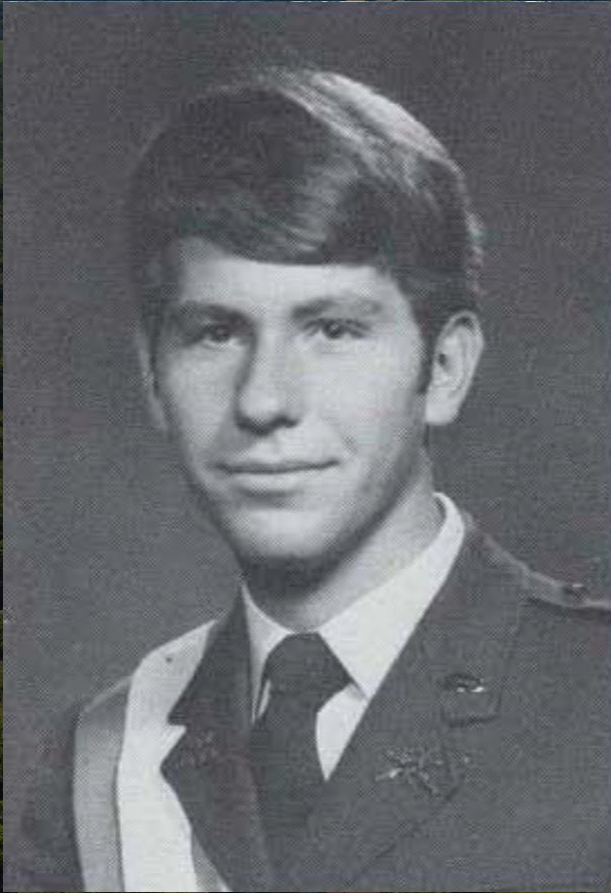

Competition Challenges Canoers

With an air of enthusiasm about them, the top-rated Culver canoe team returned during Plebe Week to start work-outs for the fall season. In the first race at Wabash, Indiana, the team found that its toughest competition had paddled in some ten races during the summer. This competition followed the team throughout the remaining two fall meets, and the season proved to be disappointing.

In early January conditioning workouts for the spring season began on the balcony of the Recreation Building. Later the team switched its workouts to the pool, and on March 3-4 eight members of the team journeyed to Cincinnati to receive instruction at a private clinic headed by Roland Mullen, an Olympic canoeist.

Lake work-outs began only four days prior to spring vacation, and the first race was scheduled for the first week end after vacation.

Canoe team opens season

Encouraged by returning lettermen Chuck Eldred, Chris Keller, Paul Seel, Alex Calder and Rick Carbaugh, Coach Phillip K. Mallory opened the canoe season with a 16-mile river race at Wabash, Ind.

FOURTH, fifth, sixth, and seventh places were taken by the teams of Keller-Eldred, Calder-Seel, Greengoss-Cheseldine, and Robinson-Carbaugh, respectively.

Two more races, a 20-mile course at Brookville, Ind., and a short twelve mile contest at Indianapolis are scheduled for this fall.

Opening at Crawfordsville, Indiana, on Sugar Creek, on April 15, the canoe team is expecting another fine season. This first race should reflect the team's two months of rigorous conditioning.

After several changes in canoe design and paddling technique during the summer, the canoes and canoers have been equally adapted and instructed in preparation for the spring season. This instruction began on March 3 and 4 as eight members of the team and Coaches Phillip Mallory and Robert Meek journeyed to Cincinnati.

The team visited Roland Mullen, a member of the U.S. Olympic canoe team. At his home they were given pointers on exercise and paddling.

Led by team captain Chuck Eldred, the varsity team consists of Chris Keller, Paul Seel, Rich Carbaugh, Alex Calder, John Dunning, and Scott Stevenson. The squad hopes to attend five races this spring, while looking forward to possible interclub

Canoeists gain experience in annual Sugar Creek Race

After two months of rigorous indoor training, an 18-day vacation, and four days of lake work, the canoe team journeyed to Crawfordsville, Ind., to compete in the fourth annual Sugar Creek Race.

THE TEAM LEFT early Saturday morning with a group of eight cadets, two girls, and two coaches. The first races consisted of 1000 motor C-1 and C-4 sprints. With only one day of C-1 practice on the lake, Chris Keller, Chuck Eldred, and Rich Carbaugh finished 5th, 6th, and 7th, respectively, from a field of 14. The C-4 event followed with the team of Eldred, Carbaugh, Seel, Keller placing 5th out of 13 entries.

Then Saturday afternoon offered a new threat for the canoe team as Carol Kahn, Lee Robinson and Karen McKee, Rich Carbaugh raced in a ten and a half mile mixed couples race. This was the first time that Culver had raced mixed, and it is also the first time that these four canoers had paddled together. Kahn - Robinson finished 16th with a time of one hour, 34 minutes, 11 seconds, and McKee-Carbaugh finished 21st out of 28 with a time of 1 hour, 34 minutes, 23 seconds.

This race consisted of all ages of couples, but of the juniors (under 19 years old), the Culver

teams took 3rd and 4th. The team of Eldred - Keller placed 3rd in the C-2 slalom which was held the same afternoon. The slalom course, which consists of passing the canoe through various gates in a certain order, was especially difficult because of the swift current.

TORRENTIAL RAINS poured most of the day and night on Saturday, and the river raised about two feet during the night. The first race on Sunday was the C-2 women's event, a 16 mile course. Kahn - McKee, after encountering some trouble at the start of the race, finished strong. This was their first experience in downriver racing.

The next event was the C-2 junior men's cruising, which was also a 16 mile race. Racing against the clock through periods of rain and wind, the Culver canoe sped down the river on the extremely swift current. At the finish, Eldred-Keller took a 3rd place and Carbaugh-Robinson finished 4th.

The team will now have three weeks to practice before the next race at Sidney, Ohio. During the two weekends in this period, the canoeists plan seven inter squad races on the Tippecanoe river.

OPTIMISM IS HIGH and the squad is looking forward to the remaining four races of the season.

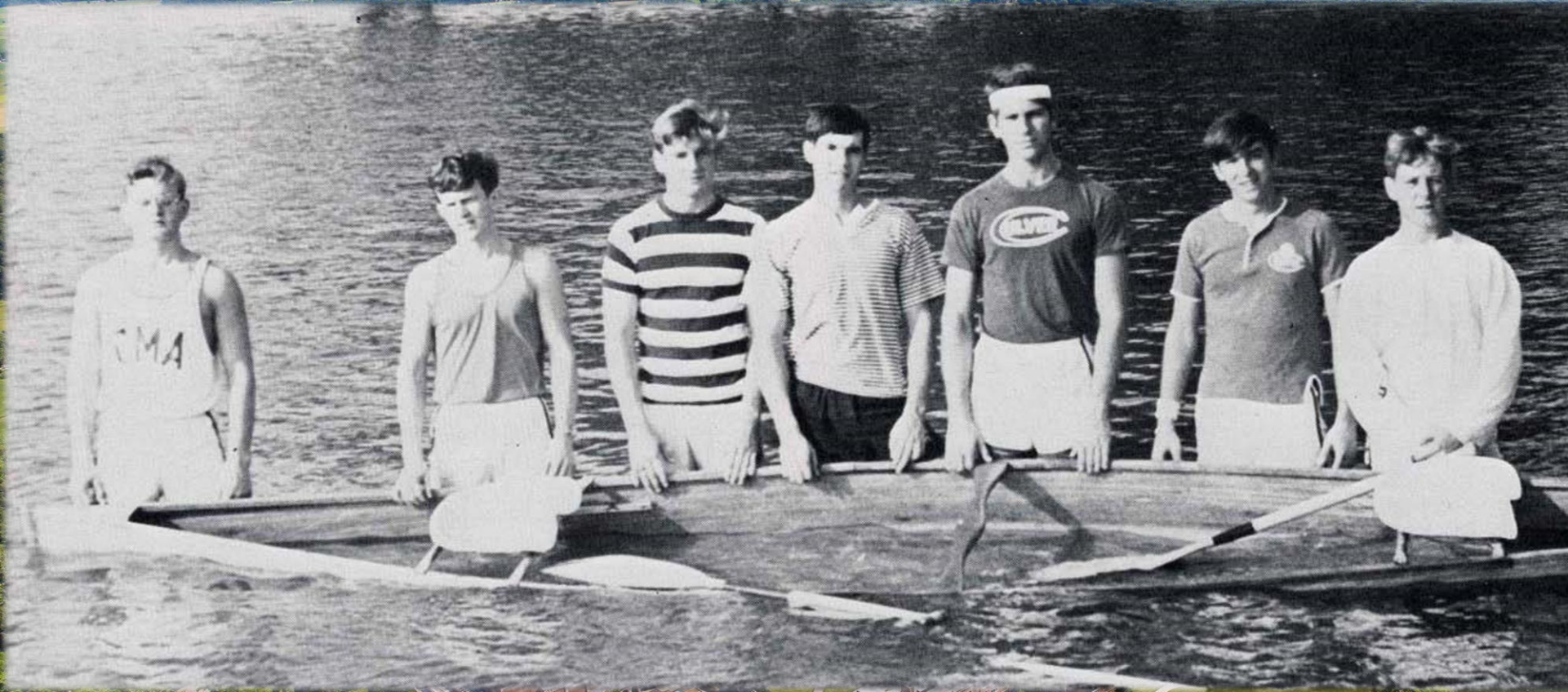

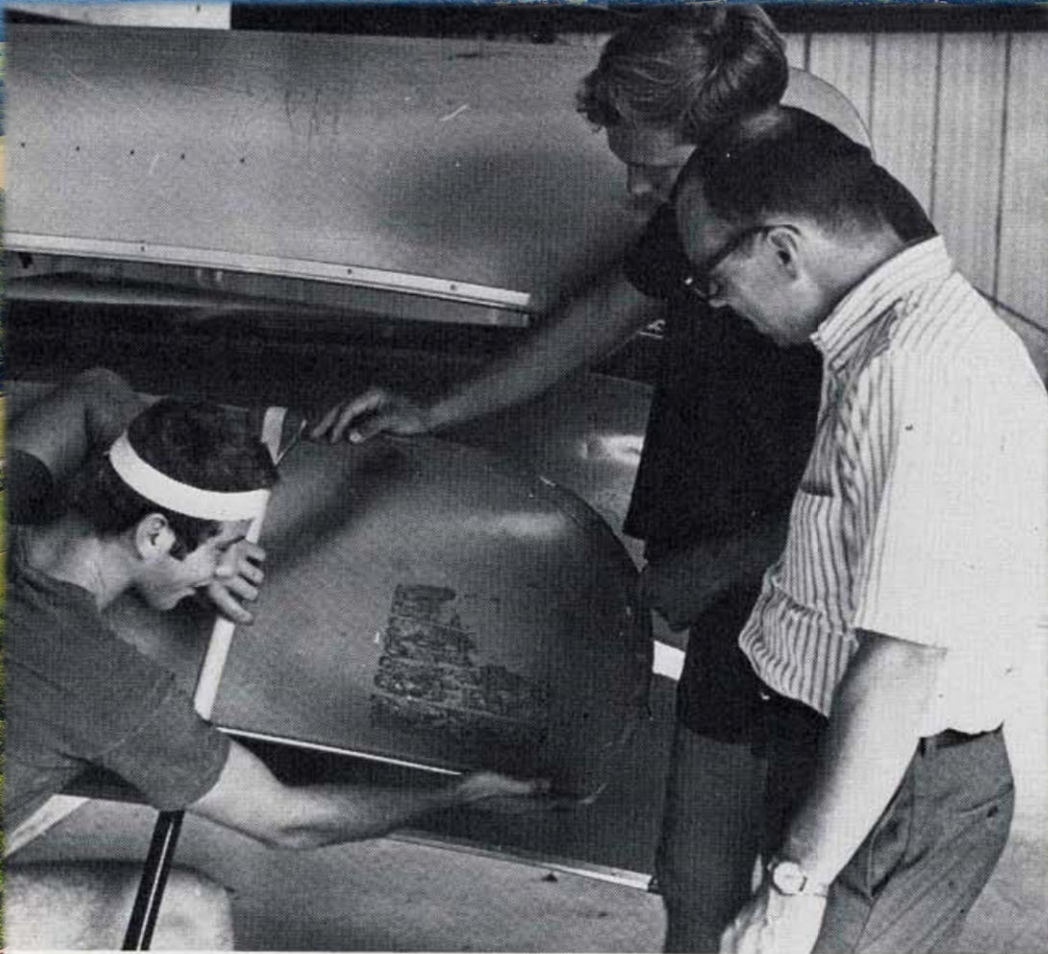
