

AI Move of the Day • Study Smart • SS-02

Flashcard Deck Builder

Test Friday, messy notes? 3-minute fix. Turn your own notes into flashcards, cover the answers, and see what your brain actually remembers.

Start the move

Copy the prompt

The game: beat your own forgetting

Flashcards are simple: question on one side, answer on the other. The trick is not making pretty cards. The trick is forcing your brain to answer before it looks.

AI will make the first deck. You will check it, test yourself, and repair the weak cards.

1 Find your notes

Use your own notebook, typed notes, textbook summary, or teacher handout.

This move works best when the notes are yours. Messy is fine. Half sentences are fine. Random internet text is less useful because it does not know what your class actually covered.

THOUGHT BULB

Your notes are like raw Maggi. AI is the hot water. Useful, but only if you start with the right packet.

2 Copy the flashcard prompt

Open ChatGPT, Claude, or Gemini. Paste this prompt.

This is the whole move. We are asking AI to turn your notes into 15 question-and-answer pairs.

COPY-PASTE PROMPT

I'm a Class 9 student. Turn these notes into 15 flashcards as question-and-answer pairs, simple English:

[paste notes]

Copy prompt

QUICK MOVE

Paste notes → get flashcards → cover answers → test yourself. That is the game loop.

☐ I pasted the prompt into ChatGPT, Claude, or Gemini.

3 See what good flashcards look like

A flashcard should ask one thing. Not five things wearing one school uniform.

CARD 1 · QUESTION

What does chlorophyll do?

Answer: It helps plants capture light for photosynthesis.

CARD 2 · QUESTION

Which gas do plants take in for photosynthesis?

Answer: Carbon dioxide.

CARD 3 · QUESTION

What are stomata?

Answer: Tiny openings on leaves that allow gas exchange.

THOUGHT BULB

Good flashcards feel almost too small. That is the point. One card, one memory.

☐ I understand what a good Q&A flashcard looks like.

4 Check the AI deck before trusting it

AI can make useful cards. It can also make confident nonsense.

Read the flashcards once with your textbook or notes open. Mark each card:

GOOD CARD

Q: What is the main product of photosynthesis?

A: Glucose.

SUSPICIOUS CARD

Q: When does photosynthesis happen?

A: Only at night.

CAUTION BOARD

Do not memorise a wrong flashcard. That is like training for a cricket match with the wrong rules. Check names, dates, formulas, definitions, and anything that sounds too neat.

☐ I checked the AI flashcards against my notes or textbook.

5 **Play the cover-and-answer round**

This is where the studying actually happens.

Cover the answers. Read each question. Say the answer out loud or write it down. Then check. No drama. Just honest scoring.

SCORING RULE

2 points = I knew it without looking.

1 point = I almost knew it.

0 points = My brain went for a walk.

Ask AI to fix your weak cards

The cards you got wrong are not failures. They are the treasure map.

Copy the questions you got wrong. Then ask AI to make easier versions or more targeted cards.

WEAK-SPOT REPAIR PROMPT

I tested myself on these flashcards and got these questions wrong:

[paste the questions you missed]

Make 5 easier flashcards that help me understand these weak spots. Keep each answer short and simple.

Copy prompt

THOUGHT BULB

Grade 12 move: do not just make more cards. Make cards that attack your weak spots. That is how the same tool becomes sharper.

7 Save your deck

Put the deck somewhere you can actually use before the test.

Save the flashcards in your notebook, Google Doc, Notes app, Canva, or printed sheet. The format does not matter. Using it tomorrow matters.

FINAL WIN

You did not ask AI to study for you. You used AI to build a practice game, then you played the game yourself.

☐ I saved my flashcard deck and know when I will test myself again.

The 5-minute finish

Open your saved deck. Cover the answers. Test yourself on the first five cards now. Not later. Now is how later becomes real.

☐ I used my own notes.

☐ I checked the cards before memorising them.

☐ I tested myself without looking at the answers first.
