USask Alumni Email

Important Update: Alumni email services will be discontinued as of Feb. 15, 2026.

What this means for you:

You should retrieve any data or information that you want to keep before Feb. 15, 2026. After Feb. 15, you will not be able to access your account and ALL information will be deleted.

To avoid losing important information and to avoid disruption in communications, alumni will need to:

Save your data: Download or forward any emails, photos, contacts or files you want to keep from your USask email account before Feb. 15, 2026. Accounts will be inaccessible, and all data removed on Feb. 15, 2026.

Update your contact info with USask: Provide a personal email address (e.g., Gmail, Apple Mail, other) to continue receiving university news and updates.

Update online accounts and subscriptions: Update your email address on any services, subscriptions, or logins that currently use your USask email. After Feb. 15, 2026, you will not be able to access those services.

Wills and Estates



Krista Evanisky, TEP is the founder of Clarity Law. She specializes in the areas of estate planning, estate administration, and residential real estate.

Discussion Topic: Next steps after the Will.

Attendees are invited to learn the basics of estate planning and gain a clearer understanding of how thoughtful planning can protect both assets and loved ones. Local estate planning lawyer, Krista Evanisky, TEP, will provide a practical overview of why having a Will is essential and what can happen if someone dies without one. She will explain who has authority to manage an estate, how assets are distributed, and which property is (and is not) governed by a Will. The presentation will also clarify the differences between a Will, Power of Attorney, and Health Care Directive, and offer guidance on how to prepare for the estate planning process.





**Make the HEALTH SPENDING ACCOUNT a
Priority to Use!**

Consider submitting your Statement of Premiums Paid and check the Health Spending Account BOX on the Blue Cross Claim Form. If using your 2025 Premium Statement, you must submit this to Blue Cross before February 28th. Otherwise, you need to contact The STS Office for a 2026 monthly statement.

We have TWO (2) Health Plan Opportunities

Please review the information below on the Health Spending Account and the Extended Health Plan. Please contact the STS Office at 306-373-3879 if you have any questions about either plan.

STS Members - Know how to use the Extended Health Plan

The **\$500 vaccine benefit** that was authorized as of July 1, 2024 for members of the STS Extended Health Plan is **per person - \$500 for you and \$500 for your spouse if you are paying premiums for a couple** – and it is an annual amount, **so you have \$500 each**. Just a reminder that the plan will cover 80% of the vaccine cost and you will pay the other 20%. **If you have any questions about the STS Extended Health Plan, please contact the STS Office at 306-373-3879.**

IMPORTANT INFORMATION HEALTH SPENDING ACCOUNT (HSA)

Any expense incurred in 2025 must be claimed through the HSA by the end of 2025 – this expense cannot be submitted after that, even though the HSA does go until December 31, 2026.

All STS Group Benefit Plan members (Primary Plan Holders) that enrolled in the Plan prior to January 1, 2025 have a Health Spending Account—\$200 if you have “Single” coverage, \$400 if you have “Couple” coverage, and \$460 if you have “Family” coverage. This amount must be utilized before December 31, 2026. These allocations may be used by anyone covered by the Plan Holder and used for any health expenses allowed by Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) which are not included in, or completely covered by, the STS Extended Health and Dental Plan.

What if I don't use my HSA in 2025? Health Spending Account funds remaining after the first year (2025) will be carried into the next calendar year to be utilized between January 1, 2026, and December 31, 2026.

Should you not have medical expenses, it is possible to use the HSA for reimbursement of premiums paid. If you wish to go that route, please contact the STS office (306-373-3879 or sts@sts.sk.ca). The office will provide a statement of premiums which would then be submitted to Saskatchewan Blue Cross. You do not need to wait until the annual premium statement is mailed out in January.

Important Group Benefit Reminder

To all STS members who have *recently retired or are leaving another Group Benefit Plan* - there is a 60-day window to join the STS Group Benefits Plan – the Extended Health Plan including travel and/or the Dental Plan--*without having to provide medical evidence of good health*. It is possible to join later but you will be asked to provide medical evidence. **This same 60-day window applies to a spouse of a deceased superannuate or of a deceased active teacher, who must apply to become a member of STS and join the STS Group Benefit Plan without having to provide medical evidence of good health.**
