Henry Strozier got his B.A. with Honours in English from the University of Iowa, and served three years in the Army before landing his first professional acting job in 1960. He was an apprentice at the Barter Theatre in Abingdon, Virginia, opposite Ned Beatty in “Regions of Noon.”

Strozier became the original male voice of The Discovery Channel, the narrator of two PBS series, The 1900 House and Manor House, and of the Animal Planet Series, Too Cute!, for which he was nominated for two Primetime Emmy Awards. His career includes voice-over for movie trailers, The Smithsonian Institution, National Geographic, numerous video games, and national commercials (Google Ocean Spray TV commercials. He’s always knee-deep in a cranberry bog).

Strozier has recorded over 100 audio books, leading to several prestigious AudioFile “Earphones Awards,” and an Audie in 2016.

His film and TV career includes roles in 13 Days, Contact, Sex in the City, Law and Order, Homicide, You Don’t Know Jack, Birch Interval, Mary White, Kidnapped, the Whoopie Goldberg Show, and Damages.

The producers of “Too Cute!” wanted “*Someone who was good at storytelling.*” With Henry Strozier they got that and much more.
