COMFORT QUILTS - make the quilts bright and cheerful. They cannot be bigger than a twin as they are given to kids, and adults in assisted living or nursing homes. PILLOWCASES - make them bright and cheerful. They must be washed in <u>unscented</u>, clear detergent. Iron them and put them in a clean, quart size baggie. Directions for the "hot dog" or "burrito" pillowcases can be found on our website AQGuild.org. Questions, please contact barbarameans@comcast.net

KITTY BEDS - we will be donating to two shelters: **Etowah Valley Humane Society:** They require the beds to be 11 x 16 1/2. **Cherokee County Humane Society:** Make them 15" square. 3 Black and White Fat Quarters (real white, not cream she says...), 3 Batik Fat Quarters and 3 Blender Fat Quarters (those tiny prints that look like a solid when you step back).

RECIPE CORNER

Blueberry Yum Yum (Diane Chestnut)

1 cup crushed Graham crackers

1 stick butter (melted)

1 package cream cheese

1 cup powdered sugar

2 cans pie filling (any flavor)

1 tub Cool Whip



Mix graham crackers & melted butter. Spread evenly on bottom of pan. Bake at 300 degrees for 5-10 minutes until golden brown. Allow to cool.

Mix powdered sugar & cream cheese until as smooth as possible. After crust is cooled, spread cream cheese mix than pie filling on top. Last spread cool whip on top and cool in refrigerator so cream cheese will thicken.

20 Fat Quarters or 40 Fat Eighths4 yards of background fabric1 yard outer border of focus fabric


Could you decide to pull fabrics from your stash for each border? Absolutely.


16" Block Suggestions:
