A triple application of prophecy tells us that World War I plus World War II equals World War III; today we are going to look at the history of World War II and see how it explains our history- World War III. The histories of Pyrrhus in Macedonia and Italy parallel the history of World War II and our history. You can view the histories of Pyrrhus in Macedonia and Italy as a progressive history and line them up with the progressive history of World War II and III, but you can also cut the lines and line all four up separately as well. We can see in those four, alpha and omega histories. Alpha histories are histories of failure and omega histories are histories of success. This understanding impacts how we view the histories of Pyrrhus in Macedonia and Italy and World War II as they apply to our time. Yet all of these lines teach us about the conflict between the King of the North and the King of the South on our line.

World War II

1929

In 1929 you can see Hitler, Stalin and Mussolini- all are dictators. They, especially Hitler and Stalin are major players in the history of World War II. In 1929 the United States' stock market crashed, this sent the US into the Great Depression. The Great Depression didn't just hurt the United States it also hurt other countries, including Germany because the US had lent Germany money after World War I and suddenly they wanted that money back. Germany went into a depression because of this, and this helped the Nazi party rise in popularity. The next year, 1930, the Nazi party (which Hitler was in charge of) got the second most votes for seats in the German government than any other party. It was only a few short years later that Hitler became the dictator of Germany (in 1933).

In 1929 Stalin exiled his most prominent opposer- Trotsky from the Soviet Union. Actually by this time Trotsky, who had worked with Lenin in the Russian Revolution, was unpopular and deprived of power thanks to Stalin's craftiness. He opposed Stalin's policies and the way he was turning into a dictator, so Stalin exiled him. He also silenced other people until after 1930 there was no more open opposition to him.

Mussolini signed the Lateran treaty with the Papacy in 1929. He was already a dictator- since 1925- and though he wasn't really a Christian he was trying to appeal to Catholics by granting some of their church's wishes through this treaty. The year 1929 is the beginning of preparation for World War II.

1936-1939

The history of World War II began in 1939. Previous to that year there had a proxy war between Communism (the USSR under Stalin) and Fascism (Nazi Germany under Hitler and Italy under Mussolini). That was the Spanish Civil War from 1936 to 1939, and it was a little sample of World War II, particularly the eastern front. The Spanish Civil War was between the Spanish government and a general named Franco who was a Fascist. Hitler, Mussolini, and even the pope supported Franco while Stalin and a group of volunteers (called the International Brigade) from Europe and North America supported the government. Stalin didn't want Spain to become Fascist because they were his enemies. Yet Franco and Fascism won that war in 1939. The 10 years of the preparation of Hitler and Stalin, from 1929, were over; they were both dictators and Hitler had big plans for the future.

August 23, 1939

On August 23, 1939, Germany and the USSR signed a pact. It was known as the Molotov-Ribbentrop Pact because it was signed by foreign ministers Joachim von Ribbentrop (Germany) and Vyacheslav Molotov (USSR). This took the whole world by surprise because Germany and the USSR were mortal enemies, but Hitler needed this pact with the USSR to wage war with the west. There were two parts to this pact. The first part was regarding non-aggression between the two. Everyone knew about this part. But the second part, the secret part, was that Hitler and Stalin had redrawn the maps, spitting up Europe into two sections- one under the sphere of influence of the USSR and the other under Germany.

September 1, 1939

Adolf Hitler was a dictator and wanted to control all of Europe. One of the steps to doing that was controlling Poland. Hitler first gave orders to begin invading Poland on August 26, 1939, but the day before August 26, he learned that Britain had signed a treaty with Poland and had promised them military support. Instead of attacking, Hitler spread a lie that German speakers in Poland were being persecuted. Poland took this as a sign that Germany would attack them, and began rallying its troops, but France and Britain told them to stop to avoid war. Despite this, Germany put some of its troops in Polish uniforms and invaded their own country (Germany), but not doing much damage. The Germans published this as an unforgivable action and the next day at 4:45 in the morning 1.5 million German troops invaded Poland. Although Poland had an army of over 700,000 soldiers, it wasn't prepared for the attack and by the end of September, Germany was controlling all of Poland. This invasion of Poland caused Britain and France to declare war on Germany and the western front (the war between Germany, France and Britain) of World War II began.

August 1940

In February of 1940, Germany and the Soviet Union signed an economic agreement. The Soviet Union agreed to send Germany oil, petroleum, manganese, copper, nickel, chrome, platinum, lumber, grain and other materials. In exchange, the Soviet Union received plans for the German ship Bismarck, heavy naval guns and other gear. Later that year however, in August 1940, Stalin worried that Hitler's war with the west might end quickly, ruining his plans of Germany being weakened. In combination with this, Germany had fallen behind on its side of the economic deal, so Stalin briefly suspended the Soviet Union's trade to Germany. However, their friendship recovered.

June 22, 1941

On June 22, 1941, Germany officially broke the Molotov-Ribbentrop Pact. Hitler invaded the Soviet Union that afternoon. The invasion went under the code name Operation Barbarossa. The invasion began with bombing major cities and airstrikes which won Germany ground. Ultimately, however, the USSR pushed back. This began the eastern front (the war between Germany and Russia) of World War II.

1945


The Allies were a group of countries that fought in World War II against Germany, Italy, and Japan, who were the major Axis powers. At the beginning of World War II, the Allies were only France, Poland, The United Kingdom, and their dependent states. As the war went on- many other countries joined the Allies. After Russia was invaded by Germany (Operation Barbarossa), it joined the Allies in 1941, becoming officially opposed to Germany who was part of the Axis powers. In December of 1941, the US joined the Allies; four years later, in March of 1945, the Allies launched a final attack on Germany. Germany was defeated and surrendered on May 7 (1945). After they surrendered, Germany was divided for years.

1945-1989

Between the end of World War II and the fall of the USSR the Cold War took place. The USA and the USSR competed with each other to become the only superpower. They tried to weaken each other and expand their power and influence; they also participated in proxy wars where they fought through other people. The USSR lost and it began to fall in 1989; the USA became the only superpower (but not for long).

1989

On November 9, 1989, the Soviet Union began to collapse. They lost all of their spheres of influence and only Russia remained.



World War III

1979

Ten years before the Time of the End was 1979. In 1979 proxy wars in Afghanistan and Syria began between the United States and the Soviet Union. These were just a build-up to the conflicts between the USA and Russia today; this history was typified by the 10 years between 1929 and 1939 (especially the Spanish Civil War) from World War II.

1989

As we have seen there is a 10 year period prior to 1989- the Time of the End. The proxy wars between the United States (the KON) and the Soviet Union (the KOS) in places like Afghanistan and Syria ended in 1989, like they did in 1939. The Soviet Union just got weakened by those wars, and as the Soviet Union weakened many of the countries that were a part of it gained their independence. They began to ally with and act like the west: the USA- the King of the North. This parallels what Thurri did in 285 BC. By 1991 the Soviet Union had fallen and Russia became the King of the South the future enemy of the King of the North- the United States.

2014

The line of Pyrrhus in Italy shows us that Tarentum, the King of the South, would attack one of its former spheres of influence because they tried to ally with Rome (the King of the North). In 2014 Russia- the King of the South- attacked Ukraine by invading Crimea. They did this because the people had elected Viktor Yanukovich who acted pro-western to be president in 2010, but he was just pretending. When he got in office he started to ally closer with Russia and in February of 2014 many of the Ukrainians protested. He was removed from office, then he fled to Russia, and the temporary government of Ukraine charged him with crimes. Yanukovich asked Putin to restore peace in Ukraine; Putin sent Russian soldiers and they invaded and took over Crimea (a part of Ukraine) by the end of March. According to the line of Pyrrhus in Macedonia and World War II there was an alliance between the KON and KOS at this same waymark; the King of the North used this alliance when it fought the western front. So in our time there was an "alliance" between Trump and Putin in 2014 that Trump later used in his war with the western front (the US government).

2016

The year of 2016 in our history lines up with 301 BC, 280 BC, and September 1, 1939. In 301 BC we saw that Antigonos, Demetrius, and Pyrrhus (who was backing Demetrius) fought against the allies who were Seleucus, Lysimachus, and Cassander. On September 1, 1939, Germany, backed by the USSR, invaded Poland and began fighting against France and Britain. Based on these two histories, in 2016 there had to be one group fighting against three other opponents, and there was. Hillary Clinton- who can be represented by Antigonos, and Trump- who can be represented by Demetrius and Hitler (Germany) backed by Putin, who is Pyrrhus and the USSR, were both fighting against the three branches of the US government, the executive (president), the legislative (congress), and the judicial (courts). Antigonos was killed during the battle of Ipsus, but not

Demetrius or Pyrrhus. In 2016, Clinton lost the election but Trump and Putin (who was backing him) won. Also, the battle of Ipsus was won by elephants. Elephants are a symbol of information, and we can see that Trump wouldn't have won without his and Putin's disinformation. After Germany had invaded Poland in 1939, it started fighting against France and Britain, this was the western front. And after Trump defeated the executive branch, he began to fight against the other two branches of the US government. Lastly, from the line of Italy, in 280 BC Pyrrhus began to prepare for war; in our history on April 5, 2016, Putin created the National Guard of Russia, this is a preparation for war.

2018

In 291 BC, Pyrrhus invaded Thessaly, but then he retreated when Demetrius came against him. This was a victory for Demetrius who was the King of the North. In 280 BC, Pyrrhus defeated Rome; this was a victory for the King of the South. August of 1940 was a victory for the King of the North, this is because when trade resumed again, Germany, the King of the North, got the better end of the deal. These three waymarks all line up with 2018 on our line. In 2018, we saw a battle between the King of the North (Trump) and the King of the South (Putin) in which the King of the South won. This was the victory for the King of the South which is marked in history as the battle of Heraclea in 280 BC- hence we call 2018 Heraclea. The only problem is that 291 BC and 1940 are victories for the King of the North, not the King of the South, but they parallel 2018 and 280 BC. This is the problem we get when we line up alpha histories with omega histories. Since Macedonia and World War II are alpha histories- they are the same, but they are opposite to Italy and our line which are omega histories. There isn't anything wrong with lining up alpha and omega histories, but when we bring an alpha history battle to our line (an omega history) we have to flip them (to the opposite) because the outcome of an alpha history is opposite to an omega.

2019

On our line, 2019 lines up with 289/288 BC, 279 BC, and 1941. In history, from 289 to 288 BC Demetrius ravaged Pyrrhus' country Epirus. Demetrius was the King of the North and Pyrrhus was the King of the South, so this was another victory for the King of the North. The battle of Asculum was in 279 BC, where thanks to his elephants, Pyrrhus (King of South) defeated Rome, who was the King of the North. Lastly in 1941, Germany (King of the North) "ravaged" Russia (King of the South) in Operation Barbarossa. So in 2019, according to Asculum, the King of the South, which is Putin, defeated the King of the North, Trump. The years 289 BC and 1941 however, tell us the opposite: they say that the King of the North will defeat the King of the South. But remember 289 BC and 1941 are in alpha histories, so they must be flipped, and after you flip them they will show the same thing as 279 BC. In 2019, we clearly saw Putin defeat Trump. All over the Middle East, countries were changing their allegiance from the US to Russia. This battle was fought with information, just like Asculum was won by elephants. We also see in 1941 that Germany, the King of the North (which would in our history be flipped to King of the South) breaks a treaty between it and Russia (which in our history would be the USA) by invading them. The year before, in 1940, there had been friendship between Germany and Russia, then they stopped being friends, but then their friendship recovered. This very thing happened the year before 2019- 2018. Trump and Putin had been friends, but then began fighting the battle of Heraclea,

that ruined their friendship, but later, when Trump finally submitted to Putin, they became friends again. But their friendship was again broken just like in 1941, when Putin broke the “treaty” and defeated Trump.

2021


The years 287 BC and 1945 are alpha histories, that’s why they are both the same in saying that the King of the South (Pyrrhus in Macedonia and USSR in World War II) attacked the King of the North (Demetrius in Macedonia and Germany in World War II) and split up its land into east and west. 275 BC on the other hand is in an omega history and it says that the King of the North will attack the King of the South. Since our line is an omega history, we must flip alpha history players and thus all three of those waymarks say that the King of the North will defeat the King of the South and split up its land. These three waymarks line up with 2021, this is where the battle of Panium will take place, which is an information war (seeing that there were elephants in the battle of Beneventum in 275 BC). At Panium, the King of the North will attack the King of the South and according to 287 BC and 1945 split up its land. The US which is the King of the North doesn’t literally have to split up Russia (the King of the South), but we do know that Russia will be defeated and never again rise as a superpower.

2021-Sunday Law

Between Panium and the Sunday Law the way the world looks, politically, will change. The King of the South- Russia- will fall in that time: it will lose its power and influence. Also we will see the rise of the Papacy as a world power in that history. We saw this in the histories of Pyrrhus and World War II. In the 4th Diadochi war and World War II there was a period of time when the King of the North and the King of the South were fighting a cold war that the King of the South ultimately lost. And in the history of the Pyrrhic war that same time period was when Tarentum (the King of the South) was falling to the King of the North; in the middle of that time was the year 273 BC when Egypt acknowledged Rome as a new world power.

Sunday Law

In 285 BC, Pyrrhus (the King of the South) lost everything but Epirus to Lysimachus (the King of the North). This was a partial loss. In 1989, the USSR (the King of the South) lost all its sphere of influence except Russia to the USA (the King of the North). This too was a partial loss. Both 285 BC and 1989 are waymarks from alpha histories. In 272 BC, Pyrrhus lost everything including his own country: he was killed. This is from an omega history, so it more closely resembles our history. At the Sunday Law, Putin will lose everything including Russia. In 272 BC, Pyrrhus was killed but this doesn’t necessarily mean Putin will be killed. We do know, however, that his own people will remove him and Russia will “die”.
