# February program: The Quilts of Linda Brannock







Karmen Sunshine, daughter of the late Linda Brannock, will be coming in February with a beautiful trunk show of her mother's quilts. Linda worked with many Kansas City area designers, and on her own, to create the Primitive Look. Her signature image was perhaps that wonky star so prominent in her work. It all started for Linda in 1974 when she wanted a quilt. At that time, just at the beginning of the monumental quilt revival, there weren't many for sale, and none she found could she afford. She did find a class in quiltmaking and decided to make one herself. That eventually led to teaching her first class in 1980 in her basement to a group of friends, then on to many more teaching opportunities. Linda created patterns for local businesses, authored and co-authored many books, and became a fabric designer for Moda. In 1993 she started her own pattern company, the Star Quilt Co. Barbara Brackman has said of Linda Brannock, "It would be hard to overstate her influence on a certain style combining muted color, geometric prints, plaids, flannels, innovative sets, stylized florals and stars, stars, stars."

Karmen is a retired college tutoring center director. She loves quilting, playing golf, and living among her mother's quilts.

# Red Top 2023 Quilt: Double Friendship Star Daryl Miller

OK now, we're getting close to the retreat so it's time to be sure you've picked out your colors and started collecting your fabrics for the Double Friendship Star. It will be so much fun to see what everyone has picked! If you need a baby quilt, this is a quick one! You might even have time to make two!

To begin, you'll need 2 contrasting colors for the alternating stars. For the "butterfly" effect, you'll need 2 colors for what Missouri Star calls the "background," so bring that yardage, divided into 2 colors, half light and half darker. Contrast is so important for the whole design! Of course, you can choose one background color, for a simpler effect.

Remember you can make it any size and finish it with plain borders, piano keys, or solid, small half square triangles. I've even seen the triangle cutoffs made into pinwheels for the border!

If you ordered the paper pattern from me, they are in! I'll have them for you at the January 31 Community Service as well as the February General Meeting, on the 7th. Just meet me there, \$7 cash please. Remember, you can also create this pattern from their web video or any other Friendship Star pattern!

### **Beginning Wool Applique and Embellishment**

(Sue Spargo Style) with Diana Quinn

#### Tuesday, March 7, 2023, Lecture Workshop 12:30 – 5:00pm



#### Class Description:

In this class you will learn the basic skills of hand wool applique. You will learn about the various needles and threads that will make your project "pop".

Students will work on making a wool embellished piece that can be used to make a pin cushion, a small pillow, or a zippered bag. Students will learn to attach the wool circles to the background wool and learn the following embellishment stitches:

- Backstitch
- Bullion Knot
- Chain Stitch
- Fly and Closed Fly Stitch
- French Knots
- Italian Knotted Border Stitch
- Star Stitch
- Whip Stitch
- Whipped Woven Circle

Diana Quinn has been sewing and crafting for most of her life and learned to embroider as a child. She has continued to refine those skills as an adult and is an accomplished quilter and wool embellishment artist. Her wool embellished quilts have won various ribbons at local quilt shows.

# AQG Block of the Month: February Danielle Morgan

#### Fabric 1: Black

- 8 2-1/2" squares for Corners
- 4 3" squares for Half Square Triangles
- 2 5-1/2" square for Flying Geese

#### Fabric 2: White

- 12 3" squares, four for HST, eight for FG
- 1 4-1/2" for Center square

Note: You may choose to use 16 HST rather than make FG. In that case, make 8 more 3" squares of each color and follow the piecing instructions below.

#### Directions:

Draw diagonal lines on twelve WHITE 3" squares. Match four WHITE 3" squares with four BLACK 3" squares. Sew 1/4" seams on either side of the WHITE drawn lines. Cut each set on the line and press seams to the dark side. Trim all four to 2-1/2"

Make 4 four-patch blocks of 2-1/2" squares:


1 BLACK	1 HST
4 LICT	

1 HST 1 BLACK

Draw diagonal line on back side of four BLACK and four WHTE 3" squares.

Using your favorite technique, make eight FG using four WHITE 3" squares both BLACK 5-1/2" squares.

Trim all eight FG to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles. Layout and assemble your block:
