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1. Why the Next Generation Matters

The UMG Monarch Dynasty is built around a simple generational question: what can the founders create now that the children will not have to rebuild from zero?

The answer is intended to include more than money. The family is building a public record, businesses, media, intellectual property, archives, traditions, governing documents, development plans, professional relationships, faith practices, and a culture of ownership that can continue after the founding generation.

2. Public Names, Privacy & Protection

11. Education, Gifts & Future Service
