To obtain an **HMO license** in Birmingham, your property must meet specific **safety, management, and space standards**. Here's a breakdown of the key criteria:

#### 1. Who Needs an HMO License?

- Mandatory Licensing: If the HMO has 5 or more unrelated people living in it, you must apply for an HMO license.
- Additional Licensing: Birmingham City Council may require smaller HMOs (3-4 people) to be licensed if they introduce additional licensing schemes.

## **B. Landlord Requirements**

- Fit & Proper Person Test
- No history of housing law breaches, fraud, criminal activity, or discrimination.
- No previous **HMO license refusals or revocations**.
- Management & Compliance
- Must provide clear tenancy agreements for all tenants.
- Ensure regular maintenance and repairs.
- Provide waste disposal facilities to prevent rubbish buildup.
- Gas, Electrical & Safety Certificates
- Gas Safety Certificate (updated annually).
- Electrical Installation Condition Report (EICR) (updated every 5 years).
- Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) (minimum E rating or higher).

# 3. How to Apply for an HMO License in Birmingham

- **Apply Online**: Via **Birmingham City Council's website** (HMO Licensing Page)
- **Application Fee**: Usually £1,150+ (varies by property size).
- Processing Time: Can take several months, so apply early.

- X Fines of up to £30,000 per breach.
- X Rent Repayment Orders (you may have to refund tenants up to 12 months of rent).
