Three Ways Until It Clicks

Stuck on a concept? Don't ask AI once and give up. Make it explain the same idea three ways: like you're 10, with a real-life example, and in exam language.

Start the move

Copy the prompt

Why this is a real study move

Sometimes the concept is not impossible. It is just explained in the wrong shape for your brain. AI can switch shapes quickly. Your job is to find the explanation that lands, then write that version in your own words.

1 **Pick the concept that refuses to enter your brain**

Photosynthesis. Quadratic equations. Federalism. Demand and supply. Pick one.

This move works best when you choose one small concept, not an entire chapter. "Photosynthesis" is good. "Full biology syllabus" is a monster wearing three monsters.

THOUGHT BULB

A concept is easier to learn when you can say exactly what is stuck. "I don't understand factorisation" is stronger than "maths is hard."

2 Use the 3-ways prompt

Copy this into ChatGPT, Claude, or Gemini.

We are not asking AI for a longer answer. We are asking for three different doors into the same room.

COPY-PASTE PROMPT

Explain photosynthesis three ways – first like I'm 10, then with a real-life example, then in exam language. I'm a Class 10 student.

Copy prompt

CAUTION BOARD

Do not copy the explanation into your notebook immediately. Read all three versions first. One version will usually make more sense than the others. That is the one you work with.

☐ I pasted the 3-ways prompt into an AI tool.

3 **Read the three versions like a detective**

Which one makes your brain say, “Okay, wait, I get it now”?

Version 1: Like I'm 10

Best when the textbook language is too heavy and you need the idea stripped down.

Version 2: Real-life example

Best when you understand examples faster than definitions.

Version 3: Exam language

Best when you need to convert understanding into marks.

I read all three explanations before choosing one.

4 **Ask one follow-up question**

The first explanation is the door. The follow-up is how you walk in.

If one version almost clicked but not fully, ask AI to improve that exact version. Do not restart with a brand-new random prompt.

FOLLOW-UP PROMPT

The real-life example helped most, but I still don't fully get it. Explain the same concept again using one more example from daily life in India. Keep it short.

Copy follow-up

THOUGHT BULB

Good studying is not asking one perfect question. It is asking the next useful question. That is why this move is called Slow Burn.

☐ I asked one follow-up question to sharpen the explanation.

5 **Write the clicked version in your own words**

This is the part that turns AI output into your learning.

Close the AI tab for three minutes. Now write the version that clicked, without looking. It can be imperfect. Actually, imperfect is useful. It shows you what your brain has actually kept.

Write the concept in your own words. No copy-paste.



WIN CONDITION

If you can explain it in your own words, even simply, you are no longer just reading. You are learning.

AI Move of the Day

Three ways until it clicks

Hook: Photosynthesis won't click? Don't ask AI once and quit.

The move: Ask AI to explain the same concept three ways: simple, real-life, and exam-ready.

Prompt: Explain [concept] three ways — first like I'm 10, then with a real-life example, then in exam language. I'm a Class [X] student.

Closer: Pick the version that clicked. Close the tab. Write it once in your own words.

Finish the mission

Private check. No submission. No score. Just be honest with yourself.

☐ I picked one concept that was actually stuck.

☐ I read three explanations, not just the first one.

☐ I wrote the best explanation in my own words.
