services at The Bridge will not be denied to survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, or stalking based on age, race, gender, ethnicity, national origin, martial status, sexual orientation, socio-economic status, health status, employment status, immigration status, physical or cogitative ability, or religion.
