The first Exchange Club was formed in Detroit, Michigan in 1911 by Mr. Charles Berkey.

- In 1917 the National Exchange Club was organized as a non-profit educational organization.
- There are 700 locally based Exchange Clubs in the USA.
- Our Exchange Club activities and mission are focused on Community Service, Americanism, and Service to our Youth; with the Prevention of Child Abuse being our overriding theme, locally and nationally.
- The Michigan City Men's Exchange Club was formed in 1950 with a charter membership of 34. Today our members total over 75 making us one of the largest clubs in the country.
- Our Club is governed by five Officers and nine Board members and elections are held annually.
- Exchange Clubs offer its members unique opportunities that can improve the leadership skills.
