"Submit to Be More Vile"

Why would we want to be vile? This makes no sense if we just think about what the word means. It is used to describe unpleasant things, places or even people. It can mean morally bad, and, in the past, it was used to describe things (and people) as having little or no worth. So how can we possibly be called to "be more vile?" Because those things, places, and people that are called vile are still loved by God. God still goes to them, seeks them out, and we should as well. Even if the world might then call us vile.

Prayer: God who does not turn away, help us to see those people, places, and circumstances that are ignored. Help us walk to them, not away. Help us reach out, not draw back. Help us be more vile in pursuit of sharing your great love to all. Amen.

Monday 9.8 "Places" Luke 2
Let's start simple. Jesus came to a place he did not have to, a place filled with corruption, hate, greed, and malice. Jesus came to Earth. God in Jesus came to earth by choice and design! God came to the vileness of earth knowing it would mean living and dying just as we all do. In hardship and struggle. If our great God did that, shouldn't we be willing to look to look into the places of violence, greed, malice, corruption, and speak and act in ways to bring light into them?

Tuesday 9.9 "Circumstances" John 2:13-17
The temple wasn't the place it was meant to be anymore, but no one seemed to be worried about that. It just was what it was. But Jesus knew this wasn't right and needed to change. He didn't stay silent; he spoke and acted in the midst of the circumstance to change hearts and minds and bring change. What circumstances are around you that might need to you step into the mess to help make change?

Wednesday 9.10 "People" Luke 8:26-39
Jesus left no one out. He went to people cast out by Jewish society or by humanity itself. He spoke with them, touched them, healed them, restored them. Who do you see today who has been pushed aside for being too different, too strange, too much trouble? How might your words and actions be able to reach out to them?

Thursday 9.11 "Be" Matthew 28:19-20 John Wesley didn't want to do it. He didn't want to go against the grain of the proper way to do things. But he felt the call of the Holy Spirit to be something different than he had been before. To be someone for those who were overlooked, so all may feel God's love. When have you been called to be something new, maybe something uncomfortable?

Friday 9.12 "More" Luke 6:27-31

John Wesley was considered an enthusiast by a society that had decided religion should be quiet, kept to yourself, and certainly kept inside the church building. Instead, he insisted that our faith must be more. It needed to be outside the walls, outspoken, and definitely for the masses who were kept on the outskirts of" polite" society. How do you sometimes see faith/religion as being stuck inside a nice, neat box? How could it become more than that?

Saturday 9.13 "Vile" Luke 19:1-10

John Wesley had (almost) always followed the rules. He cared how his actions might be interpreted. He didn't want to leave the Church of England, but he could see how staying neatly in the lines and rules wasn't cutting it. So, he became more vile. He went where others didn't, to people who were written off, and he was criticized for it. If we act in the vile nature of John Welsey and Jesus, we will face criticism. It might be uncomfortable. It might be unnerving. But God calls us to?
