## Camilla Scott

Camilla Scott can do it all. She can act, she can dance and she can certainly sing.

She appeared on the soap opera, Days of Our Lives, in 1990, portraying Melissa Anderson. The casting director was looking for a young actress who could sing. Surprised by a request to "sing something," Scott started singing the last song she had heard on her car radio: Whitney Houston's "Greatest Love of All." The casting agent stopped her, saying, "You really can sing!" She was hired and began filming the next day.

Live theatre is an important part of Scott's career, appearing as the lead in numerous Toronto productions including Mamma Mia!, Crazy For You and We Will Rock You.

In 2002, Scott had a voice role as Mama Bear in a television adaptation of the Berenstain Bears. And she has had her share of movie screen time, including "Three Men and a Baby", "Tommy Boy", and "The Art of the Steal".

From 1996 to 1998, Scott hosted a daytime talk show, The Camilla Scott Show on the Baton Broadcast System (and later CTV).

Concurrent with her talk show work, she had a recurring role in the TV series Due South as Inspector Margaret "Meg" Thatcher of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police from 1995 to 1999. She credits this role for helping her receive an award for community safety. In 1996, she witnessed a mugging and called 911, giving a description of the mugger and his car that led to his arrest. "Maybe my role as an RCMP officer on Due South gave me the practice I needed to help in a real situation," she said.
