Culver's canoe team opened its season last weekend in the Ninth Annual Sugar Creek Canoe Race in Crawfordsville, Ind.

DON GIACCHETTI, team captain, took first place in the oneman 1000 meter canoe race. Dave Swain, Ian Munn, Chris Keller, and Chuck Eldred captured fourth through seventh place, respectively.

The team composed of Wally Arthur, Eldred, Keller and Swain stroked to a striking victory in the four-man canoe race, Culver's next team, Kevin Barry, Giacchetti, Munn, and Rusty Zick, captured third place in the race, with Alex Calder, John Dunning, Ted Newell, and Paul Seel following up with a fifth.

The final race of the weekend, the two-man canoe race, which was over a sixteen-mile course, had Giacchetti and Zick crossing the finish line third. Culver's second team, Keller-Eldred, followed through with a sixth in the race.

Keller and Zick went to the Petersburg White Water Weekend Canoe Race in Kentucky where they finished with a glorious victory in the two-man canoe race.

Without a Junior Men's Division, the team had to compete in the Senior Men's Division for the twelve mile, two man race on the following day. The team performed quite commendably in the race even though their placings were lower than usual. The team of Chris Keller and Chuck Eldred captured fifth place and was followed closely by Don Rusty Zick, Giacchetti and who placed sixth. Kevin Barry and Ian Munn placed seventh, while Ted Newill and Paul Scel came in eighth.

Paddlers end in splash

Culver canoists paddled to another successful season. Traveling to South Bend May 15 to compete in the St. Joe River race, Culver's John Greengoss and Raymond Cheseldine captured a first in the C-2 standard cruiser division (two-man canoe).

Competing earlier in the season, Culver did exceptionally well in Sidney, Ohio, over the weekend of May 8-9. Races began Saturday morning with Don Giacchetti winning a first, Ian Munn a fourth, and Chris Keller a fifth in C-1 (one man canoe) competition. Later that day, in the C-2 standard boat non-trophy race Culver took the three top places with the team of Ted Newell - Paul Seel, Scott Steven-


son-John Dunning and Cheseldine - Greengoss taking first through third, respectively.

THE NEXT MORNING Munn and Giacchetti, using Olympic style, stroked to a first in C-2 junior men's division. Fourth through eighth places were also captured by Culver.

That afternoon, in C-2 senior men, Giacchetti and Rusty Zick.. paddling against some of the nation's Olympic canoists, captured a fourth.

Giacchetti, captain of the team, comments on the season, "Although plagued by bad weather and lack of financial support which prevented an exceptional season, we still did a respectable job."

Not many high school canoeists can boast a career as fine as Don Giacchetti's. A four-year letterman, Giacchetti is the captain of the squad, He began conoeing in his fifth class year at Culver and has since captured 45 trophies.

IN STATE-WIDE competition Giacchetti has distinguished himself greatly by having most of



his success in the "C-2 Category." With partner Jeff Newton, a member of last year's graduating class. Giacchetti won the Indiana state championships in 1969 and 1970. They also captured the Ohio State championships in 1969 and 1970. In last year's "C-1" competition, Giacchetti placed second in Indiana and third in Ohio. With the 1971 season still in progress, Giacchetti and his partner, Rusty Zick, placed second in the national "C-2" race at Springfield, Ohio. He also captured third in the national "C-1" race.

Giacchetti hopes to continue his canoeing career in college. One of his chief goals is to qualify for a United States squad which will tour Europe this summer.



Background and History

Culver Canoe Team





Canoe captain Don Giacchetti ended his fouryear varsity career as defending state champion in the junior men's division, by virtue of points scored in all Indiana events. Winning more events than any paddler in Culver history, he won the Ohio State Championship in the C-1 single canoe, took seconds and thirds in open events against Olympic competition and older entries, and with partner Rusty Zick took seconds in the C-2 at the Ohio State Championships and the U.S. Canoe Association's National Championships.

Culver Varsity Club Medal for Excellence in Athletics

The idea for the Varsity Club Medal for Excellence in Athletics was originated by Mr. Bill Garrison, former canoe coach at Culver. He and Mr. Chet Marshall, Athletic Director, asked the Academy Artist-in-Residence, Mr. Warner Williams, for some ideas concerning such a medal, and he submitted four designs from which this one was picked by Varsity Club members. Mr. Williams executed the basic design first in plaster, and then the mold proper for the bronze medal. All work for this design by Mr. Williams, winner of the first place award for the Indiana Sesquicentennial medal, was donated to the Varsity Club. The medal mold is stored in the vault of the Medallic Art Company, New York City, and is executed on special request from the Athletic Department of Culver Military Academy to be awarded for outstanding performance by its own athletes, and the winners of the Academy's annual Golf Tourney, and weight class winners of the annual Wrestling Tourney.
