

The 12 promises of AA are as follows:

- 1. If we are painstaking about this phase of our development, we will be amazed before we are half-way through.
- 2. We are going to know a new freedom and a new happiness.
- 3. We will not regret the past nor wish to shut the door on it.
- 4. We will comprehend the word serenity, and we will know peace.
- 5. No matter how far down the scale we have gone, we will see how our experience can benefit others.
- 6. That feeling of uselessness and self-pity will disappear.
- 7. We will lose interest in selfish things and gain interest in our fellows.
- 8. Self-seeking will slip away.
- 9. Our whole attitude and outlook upon life will change.
- 10. Fear of people and of economic insecurity will leave us.
- 11. We will intuitively know how to handle situations which used to baffle us.
- 12. We will suddenly realize that God is doing for us what we could not do for ourselves.

Over the years I have been doing *Straight Talk*, the shop they are printed at has used a variety of different boxes. For the July issue, they had the copies in a couple of white boxes - similar to boxes sometimes used for donuts. I had picked them up from the printer and was waiting at the bus stop with the boxes sitting on the sidewalk next to me.

It was a hot, sunny afternoon; the sort of day that many in AA would perhaps remember as a day when a few cold beers was well deserved.

A guy who was also waiting for the bus walked up. He was carrying two canvas shopping bags. It looked like they were both pretty full and heavy to carry. He appeared like he might be a little drunk.

He noticed me... and those boxes: "Dude! Donuts!! You got donuts! Gimme a donut! I'll give you a beer for a donut."

I explained that it was some printing I had had done and not donuts. He set his bags down next to my boxes. He gave a sigh of relief to be setting them down. I could see now that they were both very full, largely with cans of beer. I opened one of the boxes, gave him a copy of Straight Talk, and said it's a newsletter I have printed.

"What's it about?" "It's about alcoholism and sobriety." "Oh, alcohol. I know all about alcohol. I just took six buses to get me some alcohol!"

We did not talk much more after that. He put the copy I gave him in one of the bags with his beer and said he would read it.

Company Policy

Every time the newest monkey takes to the stairs, he is attacked. Most of the monkeys that are beating him have no idea why they were not permitted to climb the stairs or why they are participating in the beating of

the newest monkey. After replacing all the original monkeys, none of the remaining monkeys have ever been sprayed with cold water. Nevertheless, no monkey ever again approaches the stairs to try for the banana.

Why not? Because as far as they know that's the way it's always been done around here.
