CAROL HUANG, INFLUENCED BY HER SIGHTER AND HER OLDER SISTER, BLILA, BLGAAYHER MUSICAL JOURNEY BY LEARNING BOTH THE VIOLIN AND PIANO AT THE AGE OF FIVE. AT SIX YEARS OLD, SHE WAS SELECTED TO ATTEND THE SEATTLE SYMPHONY SUMMER CAMP, BECOMING THE YOUNGEST PARTICIPANT IN THE PROGRAM, SINCE THER AND LUDIO THOSE AT BECOMING THE YOUNGEST PARTICIPANT IN THE PROGRAM. SINCE THEN, SHE HAS CONTINUED HER BUSICAL STUDIES THROUGH PRESTIGIOUS SUMMER PROGRAMS, INCLUDING THOSE AT THE MAIHATTAN SCHOOL OF MUSIC AND THE LUZERNE MUSIC CAMP. CAROL HAS TWICE WON FIRST PLACE IN THE GUAM SYMPHONY YOUNG ARRISTS COMPETITION AND HAS RECEIVED TOP AWARDS IN NUMEROUS INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS, SUCH AS THE GOLDEN CLASSICAL MUSIC AWARDS INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION, FIRST PRIZE IN THE UK INTERNATIONAL MUSIC COMPETITION, FIRST PLACE IN THE BITHN WIES MUSIC COMPETITION, SECOND PLACE IN THE AMERICAN CLASSICAL YOUNG MUSICAL NAWARD, AND THE GOLD PRIZE AT THE EUTERPE MUSIC AWARDS. SHE ALSO TOOK SECOND PLACE IN THE HAWAII DIVISION OF THE OSAKA INTERNATIONAL MUSIC COMPETITION.

NOTABLY, CAROL HAS BEEN INVITED TO PERFORM AT RENOWNED VENUES INCLUDING CARNEGIE HALL IN NYC, AS WELL AS IN AUSTRIA AND ITALY, WHERE HER PERFORMANCES RECEIVED WIDESPREAD ACCLAIM.

BELLA HUANG SHOWED REMARKABLE MUSICAL TALENT FROM THE AGE OF FIVE, SHE BEGAN STUDYING BOTH VIOLIN AND PIANO, THEN MADE HER PERFORMANCE DEBUT AT AGE SIX.

SINCE THE AGE OF SEVEN, BELLA HAS PARTICIPATED IN PRESTIGIOUS SUMMER MUSIC PROGRAMS SUCH AS THE MANHATTAN SCHOOL OF MUSIC SUMMER SCHOOL, THE SEATTLE YOUTH SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA, AND THE LUZERNE MUSIC CENTER SUMMER CAMP (WHERE SHE SERVED AS CONCERTMASTER). FROM 2022 TO 2025, SHE WON FIRST PRIZE IN THE GUAM YOUNG MUSICIANS COMPETITION FOR FOUR CONSECUTIVE YEARS AND GARNERED NUMEROUS INTERNATIONAL ACCOLADES, INCLUDING THE ABSOLUTE FIRST PRIZE AT THE UK INTERNATIONAL MUSIC COMPETITION, SECOND PRIZE AT THE AMERICAN CLASSICAL YOUNG MUSICIAN AWARD, THE GOLD AWARD AT THE YOUTHEPE MUSIC PRIZE, AND FIRST PRIZE IN THE EARNING PRAISE FOR HER EXPRESSIVE ARTISTRY AND TECHNICAL BRILLIANCE. SHE IS





HOYOUNG GRACE KANG BEGAN PLAYING THE VIOLIN AT THE AGE OF FOUR. SHE STUDIED UNDER IIMIN HAM AND GRADUATED FROM THE SOUTH KOREA ART CENTER INSTITUTE FOR GIFTED MUSICIANS. SHE HAS CONTINUOUSLY WON FIRST PLACE IN THE GUAM SYMPHONY YOUNG ARTIST COMPETITION FROM 2020-2025. SHE STUDIED UNDER RAFAEL BETANCOURT AT THE MANHATTAN SCHOOL OF MUSIC IN THE SUMMER OF 2020 AND 2021. SHE PERFORMED AS AN INVITED VIOLINIST FOR THE JAPANESE EMBASSY IN 2023. SHE BECAME THE OVERALL CHAMPION WINNER OF THE PRESTIGIOUS INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS IN JAPAN AND HONG KONG IN 2024 AND PERFORMED IN CARNEGIE HALL IN 2024. RECENTLY, SHE HAS WON GOLD IN TUMON BAY MUSIC FESTIVAL IN MARCH 2025.
